HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 62

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER 2 AND MERITORIOUS LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE THAT THE HONORABLE JUDGE 3 JOHN ANDREW HATCHER, JR., PROVIDED AS THE CHANCERY COURT JUDGE OF 4 THE FIRST CHANCERY COURT DISTRICT OF MISSISSIPPI, PLACE 1, UPON 5 THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT.

6 WHEREAS, the Honorable John Andrew Hatcher, Jr., Chancery 7 Court Judge of the First Chancery Court District of Mississippi, 8 Place 1, which covers Alcorn, Tishomingo, Prentiss, Lee, Union, 9 Pontotoc, Monroe and Itawamba Counties, retires from the bench 10 after more than 11 years of judicial service to the great State of 11 Mississippi and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, born on November 23, 1948, in Jackson, Mississippi, Judge Hatcher graduated in 1966 from Drew High School in Sunflower County, Mississippi, furthered his education at Delta State, graduating in 1969, and received his Juris Doctorate in December 16 1972, from the University of Mississippi School of Law; and WHEREAS, John Andrew Hatcher, Jr., esquire, began the general

18 practice of law in Booneville, Mississippi, in November 1973, and

19 from 1975 until 1976, he taught a paralegal program at Northeast 20 Mississippi Community College; and

21 WHEREAS, motivated to perform public service, Judge Hatcher 22 served as the vice chairman of the Mississippi Council on Children 23 from 1977 until 1979, the Housing Specialist with the Governor's 24 Office of Federal, State and Local Programs, Division of Housing 25 Coordination from 1978 until 1979 and the Director of Yocona Area 26 Council of Boy Scouts of America from 1979 until 1980; and

27 WHEREAS, Judge Hatcher has a true passion for advocating on 28 behalf of his community, as he served as the county prosecutor for 29 Prentiss County, Mississippi, from 1980 until 1995, the city 30 prosecutor for Baldwyn, Mississippi, and the city attorney for 31 Marietta, Mississippi, from 1991 until 2006, and city attorney for 32 Farmington, Mississippi, from 1999 until 2006; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, Judge Hatcher was the founding incorporator, director and secretary of Booneville-Prentiss County Parks, Inc. (Kids Town), and he currently serves as the founding incorporator, director and secretary of Brice's Crossroads National Battlefield Commission, Inc., and the founding incorporator, director and president of Lower Anderson Owners' Association, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, because of his expertise, Judge Hatcher has served
in many leadership roles throughout his community, including
president of the First Judicial District Bar Association, chairman
