- 5 WHEREAS, Mississippi high school football history was made on
- 6 Friday, November 17, 2017, and Jackson Prep was behind it. "Six
- 7 straight, baby!" There was no way to pinpoint exactly who was
- 8 shouting it because it seemed to be coming from everyone's mouth
- 9 at Robinson Hale Stadium following Jackson Prep's 38-3 win over
- 10 Parklane, the sixth straight State Championship for the program;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, it is the longest streak in Mississippi high school
- 13 football history, beating South Panola's five straight from
- 14 2003-2007. "You don't ever envision winning a bunch of games,"
- 15 Coach Ricky Black said. "You don't ever envision winning six
- 16 championships in a row. It's just unreal to think you could win
- 17 six in a row. I think it's a tribute to our guys to take the
- 18 pressure of this season and do that"; and

- 19 WHEREAS, the winning tradition built by past Prep teams laid 20 the groundwork for this 2017 squad. What it also did was inspire them to leave their own mark, and be their own Jackson Prep team. 21 22 Jackson Prep's 2017 teams were set on being remembered and, for 23 them, they will be as not just a team that dominated the MAIS but 24 competed with the MHSAA as well. Prep won all 14 games it played in the 2017 season. "We opened up playing MHSAA teams," 25 Quarterback Chance Lovertich said. "Proving that we're not just 26 27 the best in the MAIS, we can go out of our league and play with 28 anyone in the state"; and 29 WHEREAS, the championship game was a slow start by Jackson
- Prep's standards. Running back Jerrion Ealy said it was 30 31 championship excitement. The offense sparked when Lovertich 32 started looking to his receivers. Parklane did a good job 33 containing Ealy to start but once they had to worry about the 34 passing game it was game over. All season long the attention has 35 gone to the dynamic tandem that is Ealy and Lovertich. you're beating teams by an average of 35 points per game it's easy 36 37 to see why. Prep's defense has held teams to an average of 15 38 points a game, has had two shutouts and had five games where 39 they've held their opponent to under 10.
