## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 19

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE  
2 MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890 TO REQUIRE THE LEGISLATURE TO  
3 REVIEW EACH ADMINISTRATIVE RULE PROMULGATED BY A STATE AGENCY  
4 WHICH WOULD EFFECT THE STATE BUDGET BY TEN PERCENT OR MORE; TO  
5 PROVIDE THAT ANY SUCH RULE WOULD BECOME EFFECTIVE AT THE END OF  
6 THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE SESSION UNLESS THE LEGISLATURE DISAPPROVES OF  
7 THE RULE BY A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY BOTH HOUSES; AND FOR RELATED  
8 PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI,  
10 That the following amendment to the Mississippi Constitution of  
11 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the state:

12 Amend the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 by creating a new  
13 section to read as follows:

14 "Section \_\_\_\_\_. The Legislature shall review \* \* \* each  
15 administrative rule promulgated by a state agency \* \* \* which  
16 would positively or negatively effect the state budget by ten  
17 percent (10%) or more in any fiscal year. \* \* \* The  
18 administrative rule \* \* \* may not become effective until the end  
19 of the next legislative session held after the promulgation of the  
20 rule, after which, the rule \* \* \* will take full force and effect  
21 unless a resolution is adopted by both houses disapproving



22 of \* \* \* the rule. The Legislature shall provide, by general law,  
23 for the implementation of this section."

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be  
25 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at  
26 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday  
27 of November 2018, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution  
28 and by general law.

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed  
30 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed  
31 constitutional amendment requires the Legislature to review \* \* \*  
32 each administrative rule promulgated by a state agency \* \* \* which  
33 would effect the state budget by ten percent (10%) or more. Any  
34 such rule would become effective at the end of the next  
35 legislative session \* \* \* unless the Legislature disapproves of  
36 the rule by a resolution adopted by both houses. The proposed  
37 amendment also requires the Legislature to enact general law to  
38 implement the requirements of this section."
