4	WHEREAS, Mrs. Elizabeth Richardson, a second-grade teacher a

- Hope Sullivan Elementary School in Southaven, Mississippi, who has 5
- a passion for teaching and a love for children, was named DeSoto 6
- County Schools Teacher of the Year in recognition of her hard work 7
- 8 and unwavering dedication to providing an excellent education to
- 9 her students; and
- WHEREAS, before coming to Hope Sullivan Elementary School in 10
- 11 2015, Mrs. Richardson and her family spent a year in the mission
- 12 field, serving the people of the small West African country of
- 13 Togo, which is located on a small strip of land located east of
- 14 Ghana and the Ivory Coast; and
- WHEREAS, during their stay in Togo, Mrs. Richardson and her 15
- 16 family worked to encourage and develop children's ministry
- programs in rural churches in which they were involved and they 17

- 18 also learned to make important connections across cultural and
- 19 language divides; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Mrs. Richardson noted that Togo is one of the
- 21 poorest countries in the world, but the people there are amazing
- 22 and they work unbelievably hard, and it was a completely humbling
- 23 experience, and she and her family worked with its citizens to
- 24 help develop a children's ministry because in West Africa the
- 25 majority of the churches are comprised of only women and children;
- 26 and
- 27 WHEREAS, with a background in teaching homeschool, preschool
- 28 and elementary school in various places, Mrs. Richardson said that
- 29 her time in Togo gave her a new perspective on life and she began
- 30 realizing the economic similarities between the citizens of Togo
- 31 and her students; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Mrs. Richardson stated that Hope Sullivan
- 33 Elementary School is a Title One School, and while she cannot
- 34 compare the economic situations of her students and that in Togo,
- 35 sometimes there are similar mindsets among people who are
- 36 struggling with poverty, and if one wants to build bridges to
- 37 those differences, it is important to remain humble and find ways
- 38 to connect to people and build relationships; and
- 39 WHEREAS, Mrs. Richardson has a tremendous passion for helping
- 40 her students grow and become productive citizens, and she remains
- 41 dedicated to her daily mission of teaching her second-grade class
- 42 by helping them comprehend the world around them with riveting

- 43 lessons and engaging discussions, and she continuously radiates
- 44 excellence, invigorates with her wisdom and inspires all of her
- 45 students to be the best they can be; and
- WHEREAS, because Mrs. Richardson strives daily to provide a
- 47 quality education and an inclusive environment where her students
- 48 can grow and nurture their individual talents and creative
- 49 abilities, and because of her innovative means to accomplish her
- 50 mission, she has been honored this year as the DeSoto County
- 51 Schools Teacher of the Year; and
- 52 WHEREAS, seeking to inspire her students to grow as a person,
- 53 Mrs. Richardson uses the letters of the word "GROW" on a daily
- 54 basis to remind her students to always make the right choices, and
- 55 with the first letters of "Give," "Respect," "Only" and "Work"
- 56 spelling the word "GROW," the students recite the motto, "I choose
- 57 to give my attention, respect and kindness, only do my best and
- 58 work without disrupting others. My life is like a journey, and
- 59 the smartest way to go is forward, not backward, bigger, not
- 60 smaller. I will choose to grow."; and
- 61 WHEREAS, other methods that Mrs. Richardson uses to connect
- 62 with students includes a regular visit every 10 days from a
- 63 character she calls the Queen of Ten and another character dressed
- 64 like a Rubik's Cube; and
- 65 WHEREAS, Mrs. Richardson further noted that Hope Sullivan
- 66 Elementary School provides an excellent education for its students
- 67 and it does everything it can to meet the students' needs and help

- 68 the students with the challenges they face, and the school
- 69 provides many programs and training opportunities that are
- 70 specific to the needs of that particular community; and
- 71 WHEREAS, outside of the classroom, Mrs. Richardson is devoted
- 72 to her husband, Ryan, who is also in education as a geometry
- 73 teacher at Southaven High School, and their three children, Marie,
- 74 Jonah and Aaron; and
- 75 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 76 recognize outstanding teachers such as Mrs. Elizabeth Richardson,
- 77 who selflessly strive to improve the well-being of children in
- 78 Mississippi and provide them with the skills necessary for them to
- 79 fulfill their greatest potential:
