HOUSE BILL NO. 1275

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-15-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCLUDE ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES IN THE STATEMENT OF 3 PURPOSE OF THE MISSISSIPPI NURSING PRACTICE LAW; TO AMEND SECTION 4 73-15-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE CERTAIN DEFINITIONS AND REVISE CERTAIN DEFINITIONS IN THE NURSING PRACTICE LAW 5 6 REGARDING ADVANCED NURSING PRACTICE; TO AMEND SECTION 73-15-20, 7 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF ADVANCED NURSING PRACTICE NURSES AND TO DELETE THE 8 9 REOUIREMENT THAT ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES PRACTICE IN A 10 COLLABORATIVE/CONSULTATIVE RELATIONSHIP WITH A LICENSED PHYSICIAN; 11 TO AMEND SECTION 73-15-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCLUDE 12 ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES IN THE PROVISIONS RELATING TO 13 GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS AGAINST NURSES; AND FOR RELATED 14 PURPOSES.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

16 SECTION 1. Section 73-15-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

17 amended as follows:

18 73-15-3. In order to safequard life and health, any person

19 practicing or offering to practice as a registered nurse, an

20 advanced practice registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse

21 in Mississippi for compensation shall hereafter be required to

22 submit evidence of qualifications to practice and shall be

23 licensed or hold the privilege to practice as hereinafter

24 provided. It shall be unlawful for any person not licensed or

27 (a) To practice or offer to practice as a registered
28 nurse, an advanced practice registered nurse or a licensed
29 practical nurse;

30 (b) To use a sign, card or device to indicate that such
31 person is a registered nurse, an advanced practice registered
32 <u>nurse</u> or a licensed practical nurse.

Any person offering to practice nursing in Mississippi must be licensed or otherwise authorized to practice as provided in this article.

36 SECTION 2. Section 73-15-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 37 amended as follows:

38 73-15-5. (1) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of 39 Nursing.

40 (2)The "practice of nursing" by a registered nurse means the performance for compensation of services which requires 41 substantial knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral, 42 43 psychological and sociological sciences and of nursing theory as the basis for assessment, diagnosis, planning, intervention and 44 45 evaluation in the promotion and maintenance of health; management of individuals' responses to illness, injury or infirmity; the 46 47 restoration of optimum function; or the achievement of a dignified "Nursing practice" includes, but is not limited to, 48 death. administration, teaching, counseling, delegation and supervision 49

The foregoing shall not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or prescriptions of medical, therapeutic or corrective measures, except as may be set forth by rules and regulations promulgated and implemented by the Mississippi Board of Nursing.

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58 (* * *3) "Advanced nursing practice" means, in addition to the practice of professional nursing, the performance of 59 60 advanced-level nursing approved by the board which, by virtue of graduate education and experience are appropriately performed by 61 62 an advanced practice registered nurse. The advanced practice registered nurse may diagnose, treat and manage medical 63 conditions. This may include prescriptive authority as identified 64 65 by the board. * * *

66 (* * *4) The "practice of nursing" by a licensed practical nurse means the performance for compensation of services requiring 67 68 basic knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral, 69 psychological and sociological sciences and of nursing procedures 70 which do not require the substantial skill, judgment and knowledge 71 required of a registered nurse. These services are performed 72 under the direction of a registered nurse or a licensed physician 73 or licensed dentist and utilize standardized procedures in the observation and care of the ill, injured and infirm; in the 74

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75 maintenance of health; in action to safequard life and health; and 76 in the administration of medications and treatments prescribed by 77 any licensed physician or licensed dentist authorized by state law 78 to prescribe. On a selected basis, and within safe limits, the 79 role of the licensed practical nurse shall be expanded by the 80 board under its rule-making authority to more complex procedures and settings commensurate with additional preparation and 81 82 experience.

83 (***<u>5</u>) A "license" means an authorization to practice 84 nursing as a registered nurse, an advanced practice registered 85 nurse or a licensed practical nurse designated herein.

86 (***<u>6</u>) A "registered nurse" is a person who is licensed 87 or holds the privilege to practice under the provisions of this 88 article and who practices nursing as defined herein. "RN" is the 89 abbreviation for the title of Registered Nurse.

90 (***<u>7</u>) A "licensed practical nurse" is a person who is 91 licensed or holds the privilege to practice under this article and 92 who practices practical nursing as defined herein. "LPN" is the 93 abbreviation for the title of Licensed Practical Nurse.

94 (***<u>8</u>) A "registered nurse in clinical practice" is one 95 who functions in any health care delivery system which provides 96 nursing services.

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98 (9) <u>"Collaboration" or "collaborate" means the act of</u>
 99 communicating pertinent information or consulting with a licensed

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100 physician or other licensed health care provider with each 101 provider contributing the provider's respective expertise to

102 optimize the overall care delivered to the patient.

103 (* * *10) An "advanced practice registered nurse" is a 104 person who is licensed or holds the privilege to practice under 105 this article as a professional nurse and who is * * * licensed as 106 an advanced practice registered nurse or specialized nursing 107 practice and includes certified registered nurse midwives, 108 certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse specialists and certified nurse practitioners. "CNM" is the 109 abbreviation for the title of Certified Nurse Midwife, "CRNA" is 110 111 the abbreviation for the title of Certified Registered Nurse 112 Anesthetist. "CNP" is the abbreviation for the title of Certified Nurse Practitioner. "CNS" is the abbreviation for the title of 113 114 Clinical Nurse Specialist.

(* * *<u>11</u>) A "nurse educator" is a registered nurse who meets the criteria for faculty as set forth in a state-accredited program of nursing for registered nurses, or a state-approved program of nursing for licensed practical nurses, and who functions as a faculty member.

120 (* * *<u>12</u>) A "consumer representative" is a person 121 representing the interests of the general public, who may use 122 services of a health agency or health professional organization or 123 its members but who is neither a provider of health services, nor 124 employed in the health services field, nor holds a vested interest

128 "Privilege to practice" means the multistate (* * *13) 129 licensure privilege to practice nursing in the state as described 130 in the Nurse Licensure Compact provided for in Section 73-15-201. (* * *14) "Licensee" is a person who has been issued a 131 132 license to practice nursing or advanced practice nursing in the 133 state or who holds the privilege to practice nursing in the state. SECTION 3. Section 73-15-20, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 134 135 amended as follows:

136 73-15-20. (1) Advanced practice registered nurses. Any 137 nurse desiring to be * * * <u>licensed</u> as an advanced practice 138 registered nurse shall apply to the board and submit proof that he 139 or she holds a current license * * * <u>as a registered nurse</u> and 140 that he or she meets one or more of the following requirements:

(a) Satisfactory completion of a formal post-basic
educational program of at least one (1) academic year, the primary
purpose of which is to prepare nurses for advanced or specialized
practice.

(b) Certification by a board-approved certifying body.
Such certification shall be required for initial state * * *
<u>licensure</u> and any * * * <u>licensure renewal</u> as a <u>certified</u>
registered nurse anesthetist, <u>certified</u> nurse practitioner,
<u>clinical nurse specialist</u> or <u>certified</u> nurse midwife. The board

Those with 153 154 provisional or temporary *** * *** licenses must practice under the 155 direct supervision of a licensed physician or *** * *** an advanced 156 practice registered nurse with at least five (5) years of 157 experience.

(c) Graduation from a program leading to a master's or post-master's degree in a * * * program of study preparing for one (1) of the described advanced practice registered nurse roles.

(2) Rulemaking. The board shall provide by rule the
appropriate requirements for advanced practice registered nurses
in the categories of certified registered nurse anesthetist,
certified nurse midwife, clinical nurse specialist and * * *
certified nurse practitioner.

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167 (***<u>3</u>) Renewal. The board shall renew a license for an 168 advanced practice registered nurse upon receipt of the renewal 169 application * * * and fees * * *. The board shall adopt rules 170 establishing procedures for license renewals. The board shall by 171 rule prescribe continuing education requirements for advanced 172 practice <u>registered</u> nurses * * * as a condition for renewal 173 of * * licensure.

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187 (***<u>5</u>) Practice requirements. The advanced practice
188 registered nurse shall practice as follows:

(a) <u>Advanced practice registered nurses shall practice</u>
 according to standards and guidelines of <u>their respective</u>
 <u>professional organization and</u> the National Certification
 Organization.

(b) * * * <u>Advanced practice registered nurses shall</u>
collaborate with other health care providers and refer or transfer
patients as appropriate.

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(* * *d) * * * Advanced practice registered nurses may 205 not write prescriptions for, dispense or order the use of or 206 administration of any schedule of controlled substances except as 207 contained in this chapter.

208 (* * *6) Prescribing controlled substances and medications. 209 * * * Advanced practice registered nurses may apply for 210 controlled substance prescriptive authority after completing a 211 board-approved educational program. * * * Advanced practice 212 registered nurses who have completed the program and received 213 prescription authority from the board may prescribe Schedules 214 II-V. The words "administer," "controlled substances" and 215 "ultimate user," shall have the same meaning as set forth in 216 Section 41-29-105, unless the context otherwise requires. The 217 board shall promulgate rules governing prescribing of controlled 218 substances, including distribution, record keeping, drug 219 maintenance, labeling and distribution requirements and 220 prescription guidelines for controlled substances and all 221 medications. Prescribing any controlled substance in violation of 222 the rules promulgated by the board shall constitute a violation of 223 Section 73-15-29(1)(f), (k) and (l) and shall be grounds for

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disciplinary action. The prescribing, administering or distributing of any legend drug or other medication in violation of the rules promulgated by the board shall constitute a violation of Section 73-15-29(1)(f), (k) and (l) and shall be grounds for disciplinary action.

229 SECTION 4. Section 73-15-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 230 amended as follows:

73-15-29. (1) The board shall have power to revoke, suspend or refuse to renew any license issued by the board, or to revoke or suspend any privilege to practice, or to deny an application for a license, or to fine, place on probation and/or discipline a licensee, in any manner specified in this article, upon proof that such person:

(a) Has committed fraud or deceit in securing orattempting to secure such license;

(b) Has been convicted of <u>a</u> felony, or a crime involving moral turpitude or has had accepted by a court a plea of nolo contendere to a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude (a certified copy of the judgment of the court of competent jurisdiction of such conviction or pleas shall be prima facie evidence of such conviction);

(c) Has negligently or willfully acted in a manner inconsistent with the health or safety of the persons under the licensee's care;

248 (d) Has had a license or privilege to practice as a 249 registered nurse, an advanced practice registered nurse or a 250 licensed practical nurse suspended or revoked in any jurisdiction, 251 has voluntarily surrendered such license or privilege to practice 252 in any jurisdiction, has been placed on probation as a registered 253 nurse, advanced practice registered nurse or licensed practical 254 nurse in any jurisdiction or has been placed under a disciplinary 255 order(s) in any manner as a registered nurse, advanced practice 256 registered nurse or licensed practical nurse in any jurisdiction, 257 (a certified copy of the order of suspension, revocation, 258 probation or disciplinary action shall be prima facie evidence of 259 such action);

(e) Has negligently or willfully practiced nursing in a manner that fails to meet generally accepted standards of such nursing practice;

(f) Has negligently or willfully violated any order, rule or regulation of the board pertaining to nursing practice or licensure;

266 (g) Has falsified or in a repeatedly negligent manner 267 made incorrect entries or failed to make essential entries on 268 records;

(h) Is addicted to or dependent on alcohol or other
habit-forming drugs or is a habitual user of narcotics,
barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens, or other drugs having
similar effect, or has misappropriated any medication;

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(j) Has engaged in any other conduct, whether of the same or of a different character from that specified in this article, that would constitute a crime as defined in Title 97 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as now or hereafter amended, and that relates to such person's employment as a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse;

(k) Engages in conduct likely to deceive, defraud orharm the public;

(1) Engages in any unprofessional conduct as identifiedby the board in its rules;

(m) Has violated any provision of this article; or
(n) Violation(s) of the provisions of Sections 41-121-1
through 41-121-9 relating to deceptive advertisement by health
care practitioners. This paragraph shall stand repealed on July
1, 2020.

(2) When the board finds any person unqualified because of any of the grounds set forth in subsection (1) of this section, it may enter an order imposing one or more of the following penalties:

(a) Denying application for a license or other
 authorization to practice nursing, advanced nursing practice or
 practical nursing;

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(b) Administering a reprimand;

(c) Suspending or restricting the license or other authorization to practice as a registered nurse, advanced practice registered nurse or licensed practical nurse for up to two (2) years without review;

303 (d) Revoking the license or other authorization to 304 practice nursing, advanced nursing practice or practical nursing;

(e) Requiring the disciplinee to submit to care, counseling or treatment by persons and/or agencies approved or designated by the board as a condition for initial, continued or renewed licensure or other authorization to practice nursing, advanced nursing practice or practical nursing;

(f) Requiring the disciplinee to participate in a program of education prescribed by the board as a condition for initial, continued or renewed licensure or other authorization to practice;

(g) Requiring the disciplinee to practice under the supervision of a registered nurse <u>or advanced practice registered</u> <u>nurse</u> for a specified period of time; or

317 (h) Imposing a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars318 (\$500.00).

(3) In addition to the grounds specified in subsection (1)
of this section, the board shall be authorized to suspend the
license or privilege to practice of any licensee for being out of
compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section

The procedure for suspension of a license or privilege 324 to practice for being out of compliance with an order for support, 325 and the procedure for the reissuance or reinstatement of a license 326 or privilege to practice suspended for that purpose, and the 327 payment of any fees for the reissuance or reinstatement of a 328 license or privilege to practice suspended for that purpose, shall 329 be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be. 330 If there is any conflict between any provision of Section 331 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any provision of this article, the provisions of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be, 332 333 shall control.

(4) If the public health, safety or welfare imperatively
requires emergency action and the board incorporates a finding to
that effect in an order, the board may order summary suspension of
a license pending proceedings for revocation or other action.
These proceedings shall be promptly instituted and determined by
the board.

340 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 341 and after July 1, 2018.
