1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and
9	Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Plant Industry and
10	Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year beginning
11	July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019\$ 6,751,504.00.
12	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
13	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
14	source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available
15	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department
16	of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support
17	and Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year
18	beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019

19	\$ 9,135,830.00.
20	The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of
21	this section include subscription fees produced from the Market
22	Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi
23	Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
24	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
25	following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be
26	derived from the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
27	Commerce - Fruit and Vegetable Revolving Fund, for the purpose of
28	defraying the expenses of the department\$ 600,000.00.
29	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
30	this act, the following positions are authorized:
31	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
32	Permanent: Full Time 230
33	Part Time 2
34	Time-Limited: Full Time
35	Part Time 4
36	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
37	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
38	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2020 do not
39	exceed Fiscal Year 2019 funds appropriated for that purpose,
40	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
41	2019 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
42	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
43	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to

- 44 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
- 45 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 46 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
- 47 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2019
- 48 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
- 49 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
- 50 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 51 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 52 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 53 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2019 "Personal Services"
- 54 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 55 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 56 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 57 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 59 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 60 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 61 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 62 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 63 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 64 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 65 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 66 appropriated level.
- 67 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 68 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

69	being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
70	act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
71	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
72	violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
73	to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
74	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
75	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
76	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
77	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
78	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
79	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
80	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
81	performance measures provided below:

156	SECTION 6. The funds appropriated and authorized	l to be
157	expended under the provisions of this act shall be exp	ended for
158	the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the	State
159	Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation	n of all
160	programs and activities (except operation of the State	e Lime
161	Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Qua	rantine
162	Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized t	o be
163	conducted and carried on by said department; including	, but not
164	limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilize	er and Dairy
165	Act; the Weights and Measures Act; the Meat Inspection	Act of
166	1968; the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following	additional
167	programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law;	publication
168	and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, a	gricultural

169	statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and
170	inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay,
171	grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans,
172	seed and syrup.
173	SECTION 7. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
174	Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and
175	the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish
176	nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for-profit" activities
177	related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The
178	funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted
179	accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department
180	of Finance and Administration.
181	SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
182	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
183	Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any
184	other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control
185	Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the
186	support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year
187	beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019
188	\$ 1,100,000.00.
189	Of the special funds authorized in this section, Six Hundred
190	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000.00) shall be derived from funds
191	received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and
192	from fees charged private persons/organizations, and Two Hundred
193	Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be derived from funds

received from the State Forestry Commission. A county in order to participate must pay up to Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars

(\$7,500.00) and if any county wishes to pay any additional funds than provided, those funds may be used only in said county.

198 SECTION 9. Of the funds provided by the provisions of this 199 act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty 200 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which 201 202 shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and 203 Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age 204 who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty 205 The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and level. 206 regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers' 207 Market Nutrition Pilot Program.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

216 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
217 Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall maintain complete
218 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all

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219	funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
220	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
221	Year 2018. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
222	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2020 shall be
223	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
224	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
225	provided during the Fiscal Year 2019 budget request process.
226	SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
227	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
228	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
229	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
230	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
231	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
232	SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from
233	and after July 1, 2018.
