## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 104

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE 2 2018 MISSISSIPPI HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION (MHSAA) 3 CHOCTAW CENTRAL LADY WARRIORS BASKETBALL TEAM ON WINNING THEIR 4 SEVENTH CLASS 3A STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND BEING BACK-TO-BACK 5 CHAMPIONS.

6 WHEREAS, the Choctaw Central Lady Warriors Basketball Team 7 clenched their seventh state championship title when they defeated 8 Independence with an 89-56 win during the finals of the Class 3A 9 Girls State tournament sponsored by the Mississippi High School 10 Activities Association; and

11 WHEREAS, state championship wins are familiar to the Lady 12 Warriors who have now won in years 1996, 1997, 1999, 2004, 2005, 13 2017 and 2018, earning them the "back-to-back champions" label as 14 two of the seven wins occurred in years 2017 and 2018; and 15 WHEREAS, their play in the semifinals was very impressive 16 with the Lady Warriors defeating Jefferson Davis County in a 70-35 17 win, propelling the team to the finals for the third year in a

18 row; and

19 WHEREAS, the Lady Warriors finished their 2017-2018 season 20 with an outstanding 35-1 record, and the highest number of points 21 earned during a state championship; and

22 WHEREAS, passionately led by Coach Bill Smith, who stated 23 "This was the right time to be playing our best basketball... We 24 saw Independence come from being 12 points down in the semifinals 25 to winning. We knew they had a good team. We focused on playing 26 our game and took care of what we do."; and

27 WHEREAS, playing with full hearts, unimaginable fortitude and 28 grit, the Lady Warriors shot 53 percent from the floor, hitting 35 29 out of 66 shots, they also connected on 11 three-point shots, and 30 8 out of 10 shots from the free throw line; and

31 WHEREAS, the game against Independence was hard fought, as 32 the Lady Wildcats went up 6-0 in the first 40 seconds of play, but 33 as they bounced back with a pair of goals to make the score 6-5, 34 and at the break, Choctaw Central led 31-18, Choctaw Central 35 continued to build up its lead overtaking their opponents in the 36 end; and

37 WHEREAS, Kyarrah Grant led the Lady Warriors with 20 points 38 while Darien Tubby scored 17, Lachrisha Williams scored 15, 39 Kyannah Grant put in 13 and Kadre Denson scored 10 points; and 40 WHEREAS, Kyarrah and Kyannah Grant are twins on the team who 41 have now earned the honor of being chosen to play in the 42 Mississippi-Alabama all-star game; and
