1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE-DIVISION OF MEDICAID FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI MEDICAID LAW AND DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF THAT LAW FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
9	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
10	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
11	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
12	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
13	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
14	beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
15	\$ 840,827,509.00.
16	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
17	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
18	to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
19	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

20	medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the
21	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
22	\$ 389,186,040.00.
23	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
24	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
25	the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's
26	Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source
27	funds collected by or otherwise available to the Division, for the
28	purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi
29	Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of
30	such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending
31	June 30, 2019\$ 5,043,008,585.00.
32	Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended
33	by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any
34	recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to
35	offset the cost of such audits and third party recoveries and as
36	such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for
37	these purposes.
38	SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
39	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
40	to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, for the purpose
41	of defraying the expenses of the Governor's Office - Division of
42	Medicaid for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending
43	June 30, 2019\$ 76,196,128.00.

44	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
45	this act, the following positions are authorized:

51	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
52	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
53	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not
54	exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose,
55	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
56	2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
57	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
58	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
59	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
60	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
61	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
62	this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2019
63	appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
64	exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
65	the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal

- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 87 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 88 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 89 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 90 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 91 Governor's Office Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete
- 92 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 93 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be

94	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for 1	Fiscal
95	Year 2018. It is further the intention of the Legislature that	
96	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2020 shall be	
97	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a	format

109	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to acl	nieve the
110	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding au	thorized,

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided to implement an Adult Foster Care program for Medicaid

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recipients as authorized by Section 43-13-117, Mississippi Code of 195 1972.

196 SECTION 10. The division shall provide statistical and 197 financial reports on a monthly basis to the Legislative Budget 198 Office and the PEER Committee. These reports shall include, but 199 are not limited to, an accounting of all funds spent and 200 participant statistics medical program, the CHIP program, the 201 Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home and 202 Community Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds 203 spent in the administrative program and any other information 204 requested by the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. 205 The Division of Medicaid shall implement the improvements to this 206 report as outlined in Finding Number 25 of the February 21, 2017, 207 Navigant report, titled Mississippi Operational and Performance 208 Assessment of the Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid (DOM). 209 The Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow 210 projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and any other information requested available, upon request, to the 211 212 Chair of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the House 213 Public Health and Human Services Committee, the House Medicaid 214 Committee, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, the

Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. A summary of

this cash flow projection shall also be presented in the report

referenced in the above paragraph.

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218	SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
219	Division of Medicaid shall pay the maximum per diem rate allowed
220	by federal law or regulation to providers of adult day services
221	for each day of service provided to an eligible beneficiary. In
222	order to receive this per diem rate of reimbursement, providers of
223	adult day services shall participate in the Elderly and Disabled
224	Waiver Program for Home and Community Based Services.
225	SECTION 12. In the division's Fiscal Year 2020 budget
226	submission, all Medicaid 1915 (C) Home and Community Based Waivers
227	shall be presented as a budget program separate from the Medical
228	Services Program.
229	SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
230	of this act in an amount not to exceed, Two Million Seven Hundred
231	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00) is provided for the purpose
232	of funding a temporary program to provide nonemergency
233	transportation to locations for necessary dialysis services for
234	end-stage renal disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of
235	age or older or are disabled as determined under Section
236	1614(a)(3) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, whose
237	income did not exceed one hundred thirty-five percent (135%) of
238	the nonfarm official poverty level as defined by the Office of
239	Management and Budget and whose eligibility was covered under the
240	former category of eligibility known as Poverty Level Aged and

241 Disabled (PLADS).

242	SECTION 14. Of the funds appr	copriated in Sections 1 and 3,

283	SECTION 16. Of the funds app	ropriated herein, an amount not
284	to exceed Three Hundred Thousand D	ollars (\$300,000.00) is provided
285	for payments to certain eligible o	bstetricians and gynecologists
286	for the provision of certain prima	ry care services, as defined by
287	the division, at up to one hundred	percent (100%) of the Medicare
288	Physician fee schedule.	
289	SECTION 17. Of the funds app	ropriated herein, Five Hundred
290	Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) sha	ll be allocated to the Delta

Health Alliance for a Patient Centered Medical Model Home in Leland, Mississippi.

SECTION 18. No funds appropriated by this act may be expended until the Division of Medicaid provides for the reimbursement of long acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs) insertion at the time of delivery, outside of the current Medicaid All Patient Refined-Diagnosis Related Group Version (APR-DRG) payment methodology, to Medicaid Enrolled hospital providers, and the Division of Medicaid considers the coverage of LARC insertion at the time of delivery to be an add-on benefit, paid according to a payment schedule developed by the Division, that is not included in the APR-DRG reimbursement process.

SECTION 19. (1) Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 4, an amount not to exceed Three Million Nine Hundred Forty-five Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars (\$3,945,889.00) shall be provided for the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health Demonstration Project, of which funds (a) Two Million Eight Hundred Seventy-nine Thousand Fifty-one Dollars (\$2,879,051.00) shall be used for the continuation of the existing program and shall be transferred no later than July 31, 2018, and (b) One Million Sixty-six Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$1,066,838.00) shall be used as state funds for the purposes of drawing federal matching funds for expansion of the program.

(2) As conditions of receiving the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 4, (a) the Division of Medicaid shall attempt to

316	procure federal matching funds for all state support funds
317	appropriated to the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health
318	Demonstration Project, without delaying any payments authorized by
319	this section that are due on or before July 31, 2018, and (b) a
320	progress report on the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population
321	Health Demonstration Project shall be provided to the Chairmen of
322	the Senate and House Public Health Committees, Senate and House
323	Medicaid Committees and the Senate and House Appropriations
324	Committees on or before December 31, 2018.
325	SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
326	Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid and the Department of
327	Human Services shall work together to implement HB 1090 of the
328	2017 Regular Session, known as the "Medicaid and Human Services
329	Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".
330	SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
331	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
332	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
333	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
334	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
335	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
336	SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from
337	and after July 1, 2018.
