## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 618

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING SEPTEMBER 2018 AS "PAIN
- 2 AWARENESS MONTH IN MISSISSIPPI" TO BRING AWARENESS FOR PEOPLE IN
- 3 PAIN.
- 4 WHEREAS, over 100 million adults suffer from chronic pain,
- 5 including millions with debilitating conditions like chronic lower
- 6 back pain, fibromyalgia and arthritis; and
- 7 WHEREAS, chronic pain costs America up to \$635 Billion a year
- 8 in added health costs and lost productivity, including billions of
- 9 dollars in state Medicaid costs; and
- 10 WHEREAS, chronic pain is a major public health problem and
- 11 hidden driver of rising health care costs; and
- 12 WHEREAS, significant barriers to adequate pain care exist and
- 13 millions of Americans get inadequate pain care; and
- 14 WHEREAS, these findings were made by the prestigious
- 15 Institute of Medicine (IOM) of the National Academy of Sciences in
- 16 its landmark report issued in 2011, Relieving Pain in America: A
- 17 Blueprint for Transforming Prevention, Care, Education, and
- 18 Research; and

- 19 WHEREAS, the IOM report includes a number of recommendations
- 20 to improve pain care, education and research; and
- 21 WHEREAS, the IOM report found that significant savings could
- 22 be achieved through better treatment of acute pain, reduction in
- 23 workers' compensation costs and lost tax revenues, and a reduced
- 24 burden of opioid abuse and misuse:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 26 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 27 the Legislature declares that chronic pain is a serious health
- 28 problem and the appropriate agencies of state government should
- 29 examine how the state can improve the health and productivity of
- 30 its citizens and reduce personal and government health
- 31 expenditures by implementing the recommendations of the Institute
- 32 of Medicine report.
- 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we do hereby recognize September
- 34 2018 as "Pain Awareness Month in Mississippi," and encourage all
- 35 citizens of Mississippi to become more informed and aware of the
- 36 impacts of chronic pain, and to support organizations in search
- 37 for adequate pain care for Mississippians.
- 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be transmitted
- 39 to the State Board of Health for proper distribution and made
- 40 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
