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SENATE BILL NO. 2059

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT A CHILD WILL BE EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENT TO HAVE ANY SPECIFIC VACCINATION IN ORDER TO ATTEND A SCHOOL IF THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN SUBMITS TO THE SCHOOL A LETTER OR 5 AFFIDAVIT THAT DOCUMENTS WHICH REQUIRED VACCINATIONS HAVE BEEN 6 GIVEN, AND WHICH VACCINATIONS HAVE NOT BEEN GIVEN ON THE BASIS 7 THAT THEY ARE CONTRARY TO HIS OR HER PHILOSOPHICAL OR RELIGIOUS 8 BELIEFS; TO PRESCRIBE THE CONTENT TO BE INCLUDED IN THE LETTER OR 9 AFFIDAVIT SUBMITTED TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR SCHOOL OF 10 ENROLLMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer 14 15 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 16 17 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. (2) Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful for 18 any child to attend any school, kindergarten or similar type 19 facility intended for the instruction of children (hereinafter 20 called "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of 21 22 any legitimate home instruction program as defined in Section

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- 23 37-13-91, * * * for ten (10) or * * * $\underline{\text{fewer}}$ children who are
- 24 related within the third degree computed according to the civil
- 25 law to the operator, unless they * * * first have been vaccinated
- 26 against those diseases specified by the State Health Officer have
- 27 submitted a letter from a licensed physician specifying exemption
- 28 for medical purposes, or have submitted to the school a letter
- 29 from a parent or legal guardian explaining, in specificity, the
- 30 personal and philosophical aversion to vaccinations.
- 31 (3) A * * * letter of exemption from vaccination for medical
- 32 reasons may be offered on behalf of a child by a duly licensed
- 33 physician in any state and written on the stationary of that
- 34 physician may be accepted by the local health officer when, in his
- opinion, * * * is contraindicated for medical reasons and that the
- 36 exemption will not cause undue risk to the community.
- 37 (4) (a) No child seeking to attend any school shall be
- 38 required to comply with the requirements of this section for any
- 39 specific vaccination in order to attend the school if the parent
- 40 or guardian or adult who has assumed responsibility for the
- 41 child's care and custody in the case of a minor, or the child
- 42 seeking admission if an emancipated minor, submits to the school a
- 43 letter or affidavit that documents which required vaccinations
- 44 have been given, and which vaccinations have not been given on the
- 45 basis that they are contrary to his or her religious or
- 46 philosophical beliefs.



4'/	(b) The parent or guardian or adult who has assumed
48	responsibility for the child's care and custody in the case of a
49	minor, or the child seeking admission if an emancipated minor,
50	shall submit a letter to the school district or school of
51	enrollment specifically stating the reasons for the philosophical
52	and religious exemption from vaccinations sought in addition to a
53	statement as to whether the aversion is to some or all
54	vaccinations. The letter or affidavit submitted shall also
55	include, but not be limited to, the following:
56	(i) A statement that the parent or guardian who
57	has assumed responsibility for the child's care and custody, in
58	the case of a minor, or the child seeking admission if an
59	emancipated minor, has been informed by a health care practitioner
60	and school district regarding the risks and benefits of receiving
61	vaccinations or not receiving vaccinations; and
62	(ii) A statement of understanding that:
63	1. At the discretion of the State Department
64	of Health or local health officer, the unimmunized child or
65	individual may be removed from day care or school during an
66	outbreak if the child or individual is not fully vaccinated; and
67	2. The child or individual shall not return
68	to school until the outbreak has been resolved and the State
69	Department of Health or local health officer approves the return
70	to school.

- 71 (5) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local
- 72 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the
- 73 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only
- 74 acceptable means for showing compliance with these immunization
- 75 requirements, and the responsible school officials shall file the
- 76 form with the child's record.
- 77 (6) If a child * * * who is not exempt under subsection (3)
- 78 or (4) of this section offers to enroll at a school without having
- 79 completed the required vaccinations, the local health officer may
- 80 grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for such completion
- 81 when, in the opinion of the health officer, such delay will not
- 82 cause undue risk to the child, the school or the community. No
- 83 child shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1) dose
- 84 of each specified vaccine.
- 85 (7) Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall
- 86 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in
- 87 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health
- 88 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of
- 89 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both,
- 90 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing
- 91 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination
- 92 by reason for such exemption.
- 93 (8) Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening
- 94 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge
- 95 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer

- 96 that all children enrolled who are not exempt under subsection (3)
- 97 or (4) of this section are in compliance with immunization
- 98 requirements.
- 99 (9) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the
- 100 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or
- 101 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished
- 102 certificates of immunization compliance by the school.
- 103 (10) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge
- 104 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization. Any
- 105 child not exempt under subsection (3) or (4) of this section is
- 106 not in compliance at the end of ninety (90) days from the opening
- 107 of the fall term must be suspended until in compliance, unless the
- 108 health officer * * * attributes the delay to lack of supply of
- 109 vaccine or some other such factor clearly making compliance
- impossible.
- 111 (11) Failure to enforce provisions of this section shall
- 112 constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction be punishable by fine
- 113 or imprisonment or both.
- 114 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 115 and after July 1, 2018.
