HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 25

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 203 2 AND SECTION 202, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO ABOLISH THE
- 3 EXISTING STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND TRANSFER THE POWERS AND
- 4 DUTIES TO THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR; TO PROVIDE THAT THE FORMER
- 5 STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE DIVISION OF
- 6 PUBLIC EDUCATION IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR; AND FOR RELATED
- 7 PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
- 9 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendments to the Mississippi
- 10 Constitution of 1890 are proposed to the qualified electors of the
- 11 state:
- 12 I.
- 13 Amend Section 203, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 14 as follows:
- 15 "Section 203. * * * There shall be a State Board of
- 16 Education which shall manage and invest school funds according to
- 17 law, formulate policies according to law for implementation by
- 18 the * * * Division of Public Education in the Office of the
- 19 Governor, and perform such other duties as prescribed by law. The
- 20 board shall consist of nine (9) members of which none shall be an

- elected official. The Governor shall appoint one (1) member who shall be a resident of the Northern Supreme Court District and who
- 23 shall serve an initial term of one (1) year, one (1) member who
- 24 shall be a resident of the Central Supreme Court District and who
- 25 shall serve an initial term of five (5) years, one (1) member who
- 26 shall be a resident of the Southern Supreme Court District and who
- 27 shall serve an initial term of nine (9) years, one (1) member who
- 28 shall be employed on an active and full-time basis as a school
- 29 administrator and who shall serve an initial term of three (3)
- 30 years, and one (1) member who shall be employed on an active and
- 31 full-time basis as a schoolteacher and who shall serve an initial
- 32 term of seven (7) years. The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint
- 33 two (2) members from the state at large, one (1) of whom shall
- 34 serve an initial term of four (4) years and one (1) of whom shall
- 35 serve an initial term of eight (8) years. The Speaker of the
- 36 House of Representatives shall appoint two (2) members from the
- 37 state at large, one (1) of whom shall serve an initial term of two
- 38 (2) years and one (1) of whom shall serve an initial term of six
- 39 (6) years. The initial terms of appointees shall begin on July 1,
- 40 1984, and all subsequent appointments shall begin on the first day
- 41 of July for a term of (9) years and continue until their
- 42 successors are appointed and qualify. An appointment to fill a
- 43 vacancy which arises for reasons other than by expiration of a
- 44 term of office shall be for the unexpired term only. The
- 45 Legislature shall by general law prescribe the compensation which

46 members of the board shall be entitled to receive. All members

47 shall be appointed with the advice and consent of the Senate and

48 no members shall be actively engaged in the educational profession

49 except as stated above."

50 II.

Amend Section 202, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read

52 as follows:

"Section 202. * * * There shall be a State Superintendent of

54 Public Education who shall be appointed by the State Board of

55 Education, subject to the Governor's approval, and with the advice

56 and consent of the Senate, and serve at the * * * Governor's will

57 and pleasure. He shall possess such qualifications as may be

58 prescribed by law. He shall be the chief administrative officer

59 for the * * * Division of Public Education and shall administer

60 the * * * division in accordance with the policies established by

61 the State Board of Education. He shall perform such other duties

62 and receive such compensation as shall be prescribed by law."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That these proposed amendments shall

64 be submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors

65 at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first

66 Monday of November 2018, as provided by Section 273 of the

67 Constitution and by general law, with the amendments in this

68 resolution being voted on as one (1) amendment since the proposed

69 amendments pertain to one (1) subject.

70	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation for this
71	proposed amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This
72	proposed constitutional amendment provides that the existing State
73	Department of Education shall be abolished and the powers and
74	duties transferred to the Division of Public Education in the
75	Office of the Governor."
