SENATE BILL NO. 2962 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION OF SPECIAL FUNDS TO DEFRAY THE 2 EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY FOR 3 FISCAL YEAR 2019. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of Employment 7 Security, or its successor, for the purpose of defraying the 8 9 expenses incurred by said department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019.....\$ 152,634,400.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized: 12 13 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 14 Permanent: Full Time..... 353 Part Time.... 15 189 16 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 7 17 Part Time.... 70

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18 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 19 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 20 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose, 21 22 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 23 2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data 24 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 25 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 26 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 27 28 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 29 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2019 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 30 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at 31 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 32 33 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 34 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2019 "Personal Services" 35 36 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 37 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 38 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 39 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

The 45 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 46 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 48 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

57 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 58 Section 1, the following sum shall be derived from money in the 59 Unemployment Trust Fund, made available to this state under Section 903 of the Social Security Act, as amended (42 USCA 60 61 Section 1103), to the Mississippi Department of Employment 62 Security to be deposited in the Employment Security Administration 63 Fund and used by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security 64 for the following purposes:

(a) Payment of various One-Stop Administration expensesthat support the service delivery of employment and workforce

(i) Staff for delivery of reemployment services to
UI claimants, including group job search assistance and
staff-assisted referrals to jobs.

(ii) Equipment and resources for resource rooms.
(iii) Payment for rent, utilities and maintenance
of facilities, including common spaces such as resource rooms,
reception areas, conference areas, etc.

(iv) Payment of shared costs for operation of local One-Stop Career Centers, including payment for One-Stop operators.

(v) Purchase of computer equipment, network equipment, telecommunications equipment, application development and other technology resources.

(vi) Training, technical assistance, and
professional development of staff who deliver employment and
workforce information services.

(vii) Access Improvement costs for individuals
with disabilities, including remodeling or retrofitting One-Stop
Career Centers and purchasing appropriate software, hardware,
furniture and supplies.

(b) Administration of the Unemployment Compensation
(UC) law and its public employment service (ES) offices. This
includes, but is not limited to, the following uses:

93 purchases, modifications, or automation of computer-related
94 systems and related costs.

95 (ii) UI and ES Performance Improvement costs.
96 (iii) Fraud and Abuse Reduction costs.
97 (iv) UI Claims Filing and Payment Methods
98 Improvement costs.

99 (v) Under the direction of the Bureau of Building, 100 Grounds and Real Property Management to acquire lands and 101 construct buildings thereon or improve existing buildings to be 102 used as offices. The funds in this section are authorized for the 103 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019..... 104\$ 33,047,000.00.

105 The funds authorized in this section shall be requisitioned 106 by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security from the 107 Unemployment Trust Fund maintained by the Secretary of the 108 Treasury of the United States as needed for the payment of obligations incurred under this appropriation, and such monies 109 110 shall be deposited in the Employment Security Administration Fund 111 in accordance with the provisions of Section 71-5-457, Mississippi 112 Code of 1972.

113 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 114 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 115 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 116 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,

121 SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Employment Security 122 is authorized to expend up to Three Million Five Hundred Thousand 123 Dollars (\$3,500,000.00) from the State Workforce Investment Funds 124 collected pursuant to Section 71-5-353, Mississippi Code of 1972.

125 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, a sum not 126 to exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is made 127 available for Pathways2Possibilities from the State Workforce 128 Investment Funds collected.

SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the Mississippi Department of Employment Security is authorized to expend up to Twenty-two Million Dollars (\$22,000,000.00) from the Mississippi Works Fund collected pursuant to Section 71-5-353, Mississippi Code of 1972.

134 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that this 135 agency shall have the authority to expend funds from any source 136 that may become available to the agency in accordance with the 137 rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 138 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds for the purpose of funding any increase in health 139 insurance costs for fiscal year 2019, or for the purpose of 140 funding additional fees, costs or assessments received by the 141

142 agency from the Department of Information Technology Services or 143 the Department of Finance and Administration for fiscal year 2019 that may be incurred by the agency as a result of legislation 144 passed during the 2018 Regular Session of the Legislature and 145 146 approved by the Governor. The agency is authorized to escalate 147 other special funds for the limited purposes provided in this section in an amount not to exceed Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand 148 149 Four Hundred Seventy-four Dollars (\$950,474.00).

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

157 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 158 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 159 160 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 161 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 162 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. This act shall take effect and be in force from 163 SECTION 11. 164 and after July 1, 2018.

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
