> HOUSE BILL NO. 1606 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 2 MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES FOR THE FISCAL 3 YEAR 2019. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 7 Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal year 8 beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019..... 9\$ 1,065,130.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in 12 the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine 13 14 Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending 15 June 30, 2019.....\$ 28,103,092.00. 16 Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state 17 18 excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products.

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SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized: AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:

Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.

29 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 30 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 31 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not 32 exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose, 33 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 34 2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data 35 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 36 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 37 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the 38 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 39 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 40 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2019 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 41 42 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 43

Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2019 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 53 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 59 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

68 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 69 Department of Marine Resources shall maintain complete accounting 70 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 71 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 72 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 73 2018. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 74 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2020 shall be submitted to 75 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 76 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 77 during the Fiscal Year 2019 budget request process.

78 **SECTION 5.** In addition to all other sums heretofore 79 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 80 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 81 Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3345200000 to the 82 Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the 83 expenses of the tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019.....\$ 10,000,000.00. 84 Of the funds appropriated in this section, the following 85 86 projects are authorized: 87 PROJECT NO. 142 subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the

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143 subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2018. All proposals 144 submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of 145 146 Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. 147 Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with 148 high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated. 149 150 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of 151 the tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be 152 153 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 154 section.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 155 SECTION 6. 156 commission shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the 157 department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the 158 principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in 159 the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the 160 special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year. 161 The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay 162 reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects. 163 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 164 Department of Marine Resources has the authorization to move 165 tidelands funds between approved projects upon request from entity

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166 and proper completion of Form TTF-6 documentation.

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167 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature for the 168 Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Environmental 169 Quality to continue with any agency partnerships, including grant 170 agreements, that provide environmental projects to restore 171 Mississippi's natural resources in the wake of the Deepwater 172 Horizon Oil Spill.

173 SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 174 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Tidelands 175 Fund No. 3345200000, for the Department of Marine Resources for 176 the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Tidelands Funds 177 3345200000, as authorized in House Bill 1518, 2017 Regular 178 Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending 179 June 30, 2019.....\$300,000.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2018.

The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Tidelands Fund No. 3345200000, for the Department of Marine Resources for

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the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Tidelands Funds 3345200000, as authorized in previous fiscal year appropriations for the purpose of continuing any existing and approved Tideland Fund projects, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019......\$4,200,000.00.

197 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the 198 provisions of this act, in no event shall the amount expended 199 exceed the unexpended balance of June 30, 2018.

200 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 201 202 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 203 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 204 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 205 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 206 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 207 made without competitive bids.

208 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 209 210 utilities for state furnished housing for any employees. Such 211 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 212 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 213 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance with legislative intent. Such state furnished housing shall 214 215 include single-family and multi-family residences but shall not

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

225 SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 226 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 227 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 228 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 229 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 230 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 231 SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from 232 and after July 1, 2018.
