HOUSE BILL NO. 1605 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Soil and Water
8	Conservation Commission for the purpose of defraying the
9	administrative expenses of the commission and carrying out the
10	provisions of Section 69-27-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972,
11	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending
12	June 30, 2019\$ 604,687.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
14	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
15	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Soil and Water
16	Conservation Commission which is comprised of special source funds
17	collected by or otherwise available to the commission, for the

18	purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal
19	year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
20	\$ 4,749,732.00.
21	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
22	this act, the following positions are authorized:
23	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
24	Permanent: Full Time 11
25	Part Time 0
26	Time-Limited: Full Time 4
27	Part Time 0
28	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
29	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
30	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not
31	exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose,
32	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
33	2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
34	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
35	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
36	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
37	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
38	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
39	this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2019
40	appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
41	exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
42	the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal

- 43 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 44 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 45 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2019 "Personal Services"
- 46 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 47 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 48 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 49 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 51 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 52 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 53 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 54 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 55 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 56 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 57 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 58 appropriated level.
- 59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 61 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 62 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 63 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 64 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 65 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 66 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

- 67 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 68 State Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall maintain
- 69 complete accounting and personnel records related to the
- 70 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
- 71 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
- 72 maintained for Fiscal Year 2018. It is further the intention of
- 73 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 74 2020 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- 75 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 76 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2019 budget request
- 77 process.
- 78 **SECTION 5.** The State Soil and Water Conservation Commission
- 79 is authorized to retain all funds generated from the sale of
- 80 equipment. Any funds made available from the sale of equipment
- 81 shall be deposited into the special fund in the State Treasury to
- 82 the credit of the Soil and Water Conservation Commission and shall
- 83 be used solely for the purpose of purchasing equipment.
- 84 SECTION 6. The State Soil and Water Conservation Commission
- 85 is authorized to receive, budget and expend any proceeds derived
- 86 from the sale of bonds authorized in Section 69-27-331 et seq.,
- 87 Mississippi Code of 1972. All expenditures shall be in accordance
- 88 with conditions provided in Section 69-27-331 et seq., Mississippi
- 89 Code of 1972.
- 90 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the
- 91 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed

92 Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) be used for the purpose 93 of funding a Beaver Control Cost Share program. The Mississippi 94 Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall promulgate rules and regulations for the establishment and operation of the program on 95 96 a fund matching basis with the county unit of government. Funds 97 not expended or encumbered in a county may be transferred to another county during the fiscal year. Only those funds 98 99 specifically appropriated for the Beaver Control Cost Share

program shall be used in any such program.

- 101 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that 102 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 103 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 104 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 105 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 106 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 107 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 108 made without competitive bids.
- funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with

 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency

 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their

 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally

 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for

 actions contrary to this provision.

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SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2018.
