SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 562

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO EXTEND THE RECOGNITION OF THE
2 MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO GENERAL MANAGER KIM CRUMBIE AND BALDWIN
3 SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT JASON MCKAY AND THE MEN AND WOMEN OF AUTO
4 PARTS MANUFACTURING MISSISSIPPI (APMM) FOR SUPPORTING THE
5 FIRST-OF-ITS-KIND TOYOTA CERTIFIED DOJO AT THE BALDWIN CAREER
6 ADVANCEMENT CENTER.

7 WHEREAS, many people and organizations were involved in the
8 promotion and development of the new Career and Advancement Center
9 at Baldwin High School under the leadership of Baldwin School
10 Superintendent Jason McKay and the Director of the Baldwin Career
11 and Advancement Center Mr. Danny Ramsey. In collaboration with
12 Auto Parts Manufacturing Mississippi (APMM), one-half of the
13 building is geared toward advanced manufacturing training, and the
14 other half of the building will focus on furniture manufacturing.
15 The goal is to prepare students to build Toyota Corollas and the
16 parts used in their manufacture; and

17 WHEREAS, Auto Parts Manufacturing Mississippi (APMM) believed
18 it was incumbent upon them to take a leadership role in training
19 the next generation of manufacturing workers. General Manager Kim
20 Crumby stated, "It is a part of the corporate social



21 responsibility as a manufacturer to help students. They have a
22 product to sell in the community, they need people to help build
23 the product, and we have a debt to these citizens to train them
24 and show value to them"; and
