## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 67

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE EAST RANKIN ACADEMY LADY PATRIOTS
  VARSITY BASKETBALL TEAM FOR WINNING THE MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF
  INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS (MAIS) AAAA DIVISION II STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND
  FOR THEIR TREMENDOUS PERSEVERANCE IN THE MIDST OF TRAGEDY.
- 5 WHEREAS, after a season of unimaginable loss and heartbreak,
- 6 the East Rankin Academy Lady Patriots Varsity Basketball Team
- 7 reigned victorious at the MAIS AAAA Division II State
- 8 Championship, displaying outstanding team spirit and true
- 9 perseverance in the face of overwhelming tragedy; and
- 10 WHEREAS, playing with full hearts and incredible amounts of
- 11 finesse and might, the Lady Patriots outplayed and ultimately
- 12 outlasted the Lamar School Lady Raiders, winning convincingly by a
- 13 score of 50-30; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the Lady Raiders struggled to get going offensively,
- 15 as the Lady Patriots stopped the dynamic inside 1-2 punch of
- 16 Lamar's Ambreah Waters and Debreasha Powers, and East Rankin's
- 17 Bailey Thompson knocked in 10 points to give the Lady Patriots a
- 18 16-12 lead at the end of the first quarter; and

19	WHEREAS, the Lady Raiders had a strong defensive performance,
20	but the Lady Patriots outscored them in the second quarter for a
21	22-17 halftime lead, and in the third quarter the Lady Patriots
22	outscored Lamar 16-4 to take command of the game at 38-21 going
23	into the fourth quarter, with Brooke Turnage scoring 9 points
24	inside, as the constant pounding of the ball by the Lady Patriots
25	took its toll on the Lady Raiders, who ultimately could not
26	overcome the Lady Patriots' suffocating defense and were outscored
27	12-9 in the final eight minutes; and
28	WHEREAS, with extraordinary strength through troubling times,
29	the Lady Patriots had a successful season in the wake of
30	tragically losing a dearly loved teammate on December 23, 2017,
31	when the Lady Patriots gathered for a Christmas party in Brandon,
32	Mississippi, and around midnight, sisters Brooke and Leah
33	Cunningham were involved in an automobile accident after they left
34	the party, with Leah passing away and Brooke spending numerous
35	weeks at both University of Mississippi Medical Center and
36	Methodist Rehabilitation before being released in February; and
37	WHEREAS, the Lady Patriots displayed tremendous character
38	after the heartbreak of losing their beloved teammate and friend,
39	and they stuck together as a team and held each other up as they
40	laid to rest their cherished teammate on December 27, and to honor
41	Leah during the championship game, the team wore a memorial patch
42	with her No. 14 on their jerseys and wore shooting shirts in her

44	WHEREAS, Head Coach Rod Delaney stated that the girls never
45	gave up and continued to honor their teammate by the way they
46	played the game, which made them true champions, and the Lady
47	Patriots showed tremendous strength of character not only by the
48	way they carried themselves as young women, but also by honoring
49	Leah during their first game after the accident by carrying out
50	her jersey and by carrying Leah and Brooke in their hearts
51	throughout the season; and
52	WHEREAS, the Lady Patriots were hit with another hardship
53	during their game at Copiah Academy on February 9, 2018, when a
54	father of one of the players on the boys team, Mr. Stokes, passed
55	out in the bathroom and was resuscitated by Lee Dawkins, another
56	East Rankin parent, and to ensure that proper care was given to
57	Mr. Stokes, the game was paused several times, and once again, the
58	girls displayed the heart of champions as they gathered together
59	as a team and lifted up Mr. Stokes in prayer; and
60	WHEREAS, true champions are made and molded during trying
61	times of adversity, and through their exceptional devotion to the
62	team and their outstanding determination in the midst of
63	unimaginable hardship, these young ladies truly deserve the title
64	of champions; and
65	WHEREAS, the Lady Patriots finished their outstanding season
66	with a 29-6 record, and the key to their success this season was
67	the exceptional dedication and tremendous team spirit by the
