- 19 years later she married Reverend Johnson Bland; and
- 20 WHEREAS, a God-fearing Christian before all other roles she
- 21 assumed, a devoted wife and nurturing mother, grandmother,
- 22 great-grandmother and great-great-grandmother, Mrs. Bland is the
- 23 living embodiment of a woman of Proverbs 31:10 distinction and she
- 24 possesses the ambitious spirit akin to that of King David, being
- 25 a woman after God's own heart, committed to her faith, her family
- 26 and her friends, and as an upstanding pillar of the community,
- 27 Mrs. Bland is a faithful member of Antioch Baptist Church where
- 28 she has diligently served as a Sunday School teacher, mentor to
- 29 the youth and member of the choir, and she played the piano for
- 30 Sunday School and trained young people to be ushers, youth leaders
- 31 and respectable citizens; and
- 32 WHEREAS, throughout her long life, Mrs. Bland has done her
- 33 best to spread God's love and peace everywhere she goes, and she
- 34 is tremendously proud that God has always been, and will always
- 35 be, the leader of her life, and she attributes her good health,
- 36 long life and success to her faith in God; and
- 37 WHEREAS, Mrs. Bland hopes that she leaves behind an
- 38 exceptional legacy as an example of someone who achieved success
- 39 by being focused, setting and pursuing goals, and most
- 40 importantly, by believing in God, and her central moral compass
- 41 echoes the heart of the Good Samaritan and her core ethical values

- 51 the Smucker's Jelly Jar; and
- 52 WHEREAS, having lived through two centuries and witnessed the
- 53 many changes that have occurred in our nation, Mrs. Bland has seen
- 54 America change from an agrarian society to an advanced industrial
- 55 and technological giant, and she has lived during the terms of 27
- 56 Mississippi Governors and 18 United States Presidents, including
- 57 the inauguration of President Barack Obama, our nation's first
- 58 African-American president; and
- 59 WHEREAS, in 2014, Mrs. Bland was honored as Antioch Baptist
- 60 Church's "Mother of the Year," and her many friends consider her a
- 61 pillar of strength because her life symbolizes hope and success,
- 62 not only for a college educated person, but also for a person
- 63 without a college education; and
- WHEREAS, blessed with 15 grandchildren, 11
- 65 great-grandchildren and 12 great-great-grandchildren, Mrs. Bland
- 66 is the matriarch of her family dynasty and remains the archetype

- 67 icon and central foundation of a family that retains an
- 68 unbreakable bond of love, honor, devotion, commitment and
- 69 encouragement for each generation; and
- 70 WHEREAS, at 105 years old, Mrs. Bland continues to be a
- 71 blessing to others through her encouraging nature and wise
- 72 counsel, and continues to live an active life, spending time with
- 73 her family, serving her church and enjoying the company of her
- 74 countless friends, and she shares her positive attitude and
- 75 optimistic outlook on life, while crediting the gift of her good
- 76 health, longevity and success to her unwavering faith in God; and
- 77 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 78 commend fine Mississippians, especially those such as Mrs. Louise
- 79 Collins Bell Bland, whose faith in God, devotion to her family and
- 80 dedication to her church bring honor to her family, her community
