- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-15-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE PROHIBITION AGAINST HUNTING ON ANY STREET, PUBLIC
- 3 ROAD, PUBLIC HIGHWAY, LEVEE, OR RAILROAD; AND FOR RELATED
- 4 PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 97-15-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 97-15-13. * * * (* * *1) For purposes of this section, the
- 9 following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them herein:
- 10 (a) "Right-of-way" means that part of a street, public
- 11 road, public highway, levee or railroad maintained by a city,
- 12 county, levee board, state or federal entity or railroad
- 13 corporation and including that portion up to the adjacent property
- 14 line or fence line.
- 15 * * *
- 16 (* * *b) "Firearm" means any firearm other than a
- 17 handgun.

18 (\star \star \star <u>c</u>) "Hunt" or "hunting" means to hunt or chase or

19 to shoot at or kill \star \star \star or wound any wild animal or wild bird

20 with a firearm as defined in this subsection.

- 22 (* * *2) If any person hunts with a firearm on his or her
- 23 person or discharges any firearm in, on or across any street,
- 24 public road, public highway, levee, railroad or the right-of-way
- 25 thereof, such person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
- 26 conviction, shall be punished by a fine not less than One Hundred
- 27 Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or
- 28 by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than sixty (60)
- 29 days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and
- 30 imprisonment. This subsection shall not apply to any law
- 31 enforcement officer while in the performance of his official duty
- 32 or to any person engaged in a lawful action of self-defense. It
- 33 shall not be a violation of this section to lawfully be in
- 34 possession of a firearm in a motor vehicle, or to ingress or
- 35 egress from a motor vehicle parked on a right-of-way to lawfully
- 36 access a site off the right-of-way or return from a lawfully
- 37 accessed site off the right-of-way.
- 38 (* * *3) If any person shall willfully shoot any firearms
- 39 or hurl any missile at any street, highway or railroad traffic
- 40 light; street, highway or railroad marker or other sign for the
- 41 regulation or designation of street, highway or railroad travel,
- 42 such person, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One

- 43 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars
- 44 (\$500.00), or be imprisoned not longer than thirty (30) days in
- 45 the county jail, or both.
- 46 (* * *4) It shall be the duty of all sheriffs, deputy
- 47 sheriffs, constables, conservation officers and peace officers of
- 48 this state to enforce the provisions of this section.
- (* * *5) If any subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause,
- 50 phrase or any part of this section is hereafter declared to be
- 51 unconstitutional or void, or if for any reason is declared to be
- 52 invalid or of no effect, the remaining subsections, paragraphs,
- 53 sentences, clauses, phrases or parts thereof shall be in no manner
- 54 affected thereby but shall remain in full force and effect.
- 55 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 56 and after July 1, 2018.
