1 2 3 4	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
8	to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds, for the
9	purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the
10	Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year
11	beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
12	\$ 1,103,247,415.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds
14	appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services,
15	the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and
16	the Office of Enforcement. Of the funds appropriated under the
17	provisions of Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

19	Permanent: Full Time 3,384
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20	Part Time 9
21	Time-Limited: Full Time

23	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
24	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
25	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not
26	exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose,
27	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
28	2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
29	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
30	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
31	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
32	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
33	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases

73	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
7 4	Mississippi Department of Transportation shall maintain complete
75	accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all

78	Year 2018. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
79	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2020 shall be

- 122 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the

- SECTION 7. None of the funds appropriated under the
  provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the
  Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if
  such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:
- 153 (a) The explanation and justification for letting such 154 a contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered 155 upon the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;
  - (b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after entry of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation Committee.
- SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
  Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
  (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
  Program.
- 167 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 168 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend

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- an amount not to exceed Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00)
- 170 received from third-party damages.
- 171 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, not less
- than Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000.00) shall be expended for
- 173 contracted maintenance overlay and pavement rehabilitation.
- 174 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 175 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend
- 176 with funds which were obligated in Fiscal Year 2018 for
- 177 maintenance overlay projects and maintenance repair projects but
- 178 not completed by the end of Fiscal Year 2018, in an amount not to
- 179 exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00).
- 180 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 181 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer
- 182 between the various programs in an amount not to exceed ten
- 183 percent (10%) of the amount allocated in Section 3, except that no
- 184 transfers shall be authorized which increase the "Administrative
- 185 and Other Expenses" Program or the "Law Enforcement" Program or
- 186 which decrease the "Maintenance" Program.
- 187 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 188 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend
- 189 funds which were obligated in Fiscal Year 2018 but not expended in
- 190 2018 in the "Capital Outlay-Equipment" category in an amount not
- 191 to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) as authorized in HB
- 192 2, 2017 First Extraordinary Session, for Fiscal Year 2018.

193	SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
194	Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend
195	an amount not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00)
196	received from other public or private entities as reimbursements
197	for payments made on federal projects.

Mississippi Department of Transportation shall notify members of the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of projects within their respective districts and at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement of ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." Further, the signage shall state the four-year legislative term in which the project was funded.

331	Officer V, DOT Enforcement Officer Specialist, DOT Enforcement
332	Officer Supervisor and DOT Enforcement Officer Commander.
333	SECTION 29. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
334	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
335	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
336	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
337	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
338	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
339	SECTION 30. This act shall take effect and be in force from
340	and after July 1 2018
