COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2596

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 83-39-3, 83-39-7 AND 83-39-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS OF BAIL BONDSMEN; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 83-39-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE AMOUNT OF QUALIFICATION 5 BOND REQUIRED TO BE POSTED BY A PROFESSIONAL BAIL AGENT; TO AMEND 6 REENACTED SECTION 83-39-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE 7 THAT INFORMATION IN THE BAIL BOND DATABASE SHALL NOT BE THE BASIS FOR RESTRICTIONS ON THE AMOUNT OF BONDS A PROFESSIONAL BAIL AGENT 8 9 MAY HAVE OUTSTANDING UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE INFORMATION IS 10 RELIABLE AND ACCURATE, AS CERTIFIED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF 11 INSURANCE; TO AMEND SECTION 4, CHAPTER 446, LAWS OF 2016, TO 12 REMOVE THE REPEAL CLAUSE ON THOSE SECTIONS; AND FOR RELATED 13 PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 83-39-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 15 reenacted as follows: 16 17 83-39-3. (1) No person shall act in the capacity of professional bail agent, soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement 18 19 agent, as defined in Section 83-39-1, or perform any of the 20 functions, duties or powers of the same unless that person shall 21 be qualified and licensed as provided in this chapter. The terms

of this chapter shall not apply to any automobile club or

association, financial institution, insurance company or other

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- 24 organization or association or their employees who execute bail
- 25 bonds on violations arising out of the use of a motor vehicle by
- 26 their members, policyholders or borrowers when bail bond is not
- 27 the principal benefit of membership, the policy of insurance or of
- 28 a loan to such member, policyholder or borrower.
- 29 (2) (a) No license shall be issued or renewed except in
- 30 compliance with this chapter, and none shall be issued except to
- 31 an individual. No firm, partnership, association or corporation,
- 32 as such, shall be so licensed. No professional bail agent shall
- 33 operate under more than one (1) trade name. A soliciting bail
- 34 agent and bail enforcement agent shall operate only under the
- 35 professional bail agent's name. No license shall be issued to or
- 36 renewed for any person who has ever been convicted of a crime that
- 37 the commissioner finds directly relates to the duties and
- 38 responsibilities of the business of a professional bail agent,
- 39 soliciting bail agent, or bail enforcement agent, including, but
- 40 not limited to, any felony that involves an act of fraud,
- 41 dishonesty, or a breach of trust, or money laundering. No license
- 42 shall be issued to any person who is under twenty-one (21) years
- 43 of age. No person engaged as a law enforcement or judicial
- 44 official or attorney shall be licensed hereunder. A person who is
- 45 employed in any capacity at any jail or corrections facility that
- 46 houses state, county or municipal inmates who are or may be
- 47 eligible for bail, whether the person is a public employee,

- 48 independent contractor, or the employee of an independent
- 49 contractor, may not be licensed under this section.
- 50 (b) (i) No person who is a relative of either a sworn
- 51 state, county or municipal law enforcement official or judicial
- 52 official, or an employee, independent contractor or the
- 53 contractor's employee of any police department, sheriff's
- 54 department, jail or corrections facility that houses or holds
- 55 federal, state, county or municipal inmates who are or may be
- 56 eligible for bail, shall write a bond in the county where the law
- 57 enforcement entity or court in which the person's relative serves
- 58 is located. "Relative" means a spouse, parent, grandparent,
- 59 child, sister, brother, or a consanguineous aunt, uncle, niece or
- 60 nephew. Violation of this prohibition shall result in license
- 61 revocation.
- 62 (ii) No person licensed under this chapter shall
- 63 act as a personal surety agent in the writing of bail during a
- 64 period he or she is licensed as a limited surety agent, as defined
- 65 herein.
- 66 (iii) No person licensed under this chapter shall
- 67 give legal advice or a legal opinion in any form.
- 68 (3) The department is vested with the authority to enforce
- 69 this chapter. The department may conduct investigations or
- 70 request other state, county or local officials to conduct
- 71 investigations and promulgate such rules and regulations as may be
- 72 necessary for the enforcement of this chapter. The department may

- 73 establish monetary fines and collect such fines as necessary for
- 74 the enforcement of such rules and regulations. All fines
- 75 collected shall be deposited in the Special Insurance Department
- 76 Fund for the operation of that agency.
- 77 (4) (a) Each license issued hereunder shall expire
- 78 biennially on the last day of September of each odd-numbered year,
- 79 unless revoked or suspended prior thereto by the department, or
- 80 upon notice served upon the commissioner by the insurer that the
- 81 authority of a limited surety agent to act for or on behalf of
- 82 such insurer had been terminated, or upon notice served upon the
- 83 commissioner that the authority of a soliciting bail agent or bail
- 84 enforcement agent had been terminated by such professional bail
- 85 agent.
- 86 (b) A soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement agent
- 87 may, upon termination by a professional bail agent or upon his
- 88 cessation of employment with a professional bail agent, be
- 89 relicensed without having to comply with the provisions of
- 90 subsection (7)(a) and (b) of this section, if he has held a
- 91 license in his respective license category within ninety (90) days
- 92 of the new application, meets all other requirements set forth in
- 93 Section 83-39-5 and subsection (7)(b) of this section, and
- 94 notifies the previous professional bail agent in writing that he
- 95 is submitting an application for a new license.
- 96 (5) The department shall prepare and deliver to each
- 97 licensee a license showing the name, address and classification of

- 98 the licensee, and shall certify that the person is a licensed
- 99 professional bail agent, being designated as a personal surety
- 100 agent or a limited surety agent, a soliciting bail agent or a bail
- 101 enforcement agent. In addition, the license of a soliciting bail
- 102 agent or bail enforcement agent, shall show the name of the
- 103 professional bail agent and any other information as the
- 104 commissioner deems proper.
- 105 (6) The commissioner, after a hearing under Section
- 106 83-39-17, may refuse to issue a privilege license for a soliciting
- 107 bail agent to change from one * * * professional bail agent to
- 108 another if he owes any premium or debt to the professional bail
- 109 agent with whom he is currently licensed. The commissioner, after
- 110 a hearing under Section 83-39-17, shall refuse to issue a license
- 111 for a limited surety agent if he owes any premium or debt to an
- insurer to which he has been appointed. If a license has been
- 113 granted to a limited surety agent or a soliciting bail agent who
- 114 owed any premium or debt to an insurer or professional bail agent,
- 115 the commissioner, after a hearing under Section 83-39-17, shall
- 116 revoke the license.
- 117 (7) (a) Before the issuance of any initial professional
- 118 bail agent, soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement agent
- 119 license, the applicant shall submit proof of successful completion
- 120 of forty (40) hours of prelicensing education approved by the
- 121 Mississippi Insurance Department unless the applicant is currently
- 122 licensed under this chapter on July 1, 2014, and has maintained

that license in compliance with the continuing education
requirements of subsection (8) of this section. Any applicant who
has met all continuing education requirements as set forth in
subsection (8)(a) of this section and has been properly licensed
under this chapter within ninety (90) days of submitting an

application for a license shall not be subject to the prelicensing education requirement.

(b) All applicants for a professional bail agent,

soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement agent license applying for an original license after July 1, 2014, shall successfully complete a limited examination by the department for the restricted lines of business before the license can be issued; however, this examination requirement shall not apply to any licensed bail soliciting agent and bail enforcement agent transferring to another professional bail agent license, any licensed bail soliciting agent applying for a bail enforcement agent license, and any licensed bail enforcement agent applying for a bail soliciting agent license. An applicant shall only be required to successfully complete the limited examination once.

(c) Beginning on July 1, 2011, in order to assist the department in determining an applicant's suitability for a license under this chapter, the applicant shall submit a set of fingerprints with the submission of an application for license.

The department shall forward the fingerprints to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of conducting a criminal history

- 148 record check. If no disqualifying record is identified at the
- 149 state level, the Department of Public Safety shall forward the
- 150 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national
- 151 criminal history record check. Fees related to the criminal
- 152 history record check shall be paid by the applicant to the
- 153 commissioner and the monies from such fees shall be deposited in
- 154 the special fund in the State Treasury designated as the
- 155 "Insurance Department Fund."
- 156 (8) (a) Before the renewal of the license of any
- 157 professional bail agent, soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement
- 158 agent, the applicant shall submit proof of successful completion
- 159 of continuing education hours as follows:
- 160 (i) There shall be no continuing education
- 161 required for the first licensure year;
- 162 (ii) Except as provided in subparagraph (i), eight
- 163 (8) hours of continuing education for each year or part of a year
- 164 of the two-year license period, for a total of sixteen (16) hours
- 165 per license period.
- 166 (b) If an applicant for renewal failed to obtain the
- 167 required eight (8) hours for each year of the license period
- 168 during the actual license year in which the education was required
- 169 to be obtained, the applicant shall not be eligible for a renewal
- 170 license but shall be required to obtain an original license and be
- 171 subject to the education requirements set forth in subsection (7).
- 172 The commissioner shall not be required to comply with Section

- 173 83-39-17 in denying an application for a renewal license under
- 174 this paragraph (b).
- 175 (c) The education hours required under this subsection
- 176 (8) shall be approved by the Mississippi Insurance Department.
- 177 (d) The continuing education requirements under this
- 178 subsection (8) shall not be required for renewal of a bail agent
- 179 license for any applicant who is sixty-five (65) years of age and
- 180 who has been licensed as a bail agent for a continuous period of
- 181 twenty (20) years immediately preceding the submission of the
- 182 application as evidenced by submission of an affidavit, under
- 183 oath, on a form prescribed by the department, signed by the
- 184 licensee attesting to satisfaction of the age, licensing, and
- 185 experience requirements of this paragraph (d).
- 186 (9) No license as a professional bail agent shall be issued
- 187 unless the applicant has been duly licensed by the department as a
- 188 soliciting bail agent for a period of three (3) consecutive years
- 189 immediately preceding the submission of the application. However,
- 190 this subsection (9) shall not apply to any person who was licensed
- 191 as a professional bail agent before July 1, 2011.
- 192 (10) A nonresident person may be licensed as a professional
- 193 bail agent, bail soliciting agent or bail enforcement agent if:
- 194 (a) The person's home state awards licenses to
- 195 residents of this state on the same basis; and
- 196 (b) The person has satisfied all requirements set forth
- 197 in this chapter.

- 198 On or before October 1, 2016, the Insurance Department 199 shall establish a statewide Electronic Bondsmen Registry for all 200 licenses, powers of appointment and powers of attorney requiring registration under this section. Once established, each 201 202 professional bail agent, limited surety agent, bail soliciting 203 agent, bail enforcement agent or insurance company writing bail 204 bonds shall be required under this subsection (11) to register and maintain a record of each required license, power of appointment 205 206 and power of attorney in the registry. Failure to comply with this provision will subject the agent to the penalties provided in 207 208 Section 83-39-29.
- 209 (12) From and after July 1, 2016, the expenses of this
 210 agency shall be defrayed by appropriation from the State General
 211 Fund and all user charges and fees authorized under this section
 212 shall be deposited into the State General Fund as authorized by
 213 law.
- 214 (13) From and after July 1, 2016, no state agency shall
 215 charge another state agency a fee, assessment, rent or other
 216 charge for services or resources received by authority of this
 217 section.
- 218 **SECTION 2.** Section 83-39-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 219 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 220 83-39-7. (1) (a) Each applicant for a professional bail 221 agent license * * * shall be required to post a qualification bond 222 in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) in order to

223	be qualified and licensed as provided in this chapter to issue
224	bail bonds in the county where the principal place of business of
225	the applicant is located. The applicant shall identify the county
226	of his or her principal place of business in the license
227	application or license renewal application.
228	(b) To issue bail bonds outside the county of his or
229	her principal place of business, an applicant or licensee must
230	post an additional qualification bond of One Hundred Thousand
231	Dollars (\$100,000.00); provided, however, that no insurance
232	company shall be required to post a qualification bond or reserves
233	greater than a total of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in
234	order to issue bail bonds in multiple counties.
235	(c) Any licensed professional bail agent with ten (10)
236	or more cumulative years of experience as a licensed Mississippi
237	soliciting bail agent or bail enforcement agent or professional
238	bail agent as of July 1, 2018, is not required to post an
239	additional qualification bond to issue bail bonds in multiple
240	counties. Any other professional bail agent issuing bonds in
241	multiple counties shall increase the amount of the qualification
242	bond to be posted by Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) upon
243	renewal of his or her license until the total qualification bond
244	required for renewal of a license equals One Hundred Thirty
245	Thousand Dollars (\$130,000.00).
246	(* * $\star \underline{d}$) The Insurance Department shall submit a
247	report to the Senate and House of Representatives Committees on

Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency that details the amount of all bonds or undertakings that each bail bondsman has written in this state on which the bail bondsman is absolutely or conditionally liable since the Bail Bond Database was established by the department. The report shall be submitted on or before December 1, 2017. The report shall also include the number of bail bondsmen who have failed to comply with the database reporting requirements, if any, the technical issues that may have occurred since the database was established and any suggested legislation to ensure each bail bondsman's continued compliance with the database reporting requirements.

(2) The qualification bond shall be made by depositing with the commissioner the aforesaid amount of bonds of the United States, the State of Mississippi or any agency or subdivision thereof, or a certificate of deposit issued by an institution whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and made payable jointly to the owner and the Department of Insurance, or shall be written by an insurer as defined in this chapter, shall meet the specifications as may be required and defined in this chapter, and shall meet such specifications as may be required and approved by the department. The bond shall be conditioned upon the full and prompt payment of any bail bond issued by such professional bail agent into the court ordering the bond forfeited. The bond shall be to the people of the State of Mississippi in favor of any court of this

- 273 state, whether municipal, justice, county, circuit, Supreme or
- 274 other court.
- 275 * * *
- 276 (* * *3) The qualification bond may be released by the
- 277 department to the insurance company or professional bail personal
- 278 surety agent upon an order to release the qualification bond
- 279 issued by a court of competent jurisdiction, or upon written
- 280 request to the department by the insurance company or professional
- 281 bail personal surety agent no earlier than five (5) years after
- 282 the expiration date of his last license.
- SECTION 3. Section 83-39-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 284 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 285 83-39-13. (1) Each professional bail agent licensed under
- 286 this chapter, under oath, shall provide to the Insurance
- 287 Department an annual financial statement. The annual financial
- 288 statement shall show assets, liabilities and net worth as of the
- 289 end of the most recent calendar year. The statement shall be
- 290 submitted annually to the department by June 1.
- 291 (2) (a) For purposes of applicable examinations, a
- 292 professional bail agent licensed in this state shall maintain at
- 293 least one * * * office physically located in any municipality or
- 294 county in this state, to serve as his principal place of business
- 295 operations where records pertaining to his bail agent business
- 296 conducted in Mississippi are maintained and this office location
- 297 shall be registered with the Insurance Department.

298	(b) When applying for an original or renewal license as
299	a professional bail agent, the applicant shall indicate the
300	address of the office location to serve as his principal place of
301	business operations, and this address shall be evidenced on the
302	face of the license issued to the licensee.

- 303 (c) If for any reason the professional bail agent
 304 changes the location of his principal place of business
 305 operations, removes to another state, or no longer continues in
 306 the profession as a bail agent, the bail agent shall register the
 307 new location with the department, or notify the department of his
 308 removal from the state or his cessation of business as a
 309 professional bail agent as appropriate.
- 310 On or before October 1, 2016, the Mississippi Insurance 311 Department shall establish a Bail Bond Database within the 312 department for the reporting of all bail bonds written by personal 313 surety agents and limited surety agents in this state. By 314 November 15, 2016, each bail agent must input his or her bail bond 315 information into the Bail Bond Database for all bonds written from 316 and after October 1, 2016. By the fifteenth day of each 317 subsequent month, each bail agent must update the Bail Bond 318 Database regarding his or her bail bond information for bail bonds written from and after October 1, 2016, and each update must be 319 320 current through the last day of the previous month. Any bail 321 agent who fails to comply with the provisions of this subsection

322	(3)	shall	be	assessed	а	fine	in	an	amount	not	to	exceed	One

- 323 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per violation.
- 324 (4) (a) Information in the Bail Bond Database shall not be
- 325 the basis for restrictions on the amount of bonds a professional
- 326 bail agent may have outstanding at any given time until such time
- 327 as the information in the database is reliable and accurate, as
- 328 certified by the commissioner.
- 329 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection,
- 330 at such time that the courts of the state have access to and
- 331 participate in a uniform court filing system that allows courts to
- 332 reliably access and to accurately enter, correct or modify all
- 333 necessary information into the Bail Bond Database, and
- 334 professional bail agents have access to verify and modify
- 335 individual information in the Bail Bond Database, the Bail Bond
- 336 Database shall be considered reliable and accurate.
- 337 **SECTION 4.** Section 4, Chapter 446, Laws of 2016, is amended
- 338 as follows:
- 339 Section 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 340 and after July 1, 2016 * * *.
- 341 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 342 and after July 1, 2018, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 343 June 30, 2018.
