SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 551

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE CONDOLENCES OF THE 2 LEGISLATURE TO THE BEREAVED FAMILY OF MISSISSIPPI DELTA KOREAN WAR 3 VETERAN, BUSINESSMAN AND CIVIC LEADER JERE B. NASH, JR., OF GREENVILLE, MISSISSIPPI. 5 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of respected Mississippi Delta Korean War Veteran, Businessman and 6 7 Civic Leader Jere B. Nash, Jr., 89, on December 30, 2017; and WHEREAS, Jere was born on November 7, 1928, in Greenville to 8 9 Jere B. Nash, Sr., and Wilda Heard Nash. He graduated from 10 Greenville High School in 1946 and obtained his undergraduate degree from Rhodes (Southwestern) College in Memphis in 1950. For 11 12 the next two years, he served his country in the U.S. Army, 13 including a year in Korea as an Artilleryman. While in Korea, he 14 began corresponding with a friend from Rhodes, Margie Boisen, who had graduated with him and then moved to North Carolina to 15 complete a Master's Degree in Music; and 16 17 WHEREAS, following his discharge in January 1952, he asked Margie to marry him. She said yes and five months later they 18 19 walked down the aisle together at Idlewild Presbyterian Church in

- 20 Memphis, and for the next 65 years they lived in Greenville,
- 21 raised a family of three sons, and contributed to their church and
- 22 community. Margie died on April 30, 2017; and
- 23 WHEREAS, when Jere retired in 1998, he was President of Delta
- 24 Implement Company, a Greenville-based group of stores in the
- 25 Mississippi Delta that sell Case-IH farm equipment. Jere's father
- 26 was a co-founder of the business in 1925. For his entire adult
- 27 life, Jere was a member of Greenville's First Presbyterian Church,
- 28 and he held, at one time or another, every office available to a
- 29 layperson, including Clerk of the Session. In 1970, the City
- 30 Council appointed him to the Board of Trustees for the Greenville
- 31 Public Schools at the same time the federal court had ordered the
- 32 desegregation of the schools. For 10 years, as a member of that
- 33 board, he worked to make a newly integrated public school system a
- 34 vital part of the community; and
- 35 WHEREAS, he and Margie helped to organize the Delta Music
- 36 Association, Greenville Arts Council and the Greenville Symphony.
- 37 Jere also served as President of the United Way, Chamber of
- 38 Commerce and Boy's Club and as a member of the Rhodes College
- 39 Board of Trustees. He was the founder of the Greenville Chapter
- 40 of a national organization that promoted the exchange of high
- 41 school students with foreign countries. The Salvation Army once
- 42 named him Volunteer of the Year. In 1985, he and Margie jointly
- 43 received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Rhodes College, and
- 44 in 2007 he joined with his wife and sister when the Nash family

- 45 was honored to be the recipient of the Lifetime Contribution to
- 46 the Arts Award in Greenville. In his retirement, Jere tutored
- 47 students at Trigg and Lucy Webb Elementary Schools and was a
- 48 devoted driver for the Wheels on Meals program; and
- WHEREAS, survivors include his three sons: Jere Nash III
- 50 (Holly Wagner) of Jackson, Mississippi, Louis Nash (Rose) of
- 51 Oxford, Mississippi, and Joe Nash of Greenville, Mississippi;
- 52 three grandchildren: Oliver Nash of Jackson, Mississippi, and
- 53 Sarah and Bo Nash of Oxford, Mississippi; and his sister, Mary
- 54 Virginia Nash Watson. Jere's father died in 1990 and his mother
- 55 died in 1971; and
- 56 WHEREAS, for as long as any of his children can remember, Mr.
- 57 Nash was a proud member of the Rotary Club, serving as President
- 58 of the Greenville Chapter and as a District Governor. He took to
- 59 heart the Rotary oath: "service above self." Jere Nash loved and
- 60 served his country, his community, his church and his family. Mr.
- 61 Nash leaves a lasting legacy not only in his hometown but
- 62 throughout Mississippi. His passion for helping build community
- 63 throughout the Delta was unlike any other and he will truly be
- 64 missed:
- 65 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 66 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 67 we do hereby extend the condolences of the Legislature to the
- 68 bereaved family of Mississippi Delta Korean War Veteran,

- 69 Businessman and Civic Leader Jere B. Nash, Jr., of Greenville,
- 70 Mississippi.
- 71 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 72 the surviving family of Jere Nash, forwarded to the Washington
- 73 County Community Foundation, and made available to the Capitol
- 74 Press Corps.
