1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
7	maintenance of the Department of Mental Health for the fiscal year
8	beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
9	\$ 208,001,565.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
12	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
13	for the support and maintenance of the Department of Mental Health
14	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending
15	June 30, 2019\$ 377,985,021.00.
16	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
17	Section 2, Eighteen Million Nine Hundred Fifty-one Thousand Eight

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 82 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

- 84 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 86 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 87 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 88 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 90 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 91 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

93	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

- 198 **SECTION 6.** The Department of Mental Health and its
- 199 facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending
- 200 authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to
- 201 transfer funds to the Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid
- 202 match and designate that the funds thus transferred shall be
- 203 applied to Medicaid match obligations arising in the subsequent
- 204 fiscal year.
- 205 **SECTION 7.** Any person within the Department of Mental Health
- 206 who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by
- 207 the Governor may, at the discretion of the Director of the
- 208 Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of Mental
- 209 Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call-back
- 210 pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."
- 211 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated to the "Service Budget"
- 212 funds are included for the support of community mental health
- 213 services for Fiscal Year 2019.
- 214 Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for
- 215 the support of community mental health services shall be made
- 216 available to any Regional Mental Health/Intellectual Disability

217	Center which does not receive from each of its participating
218	counties a dollar amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a
219	three-fourths $(3/4)$ mill tax on all taxable property in the county
220	in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds
221	contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984,
222	whichever shall be greater. By means of performance contracts,
223	the Department of Mental Health shall disburse the funds
224	appropriated in this section for services for the mentally ill,
225	intellectually disabled and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board
226	of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be
227	responsible for selecting the types of services which shall be
228	provided with the funds appropriated in this section, for
229	developing and monitoring performance contracts and for holding
230	contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

SECTION 9. Ellisville State School is authorized to draw up
to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) from interest
earned on funds invested in Ellisville State School Client's Trust
Fund for the purpose of supplementing the cost related to
supplies, property, and equipment in direct care.

SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health and its facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated by the department, either directly or by means of transferring funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management,

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- 242 and to transfer such funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds, and
- 243 Real Property Management for the purposes of constructing and
- 244 equipping group homes for persons with mental illness,
- 245 intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; constructing and
- 246 equipping such other buildings as may be required for treatment of
- 247 persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or
- 248 substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; and to
- 249 construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any
- 250 intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual
- 251 disabilities (ICF/IID) constructed with funds authorized in this
- 252 section shall be authorized to participate in Medicaid funding
- 253 available for such services.
- 254 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 255 Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and
- 256 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 257 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 258 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 259 2018. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 260 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2020 shall be submitted to
- 261 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 262 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 263 during the Fiscal Year 2019 budget request process.
- 264 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 265 of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain
- 266 utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such

utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane,
cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined,
the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance
with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall
include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not
include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
shall be prohibited.

Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration. None of the funds transferred with this section may be transferred to the Central Office for Personal Services.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
of this act, Sixteen Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars

(\$16,100,000.00) is provided to the Department of Mental Health to
expand those community-based services that will improve the State
of Mississippi's compliance with the Olmstead decision of the
United States Supreme Court. Further, it is the intention of the

292	Legislature that the Department of Mental Health shall have the
293	authority to transfer such sums from this source as are necessary
294	to implement or improve those community services that are more
295	appropriately addressed by the Mississippi Department of Education
296	and/or the Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services to
297	those agencies for that purpose. Further, it is the intention of
298	the Legislature that any sums received from this source that are
299	not expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, by the
300	Mississippi Department of Mental Health shall be reappropriated
301	for the same purpose during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.
302	Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the
303	Department of Mental Health shall account for the expenditure of
304	these funds in sufficient detail to clearly show the purposes for
305	which such funds were expended.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the Department of Mental Health, with approval by the board, may contract with a Community Mental Health Center, or suitable entities, for the purpose of operating the Crisis Intervention Center at Grenada.

The Department of Mental Health, with approval by the board, may also contract with suitable entities for the purpose of operating the crisis intervention centers in Batesville, Brookhaven, Cleveland, Corinth, Laurel and Newton. The department shall provide quarterly progress reports on the operation of the

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316 crisis intervention centers to the Chairmen of the Senate and 317 House Public Health and Appropriations Committees.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 17. The Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) shall transfer funds back to the Department of Mental Health, upon the request of the Department of Mental Health, where the funds received by DFA from the Department of Mental Health were special funds (neither general funds or bond funds) and where those funds are not required for the payment of costs already incurred on a building or repair project. For the purposes of this section, the term "special funds" includes any state source special funds including, but not limited to, funds from the Health Care Expendable Fund. The duty of DFA to transfer funds back to the Department of Mental Health under this section applies to any funds described in this section that were transferred to DFA, regardless of the year that the transfer was made by the Department of Mental Health.

340 <b>SECTION 18.</b> It is the intention of the Legislature that	the
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- 341 Department of Mental Health may provide, upon the availability of
- 342 funds, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) to the Hope
- 343 Village for Children Program.
- 344 **SECTION 19.** None of the funds provided in Section 1, 2, or 3
- of this act shall be used to pay Medicaid match for the fourteen
- 346 (14) Community Mental Health Centers.
- 347 **SECTION 20.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 348 of this act, an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand
- 349 Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for community-based mental
- 350 health services for juveniles in detention.
- 351 **SECTION 21.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
- 352 the intention of the Legislature that Three Million Nine Hundred
- 353 Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Two Dollars (\$3,910,702.00) shall be
- 354 allocated to the Crisis Intervention Mental Health Fund supported
- 355 by General Fund court assessments.
- 356 **SECTION 22.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, the
- 357 Department of Mental Health shall fund four (4) Programs of
- 358 Assertive Community Treatment (PACT) Teams and provide supportive
- 359 employment for individuals with intellectual and developmental
- 360 disabilities.
- 361 **SECTION 23.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 362 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 363 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 364 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

365	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by th	ıe

367	SECTION 24. This act shall take effect and be in force fr	`om
