- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-61-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 37-61-33. (1) There is created within the State Treasury a
- 9 special fund to be designated the "Education Enhancement Fund"
- 10 into which shall be deposited all the revenues collected pursuant
- 11 to Sections 27-65-75(7) and (8) and 27-67-31(a) and (b).
- 12 (2) Of the amount deposited into the Education Enhancement
- 13 Fund, Sixteen Million Dollars (\$16,000,000.00) shall be
- 14 appropriated each fiscal year to the State Department of Education
- 15 to be distributed to all school districts. Such money shall be
- 16 distributed to all school districts in the proportion that the
- 17 average daily attendance of each school district bears to the
- 18 average daily attendance of all school districts within the state
- 19 for the following purposes:

- 20 Purchasing, erecting, repairing, equipping,
- 21 remodeling and enlarging school buildings and related facilities,
- 22 including gymnasiums, auditoriums, lunchrooms, vocational training
- 23 buildings, libraries, teachers' homes, school barns,
- 24 transportation vehicles (which shall include new and used
- 25 transportation vehicles) and garages for transportation vehicles,
- and purchasing land therefor. 26
- Establishing and equipping school athletic fields 27 (b)
- 28 and necessary facilities connected therewith, and purchasing land
- 29 therefor.
- 30 (C) Providing necessary water, light, heating,
- air-conditioning and sewerage facilities for school buildings, and 31
- 32 purchasing land therefor.
- 33 As a pledge to pay all or a portion of the debt
- service on debt issued by the school district under Sections 34
- 35 37-59-1 through 37-59-45, 37-59-101 through 37-59-115, 37-7-351
- 36 through 37-7-359, 37-41-89 through 37-41-99, 37-7-301, 37-7-302
- and 37-41-81, or debt issued by boards of supervisors for 37
- 38 agricultural high schools pursuant to Section 37-27-65, if such
- 39 pledge is accomplished pursuant to a written contract or
- 40 resolution approved and spread upon the minutes of an official
- meeting of the district's school board or board of supervisors. 41
- The annual grant to such district in any subsequent year during 42
- 43 the term of the resolution or contract shall not be reduced below
- an amount equal to the district's grant amount for the year in 44

- 45 which the contract or resolution was adopted. The intent of this
- 46 provision is to allow school districts to irrevocably pledge a
- 47 certain, constant stream of revenue as security for long-term
- 48 obligations issued under the code sections enumerated in this
- 49 paragraph or as otherwise allowed by law. It is the intent of the
- 50 Legislature that the provisions of this paragraph shall be
- 51 cumulative and supplemental to any existing funding programs or
- 52 other authority conferred upon school districts or school boards.
- 53 Debt of a district secured by a pledge of sales tax revenue
- 54 pursuant to this paragraph shall not be subject to any debt
- 55 limitation contained in the foregoing enumerated code sections.
- 56 (3) The remainder of the money deposited into the Education
- 57 Enhancement Fund shall be appropriated as follows:
- 58 (a) To the State Department of Education as follows:
- 59 (i) Sixteen and sixty-one one-hundredths percent
- 60 (16.61%) to the cost of the adequate education program determined
- 61 under Section 37-151-7; of the funds generated by the percentage
- 62 set forth in this section for the support of the adequate
- 63 education program, one and one hundred seventy-eight
- one-thousandths percent (1.178%) of the funds shall be
- 65 appropriated to be used by the State Department of Education for
- 66 the purchase of textbooks to be loaned under Sections 37-43-1
- 67 through 37-43-59 to approved nonpublic schools, as described in
- 68 Section 37-43-1. The funds to be distributed to each nonpublic
- 69 school shall be in the proportion that the average daily

- 70 attendance of each nonpublic school bears to the total average
- 71 daily attendance of all nonpublic schools;
- 72 (ii) Seven and ninety-seven one-hundredths percent
- 73 (7.97%) to assist the funding of transportation operations and
- 74 maintenance pursuant to Section 37-19-23; and
- 75 (iii) Nine and sixty-one one-hundredths percent
- 76 (9.61%) for classroom supplies, instructional materials and
- 77 equipment, including computers and computer software, to be
- 78 distributed to all eligible teachers within the state through the
- 79 use of procurement cards. Classroom supply funds shall not be
- 80 expended for administrative purposes. On or before September 1 of
- 81 each year, local school districts shall determine and submit to
- 82 the State Department of Education the number of teachers eligible
- 83 to receive an allocation for the current year. For purposes of
- 84 this subparagraph, "teacher" means any employee of the school
- 85 board of a school district, or the Mississippi School for the
- 86 Arts, the Mississippi School for Math and Science, the Mississippi
- 87 School for the Blind or the Mississippi School for the Deaf, who
- 88 is required by law to obtain a teacher's license from the State
- 89 Department of Education and who is assigned to an instructional
- 90 area of work as defined by the department * * *. It is the intent
- 91 of the Legislature that all classroom teachers shall utilize these
- 92 funds in a manner that addresses individual classroom needs and
- 93 supports the overall goals of the school regarding supplies,
- 94 instructional materials, equipment, computers or computer software

95	under the provisions of this subparagraph, including the type,
96	quantity and quality of such supplies, materials and equipment.
97	Classroom supply funds allocated under this subparagraph shall
98	supplement, not replace, other local and state funds available for
99	the same purposes. The State Board of Education shall develop and
100	promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this
101	subparagraph consistent with the above criteria, with particular
102	emphasis on allowing the individual teachers to expend funds as
103	they deem appropriate. Effective with the 2013-2014 school year,
104	the local school board shall require each school to issue
105	procurement cards provided by the Department of Finance and
106	Administration under the provisions of Section 31-7-9(1)(c) for
107	the use of teachers and necessary support personnel in making
108	instructional supply fund expenditures under this section,
109	consistent with the regulations of the Mississippi Department of
110	Finance and Administration pursuant to Section 31-7-9. Such
111	procurement cards shall be issued at the beginning of the school
112	year and shall be issued in equal amounts per teacher determined
113	by the total number of qualifying personnel and the current state
114	appropriation for classroom supplies with the Education
115	Enhancement Fund. Such cards will expire on a pre-determined date
116	at the end of each school year. All unexpended amounts will be
117	carried forward, combined with the following year's allocation of
118	Education Enhancement Fund instructional supplies funds and
119	reallocated for the following year;

120	(b) Twenty-two and nine one-hundredths percent (22.09%)
121	to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning
122	for the purpose of supporting institutions of higher learning; and
123	(c) Fourteen and forty-one one-hundredths percent

- 124 (14.41%) to the Mississippi Community College Board for the 125 purpose of providing support to community and junior colleges.
- 126 (4) The amount remaining in the Education Enhancement Fund 127 after funds are distributed as provided in subsections (2) and (3) 128 of this section shall be disbursed as follows:
 - (a) Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) shall be deposited into the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund created pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), until the balance in such fund reaches the maximum balance of seven and one-half percent (7-1/2%) of the General Fund appropriations in the appropriate fiscal year. After the maximum balance in the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund is reached, such money shall remain in the Education Enhancement Fund to be appropriated in the manner provided for in paragraph (b) of this subsection.
- 138 (b) The remainder shall be appropriated for other 139 educational needs.
- (5) None of the funds appropriated pursuant to subsection
 (3) (a) of this section shall be used to reduce the state's General
 Fund appropriation for the categories listed in an amount below
 the following amounts:

- 147 (b) For the aggregate of minimum program allotments in
- 148 the 1997 fiscal year, formerly provided for in Chapter 19, Title
- 149 37, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, excluding those funds
- 150 for transportation as provided for in paragraph (a) of this
- 151 subsection.
- 152 (6) Any funds appropriated from the Education Enhancement
- 153 Fund that are unexpended at the end of a fiscal year shall lapse
- 154 into the Education Enhancement Fund, except as otherwise provided
- in subsection (3)(a)(iii) of this section.
- 156 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 157 and after July 1, 2018.
