HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 51

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE STATE LIBRARY UPON THE SPECTACULAR OCCASION OF ITS 200TH ANNIVERSARY.
- 3 WHEREAS, on January 31, 2018, the State Library will
- 4 celebrate the marvelous occasion of its 200th anniversary,
- 5 honoring its two centuries of outstanding service to the State of
- 6 Mississippi; and
- WHEREAS, while officially established by an act of the
- 8 Legislature in 1838, the State Library traces its inception to a
- 9 resolution passed by the Legislature on January 31, 1818, for the
- 10 purchase of the state's first collection of books and maps; and
- 11 WHEREAS, by 1891, the State Library was considered to be the
- 12 second finest library of its kind in the Union, outranked only by
- 13 the Massachusetts Library, with the emphasis of the library's
- 14 collection being legal works, and also containing material on
- 15 travel, medicine, biography, church history and many other topics;
- 16 and 70 years later, in 1961, the State Library achieved notoriety
- 17 once again by being recognized as the third largest law library in
- 18 the United States; and

- 19 WHEREAS, first located in the Old Capitol building, the State
- 20 Library later relocated to the New Capitol building, until 1973,
- 21 when it moved to the Carroll Gartin Justice Building, and then
- 22 relocated once again in 2008 to the new Carroll Gartin Justice
- 23 Building, where it is currently situated; and
- 24 WHEREAS, by an 1860 act of the Legislature, the State Library
- 25 was placed under the control of the Trustees of the Library, its
- 26 members at that time being the Governor, Judges of the High Court
- of Errors and Appeals and the Attorney General; and, in 1989, the
- 28 Legislature placed the State Library under the control of the
- 29 Mississippi Supreme Court; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the State Librarian has been elected by the
- 31 Legislature since 1842, with the current State Librarian, Stephen
- 32 Parks, being chosen by the Supreme Court and elected by the
- 33 Legislature in 2016; historically, however, in 1820 and 1828,
- 34 legislation directed the Secretary of State to be the State
- 35 Librarian, and for a time, the State Librarian and the Keeper of
- 36 the Capitol were one and the same, until the 1890 Constitution
- 37 separated the two offices, with the Secretary of State becoming
- 38 Keeper of the Capitol; and
- 39 WHEREAS, in 1876, the State Librarian was a woman, appointed
- 40 by a man who was selected by the Legislature, until 1892, when,
- 41 for the first time, a woman was a candidate for the position of
- 42 State Librarian and was re-elected in her own name; and the
- 43 Mississippi Constitution of 1890 stated that any woman of the age

- 44 of 20 years was eligible for the office, until it was amended in
- 45 1978 to remove the specific qualifications for the position; and
- WHEREAS, in 1938, the Legislature created the Legislative
- 47 Reference Bureau and placed it under the State Library's
- 48 supervision for the members of the Legislature, the Governor and
- 49 the various departments, institutions and agencies of the state to
- 50 use, with the State Librarian being its director, until 1980, when
- 51 the Legislative Reference Bureau was placed under the supervision
- 52 of the Legislature itself; and
- 53 WHEREAS, for 200 years each State Librarian has contributed
- 54 tremendously to the development of a rich heritage of primary
- 55 legal materials for the State Library's collection, with many
- 56 volumes being original printings, including English and Canadian
- 57 court reports from 1801 to 1982; the Congressional Record from
- 58 1789 to current issues; the Federal Register from 1936 to current
- 59 issues; selected U.S. Government depository items since the
- 60 mid-1880s and an extensive collection of Mississippi primary and
- 61 secondary legal resources; and

- 62 WHEREAS, being a federal depository library of the Third U.S.
- 63 Congressional District of the State of Mississippi since the
- 64 mid-1880s, the State Library's mission is to provide law library
- 65 services to the Mississippi Supreme Court and other state courts,
- 66 to state officials and to the general public; and
- 67 WHEREAS, the State Library has received recognition within
- 68 the past year by being awarded the Excellence in Marketing Award

- 69 and Best Newsletter from the American Association of Law
- 70 Libraries, and has received further recognition when the State
- 71 Librarian, Stephen Parks, testified before the congressional
- 72 Committee on House Administration regarding proposed changes to
- 73 the Federal Depository Library Program; and
- 74 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 75 and commend outstanding institutions in Mississippi that have left
- 76 a profound impact on its citizens and continue to serve a
- 77 positive, vital role in present and future vitality and
- 78 sustainability of this great Magnolia State:
- 79 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 80 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 81 THEREIN, That we do hereby recognize and celebrate the 200th
- 82 anniversary of the State Library and express best wishes for its
- 83 continued success.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 85 furnished to the State Librarian and to the members of the Capitol
- 86 Press Corps.
