HOUSE BILL NO. 1097

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-25-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO ALLOW SHERIFFS TO AUTHORIZE CERTAIN OFF-DUTY USE OF VEHICLES BY 3 DEPUTY SHERIFFS ENGAGING IN PRIVATE EMPLOYMENT UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 17-25-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 17-25-11. (1) Certified law enforcement officers or 8 9 certified part-time law enforcement officers, as defined in 10 Section 45-6-3, who are employed by a county or municipality may wear the official uniform and may utilize the official firearm 11 12 issued by the employing jurisdiction while in the performance of private security services in off-duty hours. The governing 13 14 authority of a municipality must approve of such use of the uniform and official weapon by municipal law enforcement officers 15 16 by act spread upon the minutes of such board and approved by the 17 chief executive. The sheriff of a county must approve such use of the uniform * * *, official weapon and official vehicle by deputy 18

sheriffs. Approval shall be on an employee-by-employee basis and

- 20 not by general order. Any proceedings regarding application or 21 approval and the minutes regarding same shall be a public record.
- 22 (2) Each governing board and chief executive or sheriff
 23 shall determine before the use of the official uniform * * * *,
 24 weapon or vehicle is approved that the proposed employment is not
 25 likely to bring disrepute to the employing jurisdiction or its law
 26 enforcement agency, the officer at issue, or law enforcement
 27 generally, and that the use of the official uniform * * *, weapon
 28 or vehicle in the discharge of the officer's private security

endeavor promotes the public interest.

30 (3) Acts and omissions of an officer in discharge of private security employment shall be deemed to be the acts and omissions 31 32 of the person or entity employing the officer for such private security services, and not the acts and omissions of the 33 jurisdiction whose uniform * * *, weapon or vehicle are approved 34 35 for such private security use. An employer employing the officer 36 for private security services shall hold harmless the jurisdiction by which the officer is employed and fully indemnify the 37 38 jurisdiction for any expense or loss, including attorney's fees, 39 which results from any action taken against the jurisdiction 40 arising out of the acts or omissions of the officer in discharge of private security services while wearing the official uniform or 41

using the official weapon or vehicle. Neither the state nor any

subdivision thereof shall be liable for acts or omissions of an
