HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 97

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING DAVIS MAGNET IB ELEMENTARY 2 SCHOOL FOR BEING RATED AS THE NUMBER ONE PERFORMING ELEMENTARY 3 SCHOOL IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI.

WHEREAS, Davis Magnet IB Elementary School in Jackson,
Mississippi, has been rated as the number one performing
elementary school in the state according to the 2017
accountability ratings, an outstanding achievement for both the
school and for the State of Mississippi; and

9 WHEREAS, with the average score in both reading and math on state assessments hovering near 40 percent for Mississippi 10 11 elementary students, Davis' outstanding 82 percent of students 12 scoring proficient or above in both subjects on state assessments 13 is overwhelmingly exceptional, and it was also one of three 14 elementary schools in its district to receive an "A" rating; and 15 WHEREAS, Principal Kathleen Grigsby stated that the school 16 does not celebrate honor roll because the expectation is that its students are already honor roll students, and Davis is one of 534 17 18 elementary schools in the country to implement this rigorous

19 program, which helps students grasp the material by placing an 20 emphasis on encouraging them to ask questions; and

21 WHEREAS, the school's success derives from its 22 internationally inspired curriculum, with the IB in the school's 23 title standing for International Baccalaureate, and through the IB 24 program's global citizen approach, students are learning Spanish 25 because a global citizen is expected to be bilingual; and

26 WHEREAS, the IB model uses a transdiciplinary approach, where 27 teachers have the ultimate goal of connecting a unit's theme 28 across different subject areas, and instead of approaching a 29 skill, like language, only through rote memorization or 30 compartmentalization, the content is explored through questions; 31 and

32 WHEREAS, students at Davis sit for an assessment three times 33 a year called STAR that gauges their reading and math levels, and 34 after each assessment, individual growth goals are set for each 35 student, and helping students who struggle is a team effort that 36 starts with the classroom teachers, and the school's support staff 37 play an integral role as well; and

38 WHEREAS, in addition to being dedicated to academic 39 excellence, Principal Grigsby is committed to getting students on 40 the road as much as possible, and fifth graders visit colleges 41 around the state, and because Davis has students from each of 42 Jackson's wards, the school aims to offer the trips at a nominal 43 cost; and

No. 97 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 18/HR31/R2215 PAGE 2 (MCL\JAB) WHEREAS, Davis Magnet IB Elementary School is currently named after Jefferson Davis, the president of the Confederacy, and on October 18, 2017, the school announced at a Jackson Public Schools board meeting that a campaign to change the school's namesake had resulted in the students choosing to rename their campus in honor of President Barack Obama, with the change going into effect for the 2019 school year; and

51 WHEREAS, Principal Grigsby noted that Davis is currently 52 accepting applications for the next school year, and the waiting 53 list is presently at 350, and both students and teachers are 54 working hard with hopes that the first school in Mississippi to be 55 named after the nation's first African-American president will 56 also continue to be the number one performer in the state next 57 year; and

58 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to commend 59 outstanding academic institutions that are committed to supporting 60 their students as they strive to achieve academic excellence, 61 especially those such as Davis Magnet IB Elementary School: 62 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF

63 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 64 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Davis Magnet IB Elementary 65 School for being rated as the number one performing elementary 66 school in the State of Mississippi.
