SENATE BILL NO. 2043

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 35-3-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE THE LANGUAGE PROHIBITING COUNTY VETERAN SERVICE OFFICERS FROM HOLDING ANY OTHER ELECTIVE OR APPOINTIVE POSITION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 35-3-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 35-3-21. In order to maintain offices and pay personnel for
- 9 the purpose of assisting all residents of the State of Mississippi
- 10 who served in the military or naval forces of the United States
- 11 during any war, their relatives, beneficiaries or dependents, to
- 12 receive from the United States any and all compensation,
- 13 hospitalization, insurance or other aid or benefits to which they
- 14 may be entitled under existing or hereafter enacted laws of the
- 15 United States, the boards of supervisors in the various counties
- 16 in the state are hereby authorized and empowered, in their
- 17 discretion, to expend out of the general county fund, or special
- 18 veterans' fund herein authorized to be set up, or from both of

- such funds, such monies necessary to defray the office operating expenses and salary of the county veteran service officers.
- 21 Two (2) or more counties may, upon resolution duly adopted by
- 22 the board of supervisors of each of such counties, agree to
- 23 establish one (1) veteran service office for all of such counties.
- 24 When two (2) or more counties enter into such an agreement, each
- 25 county shall pay such amount mutually agreed upon and duly adopted
- 26 by resolution of the respective boards of supervisors.
- 27 County veteran service officers shall be (a) honorably
- 28 discharged or honorably released veterans of any war or police
- 29 action in which the Armed Forces of the United States have been,
- 30 are or shall be committed for action; (b) the surviving spouse or
- 31 child of any such deceased veteran; or (c) any person employed as
- 32 a county veteran service officer in any county of this state on
- 33 March 30, 1990. From and after July 1, 1990, county veteran
- 34 service officers shall be certified by the Mississippi State
- 35 Veterans' Affairs Board which, among any other criteria it may
- 36 establish, shall require such officers to (a) attend at least one
- 37 (1) of the two (2) annual training programs provided for such
- 38 officers and (b) successfully complete a written examination each
- 39 year on the duties and responsibilities of and assistance
- 40 available to such officers and veterans. The programs shall be
- 41 developed by the State Veterans' Affairs Board. The program shall
- 42 include a period of instruction which shall be not more than three
- 43 (3) days for veteran service officers receiving initial

44	certification,	and n	not more	than	two	(2)	days	s for	veteran	service

- 45 officers being recertified. County veteran service officers who
- 46 annually receive and complete such instruction in a manner
- 47 satisfactory to the Veterans' Affairs Board and in accordance with
- 48 this section shall be certified by the board. No county veteran
- 49 service officer shall be entitled to receive any compensation for
- 50 his services, to which he is otherwise entitled by law, unless he
- 51 is annually certified by the board.
- 52 County veteran service officers may be employed, in the
- 53 discretion of the boards of supervisors, either full time or part
- 54 time * * *.
- 55 The boards of supervisors of the various counties are further
- 56 authorized and empowered to pay all necessary and actual expenses
- 57 of county veteran service officers who attend a school of
- 58 instruction within the State of Mississippi for such county
- 59 veteran service officers.
- It shall also be the duty of the boards of supervisors to aid
- 61 the United States to defeat all unjust claims for aid or benefit
- 62 therefrom.
- 63 Such expenditures may be made by the several counties acting
- 64 alone, or in cooperation with other counties, and in cooperation
- 65 with any federal or state agency carrying out such purposes.
- In the event that the general revenues of the county levied
- 67 under and within the limits of existing taxing statutes are not
- 68 sufficient to pay the expenses authorized herein, the board of

- 69 supervisors may, in its discretion, levy an additional tax not to
- 70 exceed one (1) mill on all taxable property in the county to
- 71 defray such expenses or any part thereof. Any tax levy made under
- 72 authority of this chapter shall not be considered in refunding
- 73 homestead exemption losses under Title 27, Chapter 33, Mississippi
- 74 Code of 1972.
- 75 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 76 and after July 1, 2018.
