COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2474

1 AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 45-49-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 2 1972, TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI COMPANION ANIMAL ABUSE REGISTRY 3 ACT TO APPLY TO DOMESTICATED DOGS AND CATS; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 45-49-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ENACT DEFINITIONS; TO CREATE 4 NEW SECTION 45-49-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE CREATION 5 6 OF AN ONLINE REGISTRY OF OFFENDERS; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 45-49-7, 7 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW THE PROMULGATION OF RULES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

10 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section

11 45-49-1, Mississippi Code of 1972:

12 45-49-1. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the

"Mississippi Companion Animal Abuser Registration Act." 13

SECTION 2. The following shall be codified as Section 14

- 45-49-3, Mississippi Code of 1972: 15
- 16 45-49-3. As used in this chapter:
- 17 "Abuser" or "animal abuser" means a person who has (a)

been convicted in this state of committing an animal abuse offense 18

- 19 against a companion animal;
- 20 (b) "Animal" means a companion animal that is a
- 21 domesticated dog or cat that comes within the purview of the

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22 Mississippi Dog and Cat Pet Protection Law of 2011, Section 23 97-41-16;

"Animal abuse offense" means: 24 (C) 25 (i) Cruelty to a domesticated dog or cat under 26 Section 97-41-16; 27 (ii) Animal fighting under either Section 97-41-18, which prohibits fighting between canines and hogs, or 28 Section 97-41-19, which prohibits dog fights; and 29 30 Injury or killing of a public service animal (iii) under Section 97-41-23; 31 "Companion animal" means any dog, defined as any 32 (d) live dog of the species Canis familiaris, or cat, defined as any 33

34 live cat of the species Felis catus, and does not include any 35 animal other than domesticated dogs and cats;

(e) "Conviction" means a judgment entered by a
Mississippi court upon a plea of guilty, a plea of nolo
contendere, or a finding of guilt by a jury or the court,
notwithstanding any pending appeal or habeas corpus proceeding
arising from the judgment. "Conviction" includes a disposition of
pretrial diversion or nonadjudication under Section 99-15-26;
SECTION 3. The following shall be codified as Section

43 45-49-5, Mississippi Code of 1972:

44 <u>45-49-5.</u> (1) The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation shall
45 post a publicly accessible list on its website of any person
46 convicted of an animal abuse offense on or after January 1, 2019.

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(2) (a) The list shall include a photograph taken of the
convicted animal abuser as part of the booking process, the animal
abuser's full legal name, and other identifying data as the
Mississippi Bureau of Investigation determines is necessary to
properly identify the animal abuser and to exclude innocent
persons.

53 (b) The list shall not include the abuser's social 54 security number, driver's license number, or any other state or 55 federal identification number.

56 (3) Every clerk of court shall forward a copy of the 57 judgment and date of birth of all persons convicted of an animal 58 abuse offense to the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation within 59 sixty (60) calendar days of the date of judgment.

60 Upon a person's first conviction for an animal (4) (a) 61 abuse offense, the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation shall 62 maintain the person's name and other identifying information, 63 described in subsection (2) of this section, on the list published 64 under subsection (1) of this section for ten (10) years following 65 the date of conviction, after which time the Mississippi Bureau of 66 Investigation shall remove the person's name and identifying 67 information from the list if the person is not convicted of 68 another animal abuse offense during that ten-year period.

(b) Upon a person's subsequent conviction for an animal
abuse offense, the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation shall
maintain the person's name and other identifying information,

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72 described in subsection (2) of this section, on the list published 73 under subsection (1) of this section permanently.

(5) The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation shall remove the person's name and identifying information from the registry list if the sole offense for which the person is required to be subject to the mandates of the registry is expunged under Section 99-19-71.

79 SECTION 4. The following shall be codified as Section 80 45-49-7, Mississippi Code of 1972:

81 <u>45-49-7.</u> The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation may 82 promulgate rules to effectuate the purposes of this chapter. The 83 rules shall be promulgated in accordance with the Mississippi 84 Administrative Procedures Law, Chapter 43, Title 25, Mississippi 85 Code of 1972.

86 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 87 and after January 1, 2019, and shall stand repealed from and after 88 December 31, 2018.
