- 4 WHEREAS, for decades, the United States of America and the
- 5 Republic of China (Taiwan) have fostered a close relationship of
- 6 enormous mutual economic, cultural and strategic benefit to both
- 7 parties; and
- 8 WHEREAS, bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan
- 9 reached 65.4 billion in 2016, making Taiwan the 10th largest
- 10 trading partner of the United States, and Taiwan's economic
- 11 revitalization program, the five-plus-two innovative industries
- 12 initiative, is boosting exchanges between the United States and
- 13 Taiwan, and as the core objective of Taiwan's New Southbound
- 14 Policy, forging regional links with Southeast Asian nations; and
- 15 WHEREAS, United States exports to Taiwan, combined with
- 16 Taiwan's investment in the United States, support over 330,000
- 17 well paid United States jobs, and both nations could realize
- 18 further economic gains through the establishment of a Bilateral

- 19 Trade Agreement (BTA) as well as by enhancing the platforms of the
- 20 Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) and the Digital
- 21 Economy Forum (DEF); and
- 22 WHEREAS, agribusiness continues to be one of the leading
- 23 industries in Mississippi, and Taiwan is a leading importer of
- 24 United States agricultural goods, regularly dispatching
- 25 agricultural procurement missions to the United States every two
- 26 years to sign multi-billion dollar supply deals; and
- 27 WHEREAS, designated as a priority market under the SelectUSA
- 28 investment initiative by the Department of Commerce, Taiwan has
- 29 been actively dispatching business delegations of Taiwan
- 30 executives to participate in the SelectUSA Investment Summit since
- 31 its launch in 2013, contributing to foreign direct investment
- 32 which plays a critical role in the United States economy; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Taiwan made a momentous transition to democracy
- 34 beginning in the late 1980s, and has been a beacon of democracy in
- 35 Asia for years, with Taiwan rated as free by Freedom House 20
- 36 years in a row, an inspiring accomplishment for peace-loving
- 37 nations in the world; and
- 38 WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 continues to be the
- 39 cornerstone of relations between the United States and Taiwan,
- 40 contributing to continued peace and stability in the Asia-Pacific
- 41 region and the United States-Taiwan Global Cooperation and
- 42 Training Framework (GCTF) established in June 2015, and helps

- 43 address global challenges such as international humanitarian
- 44 assistance and public health; and
- 45 WHEREAS, Taiwan's participation in the Visa Waiver Program
- 46 (VWP) since November 2012 saw travel from Taiwan to the United
- 47 States increase by almost 60 percent, and, with more Americans
- 48 traveling to Taiwan, the United States and Taiwan jointly launched
- 49 trusted traveler programs on the 5th anniversary of Taiwan joining
- 50 the VWP, making Taiwan the 12th partner worldwide and 3rd in East
- 51 Asia to join the United States Global Entry program; and
- 52 WHEREAS, Taiwan acts as a natural hub to other Asian
- 53 destinations, with Taiwan's Civil Aeronautics Administration
- 54 providing services for nearly 1.53 million controlled flights
- 55 carrying 58 million incoming and outgoing passengers annually; and
- 56 WHEREAS, with nontraditional security threats increasing in
- 57 the 21st century, the meaningful participation and inclusion of
- 58 Taiwan, the 22nd largest economy in the world, to the
- 59 International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL), the
- 60 International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), the United
- 61 Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and the
- 62 World Health Assembly (WHA) would benefit all nations and all
- 63 peoples; and
- 64 WHEREAS, this year marks the 35th anniversary of the
- 65 sister-state relationship between Mississippi and Taiwan, a bond
- 66 nurtured through mutually beneficial exchanges: 1,150 jobs in
- 67 Mississippi are supported by Taiwan affiliated companies;

- 68 Mississippi exported \$47,700,000.00 in goods and services to
- 69 Taiwan in 2016, making Taiwan the 9th largest export partner for
- 70 Mississippi in Asia:
- 71 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 72 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 73 THEREIN, That we do hereby encourage closer economic relationships
- 74 between the United States and Taiwan by negotiating a BTA between
- 75 the two countries; commend the introduction of reciprocal United
- 76 States and Taiwan trusted traveler programs, the United States
- 77 Global Entry program and the Taiwan e-Gate program, which
- 78 encourages two-way tourism; support Taiwan's meaningful
- 79 participation in the INTERPOL, ICAO, UNFCCC, and WHA; celebrate
- 80 the 35th anniversary of the sister-state relationship between the
- 81 State of Mississippi and Taiwan; commend Mr. Peter C.Y. Chen,
- 82 Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in
- 83 Houston, Texas, for efforts and contributions toward enhancing
- 84 cooperation between Taiwan and Mississippi.
