- 11 first year in their four years on the Competition Team to win

- 14 success. One of Mississippi's top programs, the Greyhounds won
- 15 State Titles from 2011-2014 and a World Championship in 2013, but

27	Regional Competition. Ocean Springs qualified for the World
28	Championships by finishing in the Top 10 nationally the prior
29	year. The Greyhounds will compete in the National Finals February
30	10-11, 2018, followed by the World Competition the next day; and
