SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 512

- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING TAYLOR MACHINE WORKS
- 2 IN LOUISVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, ON THE OCCASION OF ITS 90TH
- 3 ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION AND FOR REPRESENTING OUR STATE AT
- 4 PRESIDENT DONALD TRUMP'S "MADE IN AMERICA WEEK" AND GOVERNOR PHIL
- 5 BRYANT'S "MADE IN MISSISSIPPI WEEK."
- 6 WHEREAS, Taylor Machine Works, a manufacturer of industrial
- 7 lift trucks, located in Louisville, Mississippi, was started by
- 8 W.A. Taylor, Sr., in 1927. The company will celebrate its 90th
- 9 birthday this year; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Lex Taylor, Chairman and CEO of Taylor Group,
- 11 received a request from President Donald Trump to kick off "Made
- 12 in America Week." It was a quick request by the White House, but
- 13 Taylor says they are thankful they were able to have a piece of
- 14 their equipment featured. The President asked for an
- 15 "American-Made" product from each state to be exhibited on the
- 16 south lawn of the White House. "With the help of our dealer in
- 17 the area, we had a machine at the Smithsonian, "said Taylor. "So
- 18 instead of having to ship a machine all the way from Mississippi

- 19 to Washington, D.C., we were able to drive it four blocks to the
- 20 White House"; and
- 21 WHEREAS, in conjunction with President Trump's "Made in
- 22 America Week, " Governor Phil Bryant celebrated "Made in
- 23 Mississippi Week." Governor Bryant highlighted Taylor Machine
- 24 Works on social media to kick off the week. "Mississippi's
- 25 business-friendly environment and our commitment to providing
- 26 companies an atmosphere where they can not only do business, but
- 27 thrive, has produced results time and again," Governor Bryant
- 28 said; and
- 29 WHEREAS, in 1937, W.A. Taylor, Sr., produced his first
- 30 conventional timber skidder. Later developed into a mobile
- 31 skidder and loader, this pioneer machine became known as the
- 32 "Logger's Dream." The success of the "Logger's Dream" initiated a
- 33 pattern of growth and expansion which became characteristic of the
- 34 company. A second "dream" product was introduced, the "Pasture
- 35 Dream," which permitted simultaneous application of seed and
- 36 fertilizer without seedbed preparation. Acceptance of these
- 37 products encouraged the decision to expand the agricultural,
- 38 forestry, and reforestation product lines; and
- 39 WHEREAS, the early 1950s brought the development of the
- 40 "Yardster" forklift trucks by Taylor Machine Works. These rugged
- 41 machines soon found widespread acceptance in the handling of heavy
- 42 and bulky materials such as lumber, prestressed concrete, steel
- 43 and other primary metals, and containerized freight. A line of

- 44 pulpwood handling equipment, including the "Pulpwood Dream" and
- 45 pulpwood "Yardstar" followed and rapidly became the accepted
- 46 standard for loading and unloading pulpwood in the growing number
- 47 of concentration yards throughout the southeastern United States;
- 48 and
- 49 WHEREAS, by the mid-1960s, Taylor Machine Works had one of
- 50 the most advanced machine shops in the South, with heavy
- 51 investments in modern machine tools. Products included a complete
- 52 line of heavy duty trailers (for transporting gravel, soil, etc.),
- 53 numerous agricultural implements, reforestation equipment, log
- 54 loaders, and other "specialized" machines in addition to the major
- 55 line of forklift trucks; and
- 56 WHEREAS, today, Taylor Machine Works, Inc., under the
- 57 leadership of the third generation of the Taylor family, is a
- 58 major progressive force in the worldwide material-handling
- 59 equipment industry. The "Big Red" product line consists of
- 60 numerous models of pneumatic tire forklifts with standard forks
- 61 and carriages or optional front-end attachments and lift
- 62 capacities ranging up to 125,000 pounds. The product line also
- 63 includes cushion tire forklifts, log stackers, container handlers
- 64 and reach stackers; and
- 65 WHEREAS, Taylor's "Big Red" machines are on the job
- 66 throughout the world and have made an impressive impact on the
- 67 material-handling industry. These massive machines are utilized
- 68 in such diverse applications as changing engines on jumbo jets,

- 69 manipulating concrete culverts 12 feet in diameter weighing up to
- 70 25 tons, moving and stacking empty and loaded containers up to
- 71 eight-high, handling entire truckloads of logs in one bite,
- 72 transporting cargo on and off huge ships, performing varied
- 73 material-handling jobs in steel mills, as well as many other
- 74 material-handling jobs; and
- 75 WHEREAS, the Engineering and Research and Development Groups
- 76 at Taylor continue to produce new and improved machines to get the
- 77 job done in the material-handling industry; and it is with great
- 78 pride that we recognize this Mississippi business and sales
- 79 network team which continues to bring honor to the business
- 80 community and to the State of Mississippi:
- 81 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 82 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 83 we do hereby congratulate Taylor Machine Works in Louisville,
- 84 Mississippi, on the occasion of its 90th Anniversary Celebration
- 85 and for representing our state at President Donald Trump's "Made
- 86 in America Week" and Governor Phil Bryant's "Made in Mississippi
- 87 Week," and express our continued thanks to this corporate citizen
- 88 and leading manufacturer and sales network for their contributions
- 89 to our state.
