1 2 3 4	A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER AND MERITORIOUS LEADERSHIP AND COMMUNITY SERVICE OF MR. JOE TROTTER DOCKINS AND EXTENDING TO HIM MOST SINCERE WISHES FOR CONTINUED SUCCESS IN ALL OF HIS FUTURE ENDEAVORS.
5	WHEREAS, Mr. Joe Trotter Dockins has devoted his life to
6	serving and improving the State of Mississippi through his
7	professional contributions as well as his incredibly extravagant
8	community service and philanthropy; and
9	WHEREAS, born in Starkville, Mississippi, on July 5, 1930, to
10	the late Mr. and Mrs. Mathew and Mary Frances Dockins, Joe learned
11	the value of a dollar as well as a strong work ethic at a very
12	early age, as he began working in his parents' grocery store,
13	which was in business for 37 years, at just five years old; and
14	WHEREAS, Joe also accepted Christ at an early age at Griffin
15	United Methodist Church in Starkville, and he joined Central
16	United Methodist Church in 1966, serving as President of Central
17	United Methodist Men from 1977 until 1993, Finance Committee
18	Chairperson from 1985 until 1987, past Vice President of the Usher
19	Board, as a member of the Pastor Parish Relations Committee, and

- 20 as a former Lay Leader, and to this day, he continues to be a
- 21 member of the Finance Committee and the Usher Board; and
- 22 WHEREAS, after he finished high school at Oktibbeha County
- 23 Training School, now Henderson Junior High School, Joe graduated
- 24 from Alcorn College, now Alcorn State University, with a bachelor
- of science degree in economics in May 1953; and
- 26 WHEREAS, while Joe was at Alcorn College, he became a member
- 27 of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., on December 16, 1950, and after
- 28 graduation, he became active with the Beta Alpha Chapter in
- 29 Jackson, Mississippi, where he served as Basileus from 1977 to
- 30 1979, received a plaque in 1976 for being the "Man of the Year"
- 31 for assisting in securing a fraternity house, earned his 40th,
- 32 50th and 60th year membership pins, and in 2016, he received a
- 33 Certificate of Life Membership and was inducted into the
- 34 Mississippi Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Hall of Fame; and
- 35 WHEREAS, unable to be intellectually satiated, Joe furthered
- 36 his education at Prairie View A&M University in Prairie View,
- 37 Texas, in 1953, and at the University of Wisconsin in Madison,
- 38 Wisconsin, in 1964, where he focused on the field of human
- 39 development and interpersonal relationship; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Joe's love and affection pierced the heart of the
- 41 late Mrs. Odelle D. Dockins, and the two lovebirds exchanged the
- 42 vows of holy matrimony, completing their family unit with the
- 43 addition of two children, Metric and JoAndrea, and lived in
- 44 marital bliss for 54 years until the passing of Mrs. Dockins; and

45	WHEREAS, in 1954, Joe began working as an associate county
46	agent for the Mississippi Agriculture Extension Services in
47	Louisville, Mississippi, and in 1965, he became an assistant
48	county supervisor for the Farmers Home Administration and was
49	promoted to county supervisor in 1981; and
50	WHEREAS, after 33 years of dedicated service, Joe decided to
51	retire in 1987, but the workforce kept calling his name, so he
52	began his second career with the Mississippi Action for Progress
53	as Director of Personnel in 1989, and in 2006 he punched his
54	retirement card again, but this time, it stuck and he retired as
55	the Safety Coordinator of Mississippi Action for Progress; and
56	WHEREAS, throughout his life, Joe has served as District
57	Marshal for the 7th District Meeting held in Jackson in 1984, as a
58	member of the Mississippi House of Representatives from 1989 until
59	1993, in his younger days, as a Boy Scout, and as a member of
60	several other elite civic and social clubs and organizations; and
61	WHEREAS, Mr. Joe Trotter Dockins is a man of incredible
62	stature and character, and his professional and community
63	contributions have served as a true inspiration to all those who
64	know and love him and has tremendously advanced the wonderful
65	State of Mississippi; and
66	WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
67	recognize and commend the magnificent contributions and
68	unparalleled community service that exceptional Mississippians
