- 49 former Editor with Open Windows Magazine and other publications
- 50 with LifeWay Christian Resources of the Southern Baptist
- 51 Convention in Nashville. A Magna Cum Laude graduate of Belmont
- 52 University with a Master's Degree from the University of South
- 53 Carolina, Rhoda Royce has served as Adjunct Instructor of Business
- 54 Communications at Mississippi College. The Royces have one son,
- 55 Mark, a Ph.D. in Political Science and Graduate Teaching Assistant
- 56 at George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia; and
- 57 WHEREAS, President Lee Royce and his wife, Rhoda, are beloved
- 58 by Mississippi College faculty, staff, students, alumni, the
- 59 Clinton community and other friends of the university. The Royces
- 60 will be sorely missed during their retirement years in Northern
- 61 Virginia, and it is with great pride that we commend this
- 62 Christian academic leader whose record of achievement and legacy
- 63 of leadership and dedication to the citizens of Mississippi brings
