| 4           | WHEREAS, becoming state champions for the second year in a  |
| 5           | row, the Starkville High School Yellow Jackets Girls Basketball   |
| 6           | Team reigned victorious at the MHSAA Class 6A State Championship,   |
| 7           | with a totally dominating 46-27 win against the Murrah High School  |
| 8           | Mustangs; and   |
| 9           | WHEREAS, during the championship game last year, Starkville   |
| 10          | lost to Olive Branch, but the title was later given to Starkville   |
| 11          | after it was discovered that Olive Branch had played an ineligible  |
| 12          | player during the game, and throughout the past year, the Yellow  |
| 13          | Jackets were tremendously motivated to win the championship   |
| 14          | outright; and   |
| 15          | WHEREAS, playing with full hearts and unimaginable amounts of   |
| 16          | finesse and determination, the Yellow Jackets rode the hot  |
| 17          | shooting of Kirsten Thompson and never trailed after their first  |

basket of the game thanks to a fast start, hustling on the boards

- 20 from the floor, held Murrah to 27 percent shooting and forced 18
- turnovers, including seven in the first quarter, which virtually 21

- 23 WHEREAS, a 10-0 run gave Starkville a 24-10 lead midway
- 24 through the second quarter, and Thompson had 12 points and had the
- answer offensively and defensively in the second half, and Murrah 25
- 26 stayed primarily with jump shots and rarely ventured inside; and
- 27 WHEREAS, the Mustangs struggled, particularly in the first
- 28 half, missing two of the five free throws they attempted and
- 29 turning the ball over 12 times without recording an assist, and
- 30 they were out-rebounded by 34-20, were outscored in every quarter
- 31 and were held to single-digit scoring in every frame; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Murrah came back after halftime down 24-12
- determined to even the game, but they never could get in rhythm 33
- 34 offensively, as Starkville put together a 9-2 run, stretched their
- 35 lead to 33-14 and cruised the rest of the way; and
- WHEREAS, Starkville's Jariya Covington finished the game with 36
- 37 11 points and a couple of steals, Tabreea Gandy had eight rebounds
- 38 and five assists and Kirsten Thompson led the Yellow Jackets with
- 39 21 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots; and
- 40 WHEREAS, after their championship win, the Yellow Jackets dog
- piled near their bench, chanting "Two times!" and Head Coach 41
- 42 Kristie Williams stated that she was proud of the team for winning
- the championship on the floor, especially the seniors, and she was 43
