SENATE BILL NO. 2599 (As Passed the Senate)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-33-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE OFFENSE OF TEXTING WHILE DRIVING AND TO DELETE THE SUNSET CLAUSE ON THE OFFENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-33-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 63-33-1. (1) For purposes of this section, the following
- 8 terms shall have the meanings ascribed in this subsection, unless
- 9 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 (a) "Cellular telephone" means an analog or digital
- 11 wireless telephone authorized by the Federal Communications
- 12 Commission to operate in the frequency bandwidth reserved for
- 13 cellular radiophones.
- 14 (b) "Digital assistant" means a wireless electronic
- 15 communication device that provides for data communication other
- 16 than by voice.
- 17 (c) "E911" has the meaning ascribed in Section
- 18 19-5-303.

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( * * *d) "Hand-held mobile telephone" means a mobile
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    telephone or other portable electronic communication device with
    which a user engages in a call or writes, sends or reads a text
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    message using at least one hand. The term "hand-held mobile
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    telephone" shall not include a voice-operated or hands-free
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    device * * *.
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               ( * * *e) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle driven or
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    drawn by mechanical power and manufactured primarily for use on
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    public highways * * *.
               ( * * *f) "Social networking site" means any web-based
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    service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a
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    founded system, articulate a list of other users with whom they
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    share a connection, and communicate with other users of the
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    site * * *.
               ( * * *g) "Text message" includes a text-based message,
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    instant message, electronic message, and email, but shall not
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    include an emergency, traffic or weather alert or a message
    related to the operation or navigation of the motor vehicle * * *.
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                         "Voice-operated or hands-free device" means a
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    device that allows the user to write, send, or read a text message
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    without the use of either hand except to activate, deactivate, or
    initiate a feature or function * * *.
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              (i) "Wireless communication device" means a device that
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    uses a commercial mobile service, as defined by 47 USC Section
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332, including a cellular telephone or digital assistant.

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- (* * * \underline{j}) "Writing," "sending" and "reading," with
- 45 respect to a text message, means the manual entry, sending, or
- 46 retrieval of a text message, respectively, to communicate with any
- 47 person or device.
- 48 (2) An operator of a * * * motor vehicle is prohibited
- 49 from * * * any use of a wireless communication device except for
- 50 placing or receiving a call while * * * the motor vehicle is in
- 51 motion, unless the operator is using a voice-operated or
