HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 28

A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND

2 LEGACY OF MRS. ODELL GATEWOOD SAULTER WRIGHT. WHEREAS, it is written in Ecclesiastes 3:1 that "To 3 4 everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under the Heaven," and as such, on January 8, 2018, the immaculate 5 6 author and finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal 7 presence of dearly beloved, Mrs. Odell Gatewood Saulter Wright, to 8 eternal rest, rendering great sorrow and loss to her family and friends; and 9 10 WHEREAS, born on January 16, 1926, in Belzoni, Mississippi, 11 Odell spent her early years with her mother and sisters, learning 12 how to cook, making delectable jellies, baking scrumptious cakes, 13 sewing beautiful garments, playing intense card games, drawing beautiful pictures, and reading and writing riveting stories; and 14 WHEREAS, when she was 15 years old, Odell joined her sister, 15 16 Mary Alice, at Tougaloo Preparatory School to complete her high school education and was expected to complete her college degree 17 18 at Tougaloo College; however, after her freshman year, she decided

- 19 to enroll in Tennessee State University in Nashville, Tennessee,
- 20 to complete her degree; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Odell received more than just a degree while
- 22 attending Tennessee State University, she met and married the love
- 23 of her life, Mr. Benjamin Saulter of Cincinnati, Ohio, and after
- 24 graduation, Mr. and Mrs. Saulter moved to Cleveland, Mississippi,
- 25 where he became a band director at a local high school and she was
- 26 a homemaker; and
- 27 WHEREAS, after living in the Mississippi Delta for a number
- 28 of years, Mr. and Mrs. Saulter decided to move back to Mr.
- 29 Saulter's hometown, Cincinnati, and it was in Cincinnati that they
- 30 started their family, completing the family unit with the addition
- 31 of three boys, Benjamin, Harvey and David; and
- 32 WHEREAS, unfortunately, Mr. Saulter succumbed to sickle cell
- 33 anemia in 1970, and many years later, Odell met and married
- 34 Reverend Samuel Wright, and the two spent many blissful, loving
- 35 years together before his passing; and
- 36 WHEREAS, after much encouragement from her sisters, Mary
- 37 Alice Moman and Evelyn Banks, and due to the harsh Ohio winters,
- 38 Mrs. Wright moved back to the humid air and warm temperatures of
- 39 Mississippi, and after living with Mary Alice for a few years,
- 40 Mrs. Wright moved into Harmony Court, an assisted living facility;
- 41 and
- WHEREAS, during her stay at the facility, Mrs. Wright truly

43 put the "harmony" in Harmony Court, as she met no strangers, never

- 44 had a down day, and could often be found in the lobby, welcoming
- 45 guests with a million-watt smile and visiting, talking and
- 46 laughing with her friends, ultimately serving as a beacon of hope
- 47 and a ray of sunshine for all those who entered the facility; and
- WHEREAS, a strong, loving and compassionate wife, mother,
- 49 grandmother and friend, Mrs. Odell Gatewood Saulter Wright was the
- 50 epitome of class, beauty and grace, and through her kind, sincere
- 51 heart and undeniable energy, she touched the lives of all those
- 52 who crossed her tender and charming path, and her warm hugs and
- 53 bright smile will be forever cherished in the hearts and memories
- 54 of her family, friends, and others who knew her and experienced
- 55 her greatness; and
- 56 WHEREAS, the memory of Mrs. Wright, a woman held in the
- 57 highest regard by friends and family as an inspiring and precious
- 58 gift from God, will continue to refresh the hearts and memories of
- 59 her beloved survivors: her sons, Benjamin Saulter and David
- 60 Saulter; daughter-in-law, Sheri Saulter; sisters, Mary Alice Moman
- 61 and Evelyn Banks; and a host of grandchildren,
- 62 great-grandchildren, other relatives and friends; and
- 63 WHEREAS, we encourage the family to find solace from the
- 64 overwhelming sadness created by the earthly departure of their
- 65 beloved family member in Revelation 21:4, wherein is recorded,
- 66 "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there
- 67 shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall
- 68 there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away" and

- 69 renewed in their faith that Mrs. Wright fulfilled the commandment
- 70 of II Timothy 4:7 by having fought a good fight, finishing her
- 71 course and keeping the faith until the hour of her departure was
- 72 at hand; and
- 73 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 74 recognize and honor the lives of fine Mississippians, especially
- 75 those such as Mrs. Odell Gatewood Saulter Wright, a positive,
- 76 exceptional woman who always put others before herself and loved
- 77 her family and friends unconditionally, bringing glory and honor
- 78 to the State of Mississippi:
- 79 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 80 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 81 mourn the loss and commemorate the life and legacy of Mrs. Odell
- 82 Gatewood Saulter Wright, and express deepest sympathy to her
- 83 family and friends upon her passing.
