1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-144-1, 37-144-3, 37-144-5, 37-144-7 AND 37-144-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCLUDE PSYCHIATRY STUDENTS IN THE MISSISSIPPI RURAL PHYSICIANS SCHOLARSHIP RESIDENCY PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37-144-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	37-144-1. There is established the Mississippi Rural
9	Physicians Scholarship Program for the purpose of identifying and
10	recruiting qualified university and college students from rural
11	areas of the state for medical or osteopathic school
12	matriculation. The program shall consist of three (3) distinct
13	phases through which participants will progress, including:
14	(a) Undergraduate premedical education;
15	(b) Medical or osteopathic school and residency
16	including residency in psychiatry; and

19	SECTION 2.	Section	37-144-3,	Mississippi	Code	of	1972,	is

- 20 amended as follows:
- 21 37-144-3. (1) The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship
- 22 Program shall be administered by a commission to be known as the
- 23 "Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Commission." The
- 24 commission shall be directed by a board composed of the following
- 25 members:
- 26 (a) Two (2) generalist physicians appointed by and from
- 27 the membership of the Mississippi State Medical Association, the
- 28 term of which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for
- 29 one (1) additional term;
- 30 (b) One (1) generalist physician appointed by and from
- 31 the membership of each of the following organizations, the term of
- 32 which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for one (1)
- 33 additional term:
- 34 (i) Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians;
- 35 (ii) Mississippi Chapter, American College of
- 36 Physicians;
- 37 (iii) Mississippi Chapter, American Academy of
- 38 Pediatrics;
- 39 (iv) Mississippi Chapter, American College of
- 40 OB-GYN;
- 41 (v) Mississippi Medical and Surgical Association;
- 42 (vi) Mississippi Osteopathic Association;

43	(c) Two (2) designees of the Dean of the University of
44	Mississippi School of Medicine whose terms are at the discretion
45	of the dean, at least one (1) of whom is a member of the
46	University of Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee;
47	(d) Two (2) medical students, one (1) of whom shall be
48	selected yearly through a process developed by the Dean of the
49	School of Medicine in consultation with the Chairs of the
50	Departments of Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, OB-GYN and
51	Pediatrics, and one (1) of whom shall be nominated for a one-year
52	term by the Mississippi Chapter of the Student National Medical
53	Association and approved by the Dean of the University of
54	Mississippi School of Medicine;
55	(e) A member of the Board of Trustees of State
56	Institutions of Higher Learning; * * *
57	(f) The Chair of the Department of Family Medicine at
58	the University of Mississippi School of Medicine * * *; and
59	(g) A licensed psychiatrist appointed by the
60	Mississippi Chapter of the American College of Psychiatrists.
61	(2) The premedical advisors from the accredited four-year
62	colleges and universities in the state and the directors or
63	designees of the primary care generalist training programs in the
64	State of Mississippi shall comprise an advisory committee to the
65	commission to assist the commission in its administration of the

Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program.

- 67 (3) Vacancies on the commission must be filled in a manner 68 consistent with the original appointments.
- 69 (4) All appointments to the commission must be made no later
- 70 than September 1, * * * 2018. After the members are appointed,
- 71 the Chair of the Department of Family Medicine shall set a date
- 72 for the organizational meeting that is mutually acceptable to the
- 73 majority of the commission members. The organizational meeting
- 74 shall be for the purposes of organizing the commission and
- 75 establishing rules for transacting its business. A majority of
- 76 the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum at all
- 77 commission meetings. An affirmative vote of a majority of the
- 78 members present and voting shall be required in the adoption of
- 79 rules, reports and in any other actions taken by the commission.
- 80 At the organizational meeting, the commission shall elect a chair
- 81 and vice chair from the members appointed according to paragraphs
- 82 (a) through (d) of subsection (1). The chair shall serve for a
- 83 term of two (2) years, upon the expiration of which the vice chair
- 84 shall assume the office of chair.
- 85 (5) After the organizational meeting, the commission shall
- 86 hold no less than two (2) meetings annually.
- 87 (6) The commission may form an executive committee for the
- 88 purpose of transacting business that must be conducted before the
- 89 next regularly scheduled meeting of the commission. All actions
- 90 taken by the executive committee must be ratified by the
- 91 commission at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

92	(7) M∈	embers	of	the	commission	shall	serve	wit	thout	
93	compensation	but	may	be	reimbursed,	subjec	t to	the	availability	of

94 funding, for mileage and actual and necessary expenses incurred in

- 95 attending meetings of the commission.
- 96 (8) Funding for the establishment and continued operation of
- 97 the program and commission shall be appropriated out of any money
- 98 in the General Fund not already appropriated to the University of
- 99 Mississippi Medical Center.
- SECTION 3. Section 37-144-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 101 amended as follows:
- 102 37-144-5. The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship
- 103 Commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 104 (a) Developing the administrative policy for the
- 105 commission and the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship
- 106 Program;
- 107 (b) Promulgating rules and regulations, with the advice
- 108 and consent of the University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 109 pertaining to the implementation and operation of the Rural
- 110 Physicians Scholarship Program;
- 111 (c) Developing and implementing strategies and
- 112 activities for the identification and recruitment of students and
- 113 for marketing the program and for the implementation of the
- 114 program. In developing these strategies, the board shall seek the
- 115 input of various organizations and entities, including the
- 116 Mississippi State Medical Association, the Mississippi Academy of

- 122 (d) Establishing a budget, with the advice and consent
- 123 of the University of Mississippi Medical Center, to support the
- 124 activities of the program and periodically reviewing and if
- 125 appropriate, revising, the scholarship and other stipends offered
- 126 through the program;
- 127 (e) Advising the University of Mississippi Medical
- 128 Center regarding hiring an executive director and support staff
- 129 necessary for the commission's work. The commission shall
- 130 nominate at least two (2) individuals to serve as executive
- 131 director;
- (f) Reviewing participants progress in the program and
- 133 mentoring students and physicians participating in the program;
- 134 (g) Developing and participating in programs that
- 135 provide initial practice support in collaboration with other
- 136 interested professional organizations;
- 137 (h) The commission shall have the authority through use
- 138 of generally applicable definitions, to designate an area of the
- 139 state as underserved or rural. The method by which these
- 140 designations shall be made shall be contained in rules and
- 141 regulations promulgated by the commission.

142	SECTION 4.	Section	37-144-7,	Mississippi	Code	of	1972,	is
143	amended as follo	NS:						

- The commission shall develop and implement 144 37-144-7. (1) policies and procedures designed to recruit, identify and enroll 145 146 undergraduate students who demonstrate necessary interest, 147 commitment, aptitude and academic achievement to pursue careers as family physicians or other generalist physicians or psychiatrists 148 149 in rural or medically underserved areas of Mississippi, and to 150 develop and implement the programs designed to foster successful entry of participants into medical school, completion of medical 151 152 school, enrollment into and completion of family medicine or other 153 generalist residency, and establishment and maintenance of a 154 career in family medicine, psychiatry or other generalist specialty in a rural or underserved area of Mississippi. 155
- 156 (2) The commission shall have the authority through use of 157 generally applicable definitions, to designate an area of the 158 state as underserved or rural.
- (3) The commission, in conjunction with the University of
 Mississippi Medical Center, shall have the authority to provide
 students selected for scholarship funding with faculty mentors and
 other programs designed to enhance the students' likelihood of
 admission to the medical school. The commission and the
 University of Mississippi Medical Center will develop coursework
 that will provide scholarship students with the skills necessary

- 166 for sustained and successful medical practice in rural
- 167 Mississippi.
- 168 Each applicant for admission to the program must submit
- an application to the commission that conforms to requirements 169
- 170 established by the commission.
- 171 In selecting participants for the program, the board may
- only accept an applicant if his or her academic record and other 172
- 173 characteristics, if given consideration by the University of
- 174 Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee, would be
- considered credible and competitive. 175
- 176 An applicant for the program may be admitted only upon a
- majority vote of the members of the commission. 177
- 178 Not less than fifteen (15) students will be admitted to
- the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program each year, 179
- provided that there are fifteen (15) or more qualified applicants 180
- 181 for the program.
- 182 Section 37-144-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is SECTION 5.
- 183 amended as follows:
- 184 37-144-17. (1) Upon completion of residency, a participant
- 185 in the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program must
- 186 proceed to enter the practice of medicine in a rural or
- 187 underserved area in Mississippi, as defined by the commission and
- consistent with generally acceptable designations. If an area 188
- 189 experiences significant changes in its medical or general
- community which are not reflected by health professional shortage 190

191	area (HPSA) or medically underserved area (MUA) rural designation,
192	the commission may receive testimony and, in its discretion, may
193	qualify the area as an underserved or rural area to allow the
194	program participant to fulfill his or her practice obligation.

(2) Upon entering the practice of medicine including the practice of psychiatry, a participant in the program must serve in a health professional shortage area (HPSA), medically underserved area (MUA), or rural area otherwise approved for practice under subsection (1) of this section for a number of years which corresponds to the number of years, not to exceed five (5), for which the participant received funding through the program. participant who completes residency outside the State of Mississippi who fails to enter the practice of medicine as required under this section shall be deemed in breach of contract and shall be liable for the immediate repayment of all financial assistance provided to the participant through the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program, including assistance provided during undergraduate school, as well as in medical or osteopathic school, along with other penalties that may be prescribed in policy by the board. Any participant who fails to complete the period of practice for which he or she is obligated to provide services in a health professional shortage area (HPSA) or a medically underserved area (MUA) in exchange for financial assistance received through the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program shall be liable for the repayment of all

216	financial assistance provided to the participant through the
217	program, along with other penalties that may be prescribed by the
218	commission, an amount which shall be reduced on a pro rata basis
219	for actual years of practice by the physician in the area
220	designated by the commission.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2018.
