HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 35

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF MS. ARILLA 2 KERNEY AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER FAMILY AND FRIENDS 3 UPON HER PASSING.
