- 2 DEDICATED SERVICES OF DR. RONALD E. NETTLES II, AND CONGRATULATING
- 3 HIM UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AS PRESIDENT OF
- 4 COPIAH-LINCOLN COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II will retire as President of
- 6 Copiah-Lincoln Community College on June 30, 2018, after
- 7 dedicating over 33 years of illustrious service and guidance to
- 8 the students, faculty and staff of Copiah-Lincoln Community
- 9 College; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Nettles obtained his bachelor of science degree
- 11 in political science and master of education degree in counseling
- 12 and personnel services from the University of Southern
- 13 Mississippi, earned his Ph.D. from the University of Mississippi
- 14 in educational leadership, and completed additional studies at
- 15 Mississippi State University and the University of Arkansas; and
- 16 WHEREAS, with an extensive background in education, Dr.
- 17 Nettles joined the staff of Copiah-Lincoln Community College on
- 18 the Wesson Campus in September of 1994, as Director of Community

- 19 and Economic Development, and was later named Dean of the Natchez
- 20 Campus on July 1, 1997; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Dr. Nettles was transferred back to Wesson as
- 22 Executive Vice President on July 1, 2004, and selected President
- 23 of Copiah-Lincoln Community College on July 1, 2008; and
- 24 WHEREAS, as Copiah-Lincoln President, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles
- 25 II, saw growth in enrollment rise to an all-time high, increased
- 26 the Co-Lin Foundation's endowment to double over \$8 million, and
- 27 instituted new instructional programs and services that have
- 28 increased student graduation rates; and
- 29 WHEREAS, under Dr. Nettles' leadership, six new buildings
- 30 have been constructed including the Alton Greenlee Pro Shop
- 31 (2010); Howell C. Garner Instructional Building (2011); Eugene
- 32 Bates Men's Residence Hall (2012); H.L. Stone Stadium Press Box
- 33 (2014); Early Childhood Education Building (2015); and the New
- 34 Women's Residence Hall (to be completed in 2018); and
- 35 WHEREAS, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II orchestrated the renovation
- 36 and repair to the baseball, softball, and soccer fields, Mullen
- 37 Gymnasium, Henley Cafeteria, Pitts Field House, H. L. Stone
- 38 Stadium, Anderson Building, Smith Hall Chemistry Lab, Ewing Fine
- 39 Arts Auditorium, Ellzey Hall, Diesel Mechanics Classroom,
- 40 Callendar Hall, energy/mechanical projects totaling over \$2.9
- 41 million, roofing projects over \$1.5 million, two new parking lots
- 42 and paving projects; and

- WHEREAS, additionally, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II has seen the
- 44 college's athletic programs gain national recognition, at times
- 45 being nationally-ranked on the playing field and academically and
- 46 having participated in national tournaments; and
- WHEREAS, with Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II at the helm, the
- 48 college has been recognized on a national and statewide level by
- 49 the Apsen Institute College Excellence Program (two consecutive
- 50 times), Great Colleges To Work For by The Chronicle of Higher
- 51 Education, Purple Heart College, Military Friendly Award (No. 3),
- 52 Best Colleges in Mississippi, and currently working to have the
- 53 first ACT Work Ready Region in the state; and
- 54 WHEREAS, a true leader during his tenure as President of
- 55 Copiah-Lincoln, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II has served as President
- 56 of the Southern Association of Colleges with Associate Degrees,
- 57 President of the Mississippi Community College Presidents
- 58 Association, Secretary on the Mississippi Commission of College
- 59 Accreditation, past President of the Mississippi Association of
- 60 Colleges (MAC) and past President of the Copiah County Economic
- 61 Development District; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II is a member of numerous
- 63 professional organizations and civic clubs including the
- 64 Mississippi Humanities Council, Wesson Lions Club, Wesson Chamber
- of Commerce, and is a charter member of the Brookhaven Rotary
- 66 Club; and

- WHEREAS, throughout the years, Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II has
- 68 received notable honors, including the National Institute for
- 69 Organizations Development Excellence Award, Co-Lin's Howell C.
- 70 Garner High Performance Award, Phi Theta Kappa's Shirley B. Gordon
- 71 Award of Distinction and the Michael Bennett Lifetime Achievement
- 72 Award, and was a member of the Mississippi Economic Council's
- 73 Leadership Mississippi Class; and
- 74 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 75 and commend the outstanding contributions of a citizen such as Dr.
- 76 Nettles who has provided a quality educational environment and
- 77 curriculum to the students of this state who are its future:
- 78 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 79 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 80 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend the exemplary and dedicated
- 81 services of Dr. Ronald E. Nettles II, congratulate him upon the
- 82 occasion of his retirement as President of Copiah-Lincoln
- 83 Community College, and express warmest wishes for continued
- 84 success in all of his future endeavors.
