SENATE BILL NO. 2092

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-61-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE ADMINISTRATIVE LIMIT ON BUDGET EXPENDITURES IN EACH 3 SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR CERTAIN ADMINISTRATION COSTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5

SECTION 1. Section 37-61-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

amended as follows:

- 37-61-9. (1) On or before the fifteenth day of August of 8
- 9 each year, the local school board of each school district, with
- 10 the assistance of the superintendent of schools, shall prepare and
- file with the levying authority for the school district, as 11
- 12 defined in Section 37-57-1, at least two (2) copies of a budget of
- estimated expenditures for the support, maintenance and operation 13
- 14 of the public schools of the school district for the fiscal year
- commencing on July 1 of such year. Such budget shall be prepared 15
- on forms prescribed and provided by the State Auditor and shall 16
- 17 contain such information as the State Auditor may require.

- (2) In addition, on or before the fifteenth day of August of 18
- each year, the local school board of each school district, with 19

- 20 the assistance of the superintendent of schools, shall prepare and
- 21 file with the State Department of Education such budgetary
- 22 information as the State Board of Education may require. The
- 23 State Board of Education shall prescribe and provide forms to each
- 24 school district for this purpose.
- 25 (3) Prior to the adoption of a budget pursuant to this
- 26 section, the school board of each school district shall hold at
- 27 least one (1) public hearing to provide the general public with an
- 28 opportunity to comment on the taxing and spending plan
- 29 incorporated in the proposed budget. The public hearing shall be
- 30 held at least one (1) week prior to the adoption of the budget
- 31 with advance notice. After final adoption of the budget, a
- 32 synopsis of such budget in a form prescribed by the State
- 33 Department of Audit shall be published in a newspaper having
- 34 general circulation in the school district on a date different
- 35 from the date on which the county or any municipality therein may
- 36 publish its budget.
- 37 (4) There shall be imposed limitations on budgeted
- 38 expenditures in each school district for certain administration
- 39 costs, as defined hereinafter, in an amount not greater than One
- 40 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) plus four percent
- 41 (4%) of the expenditures \star \star each year. For purposes of this
- 42 subsection, "administration costs" shall be defined as
- 43 expenditures for salaries and fringe benefits paid for central
- 44 administration costs from all sources of revenue, excluding

45	federal funds, in the following expenditure functions as defined
46	in the MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING

48	2300 = Support Services - General Administration
49	2310 = Board of Education Services
50	2320 = Executive Administration Services
51	2330 = Special Area Administration Services
52	2500 = Business Services
53	2510 = Fiscal Services
54	2520 = Purchasing Services
55	2530 = Warehousing and Distributing Services
56	2540 = Printing, Publishing and Duplicating Services
57	2590 = Other Support Services - Business
58	Any costs classified as "administration costs" for purposes
59	of this subsection which can be demonstrated by the local school
60	district to be an expenditure that results in a net cost savings
61	to the district that may otherwise require budget expenditures for
62	functions not covered under the definition of administration costs
63	herein may be excluded from the limitations imposed herein. The
64	local school board shall make a specific finding of such costs and
65	spread such finding upon its minutes, which shall be subject to
66	the approval of the Office of Educational Accountability of the
67	State Department of Education. Any school district required to
68	make expenditure cuts, as a result of application of this
69	subsection, shall not be required to reduce such expenditures more

- 70 than twenty-five percent (25%) in any year in order to comply with
- 71 this mandate.
- 72 The State Auditor shall ensure that functions in all
- 73 expenditure categories to which this administrative limitation
- 74 applies shall be properly classified.
- 75 This section shall not apply to central administration with
- 76 five (5) or less full-time employees, or to those school districts
- 77 which can substantiate that comparable reductions have occurred in
- 78 administrative costs for the five-year period immediately prior to
- 79 school year 1993-1994. In the event the application of this
- 80 section may jeopardize the fiscal integrity or operations of the
- 81 school district, have an adverse impact on the ability of the
- 82 district to deliver educational services, or otherwise restrict
- 83 the district from achieving or maintaining a quality education
- 84 program, the State Board of Education shall be authorized to
- 85 exempt the application of this section to such school district
- 86 pursuant to rules and regulations of the State Board of Education
- 87 consistent with the intent of this section.
- 88 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 89 and after July 1, 2018.
