HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 72

A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND 1 2 MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF DR. ALFIO RAUSA, M.D., AND EXPRESSING 3 DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING. 4 WHEREAS, it is written in Ecclesiastes 3:1 that "To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under 5 the Heaven," and as such, on January 3, 2018, the immaculate 6 author and finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal 7 presence of dearly beloved, Dr. Alfio Rausa, M.D., to eternal 8 9 rest, rendering great sorrow and loss to his family, friends and 10 community; and

11 WHEREAS, Dr. Rausa, the son of first-generation immigrants 12 from Sicily, Italy, was raised in The Bronx, New York, and after 13 graduating from Hunter College he returned to his roots and 14 attended medical school in Italy, and once he received his medical 15 degree, he married his fiancé Sylvanna, and purchased a one-way 16 ticket to America and never went back; and

17 WHEREAS, he originally moved to Greenwood, Mississippi, as a18 Lieutenant Commander with the United States Public Health Service

19 Commissioned Corps, a position he held from 1966 until 1970, and 20 his intention was to stay for only a year, but he decided to stay 21 once he realized all the work that needed to be done in 22 Mississippi; and

23 WHEREAS, from a young age, Dr. Rausa had a habit of serving 24 others each and every day, and he devoted his life to helping 25 humanity, and once he was introduced to the issues that the 26 Mississippi Delta was facing, he was determined to make a 27 substantial difference; and

28 WHEREAS, following his two years in the Delta, the Public 29 Health Service sent him to one of the most prestigious public 30 health schools in the country, Columbia School of Public Health, 31 where the primary focus of education was the fundamental 32 philosophies of life and public health and the management of those 33 concepts; and

34 WHEREAS, in 1970, Dr. Rausa accepted a position as Regional 35 Public Health Officer in Greenwood with the Mississippi State 36 Department of Health, and in 1980 he was promoted to District 37 Health Officer in charge of Public Health District III and later 38 District I as well, and he held this position until he retired in 39 2017; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Rausa also served as the medical consultant for WIC and its breastfeeding peer counselor program, and he always encouraged the peer counselors and was always willing to speak with other physicians, the media, at hospitals or events; and

52 WHEREAS, Dr. Rausa was an eccentric genius, a born leader, 53 an intellectual giant and a creative social engineer, and his 54 insight and compassion for people was boundless, and he was 55 tremendously driven, accomplishing something new each day; and

56 WHEREAS, a bouncing ball of boundless energy, Dr. Rausa was 57 an idea factory, but more than that, he was an inventor of the 58 machinery that made his abstract ideas come to life, and his 59 ability to attract and inspire others across all intellectual and 60 social lines to the same vision and goal was one of his many 61 unique gifts; and

WHEREAS, with an uncommon insight into the world, Dr. Rausa was passionate, eloquent and fearless, and he was a physician who had insight and a unique ability to formulate solutions to problems, was a man of honor and integrity, and gave his life to helping others and made an indelible impression on the lives of those he touched and he will forever be cherished; and
