HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 95

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE
DILIGENCE, SERVICE AND WIDE INFLUENCE OF THE PASTORS AND MEMBERS
OF LOCUST GROVE MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH ON THE OCCASION OF THE

4 CHURCH'S HISTORIC 150TH YEAR ANNIVERSARY.

5 WHEREAS, Locust Grove Missionary Baptist Church, a historic

6 foundation established in Greenwood, Mississippi, will celebrate

7 the splendid occasion of its sesquicentennial church anniversary

8 on September 9, 2018, acknowledging 150 years of spiritual

9 excellence and devotion; and

10 WHEREAS, Locust Grove Missionary Baptist Church, which has

11 the noble distinction of being the oldest African-American church

12 in Greenwood, Mississippi, as well as for never splitting its

13 membership, was organized under the leadership of Reverend Pete

14 Green in 1868; and

15 WHEREAS, the original church site for Locust Grove was on

16 Carrollton Avenue, which is now where Eastside Grocery is located,

17 and at the time, the area only had woods and locust trees and as a

18 result, the church was named Locust Grove; and

- 19 WHEREAS, in 1926, the original church building was torn down
- 20 and was rebuilt under the leadership of Reverend Payne, and during
- 21 that time, the deacons were Charlie Warren, Issac Armstrong,
- 22 Charlie Harris and John Smith, and the women of the missionary
- 23 society were Sarah Armstrong, Beatrice Sykes Bell, Annie Bell
- 24 Stanciel, Mary Ella Warren and Ethel Brownlow; and
- 25 WHEREAS, in 1950, under the leadership of Reverend A.B.
- 26 Woods, a patient and wise man of God, Locust Grove was moved to
- 27 1209 Broad Street, a task that took over a year; and
- WHEREAS, on October 14, 1951, the pastor and members of
- 29 Locust Grove officially entered the new church, and the old church
- 30 was sold to Greenwood Church of God on May 21, 1951, for the cash
- 31 amount of \$3,500; and
- 32 WHEREAS, on December 12, 1952, the members voted to have two
- 33 regular day services on the second and fourth Sunday beginning in
- 34 January 1953; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Reverend Woods, who in addition to being the pastor
- 36 of Locust Grove, was also the outstanding moderator for the
- 37 Grenada District Association, and he was instrumental in bringing
- 38 the late Reverend J.M. Kimble, who served as pastor of McKinney
- 39 Chapel for several years, to Greenwood, Mississippi; and
- 40 WHEREAS, while under the leadership of Reverend Woods, the
- 41 deacons of Locust Grove were as follows: Issac Armstrong, C.B.
- 42 Brownlow, David Wooden, Sr., Willie Holland, C.B. Blackmon, T.J.
- 43 Granderson, Q.B. Shelton, Richard Stanciel and Henry Warren; and

45 superintendents C.B. Blackmon and Willie Holland, the blackboard demonstrators Linberg Moore and Issac Armstrong who was also the 46 director of the Baptist Training Union, which met every Sunday at 47 48 5:00 p.m.; and 49 WHEREAS, after the passing of Reverend Woods, who was a devout and skillful leader of Locust Grove for many years, the 50 51 Reverend G.H. Hankins of Hollandale, Mississippi, successfully led 52 the church until February 14, 1965; and 53 WHEREAS, on May 9, 1965, a zealous, vibrant and spirit-filled 54 young man named Reverend R.L. Williams became pastor of Locust 55 Grove, and under his leadership, the church purchased new pews and 56 a new piano, and the church had live broadcasts every second and 57 fourth Sunday, which enabled the Gospel of Jesus Christ to be 58 shared through the airwaves; and 59 WHEREAS, also under the leadership of Reverend Williams, the 60 Childs and Williams Community Choir was organized at Locust Grove by Reverend Williams and Reverend Childs, which helped uplift the 61 62 name of the Lord through song; and 63 WHEREAS, in addition to meeting the spiritual needs of the 64 church, in 1966 Locust Grove opened its doors to Friends of 65 Children Head Start Association and approximately 100 children

WHEREAS, also under the leadership of Reverend Woods were the

precious youth; and

received educational services, which demonstrated the church's

true concern and love for the surrounding community and its

- 69 WHEREAS, after making vast contributions at Locust Grove,
- 70 Reverend Williams offered his resignation on January 12, 1970, and
- 71 on August 9, 1970, the Lord supplied a ram in the bush by
- 72 providing Reverend M.C. Tardy of Sunflower, Mississippi, as the
- 73 next capable pastor of the church; and
- 74 WHEREAS, after over a decade of God-led service by Reverend
- 75 Tardy, who was known for his humble and obedient spirit, the Lord
- 76 called Reverend Tardy from labor to reward on November 12, 1982;
- 77 and
- 78 WHEREAS, in February 1983, God provided yet another ram in
- 79 the bush for Locust Grove when Reverend M.B. Lewis, a young man
- 80 from Schalter, Mississippi, became pastor of the church; and
- 81 WHEREAS, under the leadership of Reverend Lewis, the
- 82 membership of Locust Grove grew tremendously and there were
- 83 several improvements made to the church, such as the installation
- 84 of central air and heat, the covering of the pews, the purchasing
- 85 of a van, new choir robes, a computer, a baby grand piano, the
- 86 installation of ceiling fans and the addition of a fellowship hall
- 87 to the church; and
- 88 WHEREAS, in September 2006, the present pastor of Locust
- 89 Grove, Pastor William E. Morris, became the shepherd for the flock
- 90 of Locust Grove, and he continues to share the Gospel of Jesus
- 91 Christ while simultaneously and effectively meeting the spiritual
- 92 needs of the congregation; and

- 93 WHEREAS, under the leadership and vision of Pastor William E.
- 94 Morris, Pastor Morris and members of the Board of Trustees
- 95 purchased a new place of worship on December 31, 2013, located on
- 96 a 9.72 acre tract located at 3951 Highway 82 East, Greenwood,
- 97 Mississippi; and
- 98 WHEREAS, Locust Grove Missionary Baptist Church had its
- 99 ribbon cutting ceremony and first church services on February 2,
- 100 2014, and its dedicatory celebration worship services in its new
- 101 church home were held on March 9, 2014; and
- 102 WHEREAS, through the vision, wisdom and spiritual leadership
- 103 of Pastor Morris, Locust Grove Missionary Baptist Church is
- 104 undoubtedly destined to do great things as its story continues to
- 105 unfold; and
- 106 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize a
- 107 great and historical religious institution such as Locust Grove
- 108 Missionary Baptist Church of Greenwood, Mississippi, whose vision
- 109 and motto of "Unity-Harmony-Alliance-Cooperation-Collaboration-
- 110 Faith in Jesus Christ" has not only positively influenced the
- 111 church but also the surrounding community:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 113 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 114 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the diligence
- of the pastors and members of Locust Grove Missionary Baptist
- 116 Church upon the special occasion of the church's 150th anniversary
