A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE,

2 LEGACY AND SERVICE OF MRS. BERTHA REE MCDONALD HILL AND EXPRESSING 3 DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HER PASSING. 4 WHEREAS, "To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the Heaven," and as such, the grand architect 5 of the universe, the immaculate author and finisher of our soul's 7 destiny, has summoned the mortal presence of dearly beloved, Mrs. Bertha Ree McDonald Hill, to eternal rest, as she has made life's 8 9 final transition from earthly travailing to heavenly reward, rendering great sorrow and loss to her family and friends; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the State of Illinois, particularly the Chicago community, lost a wonderful friend, educator extraordinaire and 12 13 community pillar on Wednesday, July 25, 2018, with the passing of 14 Mrs. Hill, a devoted and resolute servant of God and her fellowman, who possessed an unmitigated affinity for educating and 15 16 inspiring youth and families to maximize their fullest potential through her selfless approach of paying it forward in both her 17

professional and spiritual capacities of life; and

19	WHEREAS, Dorn in Heidelberg, Mississippi, on November 26,
20	1942, to her late parents, Mrs. Geraldine Barnett Davis and Mr.
21	Amos McDonald, Mrs. Hill's mother sought a better quality of life
22	for her daughter, and entrusted her upbringing to her brother and
23	his wife, Esker and Lucille Barnett, who relocated Bertha to Erie,
24	Pennsylvania, where she completed her preliminary and secondary
25	education at Saint Benedict's Catholic Academy; and
26	WHEREAS, it was during the summers spent in Mississippi with
27	her grandmother, the late Mrs. Irene Goins Barnett, that Bertha
28	Ree would learn the fundamental essentials of hard work, respect
29	and worship, and it would also be the place where, as a young and
30	impressionable child, she would come to know Christ as her Lord
31	and personal Savior, after uniting in Christian fellowship with
32	First Baptist Church of Heidelberg; and
33	WHEREAS, upon completing her education at Saint Benedict's,
34	Mrs. Hill matriculated at Tennessee State University, where she
35	attained her baccalaureate degree in business and subsequently
36	moved to Chicago under the tutelage of her aunt Frankie Mae and
37	uncle Ben Denham, to embark upon a career in the business arena,
38	before making the life-altering decision to return to school to
39	become a certified elementary school teacher by attaining her
40	master's in education from Governor's State University, a choice
41	that she soon discovered was the purpose destined for her life and
42	career; and

43	WHEREAS, one who relied heavily on the faith she came to
44	experience as a child in Heidelberg, Mrs. Hill financially
45	supported and attended her late mother's home church, St. Elmo
46	Baptist Church in Laurel, Mississippi, whenever she visited
47	Mississippi, however in her quest to find a church to call home in
48	Chicago, Bertha was compelled by the Holy Spirit to join Shiloah
49	Missionary Baptist Church in May 1990, and remained devout in her
50	Christian service and patronage throughout 28 years, reflecting
51	her passion for God through her commitment to assisting others and
52	her Christ-like care and concern for the building of the kingdom,
53	an allegiance to which she continued to manifest through the
54	adaptation of her favorite passage of scripture in Psalms 34:8, "O
55	taste and see that the Lord is Good: blessed is the man that
56	trusts in Him."; and
57	WHEREAS, as fate would lend itself to building upon the
58	blueprint divinely designed for the pattern of her life by the
59	God-head of the Great Deity, Bertha's heart was pierced by the
60	love, chivalry and affection of Mr. Henry Roscoe Hill, and the duo
61	became bone of one another's bone and flesh of one another's flesh
62	after exchanging the nuptials of holy matrimony on July 2, 1970,
63	building a lifetime of memories and imparting the love shared for
64	one another into the lineal fabric of their son, Brent, and
65	grandchildren, Nico and Amache; and
66	WHEREAS, an advocate for education, a cause she championed
67	until the very end of her earthly tenure, Mrs. Hill's career in

- 68 education spanned the course of more than three decades with the
- 69 Chicago Public School System, wherein she challenged herself and
- 70 her students to excel in every educational pursuit undertaken,
- before retiring from her labor of love at Smith Elementary School; 71
- 72 and
- 73 WHEREAS, in Mrs. Hill's transfiguration from mortality to
- 74 immortality, she now adorns the raiment of a spiritual bride,
- 75 awaiting the bridegroom's return in holy anticipation of that
- 76 wondrous event, as it is written in the book of Revelation 21:1-2
- 77 - "And I saw a new Heaven and a new earth: for the first Heaven
- 78 and the first earth were passed away; and there was no more sea.
- 79 And I John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God
- 80 out of Heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband."; and
- WHEREAS, though she has traversed the river of life to 81
- reunite with those who answered God's summons to life eternal and 82
- 83 now beckon her arrival to the celestial shores of Heaven's
- 84 grandeur, the legacy of Mrs. Hill's memory, which if put to music,
- would be a majestic symphonic masterpiece composed by the Holy 85
- 86 Trinity, will continue to refresh the hearts and fond memories of
- 87 her beloved survivors, including: a devoted husband of 48 years,
- 88 Henry Roscoe Hill; son, Brent Hill; grandchildren, Nico and Amache
- 89 Hill; siblings, James H. Heidelberg, Dr. M. Deborrah Hyde, George
- Harold (Denise) Huff, State Representative Omeria McDonald Scott 90
- 91 and Hilliard (Anita) McDonald; Charles (Mary) Hughes, who was like

- 92 a brother; brother-in-law, Ron (Renee) Hill; and a host of other
- 93 family members and friends; and
- 94 WHEREAS, we encourage the family to find solace from the
- 95 overwhelming sadness created by the earthly departure of their
- 96 beloved family member in Revelation 21:4, wherein is recorded,
- 97 "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there
- 98 shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall
- 99 there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away,"
- 100 and renewed in their faith that Mrs. Hill fulfilled the
- 101 commandment of II Timothy 4:7, by having fought a good fight,
- 102 finishing her course and keeping the faith until the hour of her
- 103 departure was at hand; and
- 104 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 105 commend the life of such a remarkable, genuine and selfless
- 106 individual as Mrs. Hill, whose life light was a brilliantly
- 107 impassioned beacon of hope for all she encountered along this
- 108 earthly sojourn:
- 109 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 110 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 111 mourn the loss and commemorate the life and legacy of Mrs. Bertha
- 112 Ree McDonald Hill, whose life was a fragrant rose adorning the
- 113 Heavenly Father's botanical garden of this earth's mortal dressing
- 114 room, permeating the atmosphere with her beauty and aroma, and to
- 115 whose family we express sincere and deepest sympathy upon her
- 116 passing.
