## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 508

1 A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMENDING THE LIFE AND 2 PUBLIC SERVICE OF THOMAS C. TOLLIVER, JR., OF WILKINSON COUNTY, 3 MISSISSIPPI, THE LONGEST-TENURED-SERVING CHANCERY CLERK IN THE 4 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH.

5 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of the 6 longest-serving Chancery Clerk in the State of Mississippi, Thomas 7 C. Tolliver, Jr., of Wilkinson County, on August 21, 2018, at the 8 age of 67; and

9 WHEREAS, his concurrent tenure, the Mississippi Association 10 of Chancery Clerks confirmed, made him the state's Senior Chancery 11 Clerk, which is the title bestowed upon the longest-tenured 12 still-serving Chancery Clerk in the State of Mississippi at the 13 time of his death; and

14 WHEREAS, "He was a great person," said Mattie L. Powell, 15 Deputy Chancery Clerk of Wilkinson County, who worked with 16 Tolliver for the past 12 years. "He always wanted to be a part of 17 anything to help the community, and to that end Tolliver donated 18 to community events, fundraisers and schools"; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Tolliver, Jr., was born in the Lesley
Community of Wilkinson County on October 16, 1950. Tolliver
earned a Biology Degree from Jackson State University; and
WHEREAS, in addition to being Wilkinson County's Chancery
Clerk, Tolliver was also the county's Emergency Management
Director, a 33rd Degree Mason, and was the Mississippi Association
of Chancery Clerk's Sergeant-at-Arms; and

26 WHEREAS, Thomas started several softball organizations and in 27 1980 founded the Chatwell Foundation, Inc., a nonprofit 28 organization to give back to the community, including funding 29 students and education, helping food bank ministries, and donating 30 to organizations such as St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and 31 the Red Cross; and

32 WHEREAS, "He was a wonderful man," Myrtis Tolliver said, 33 "well-loved by the community and always willing to help and do 34 anything he could for his community and his fellowman"; and

35 WHEREAS, Thomas is survived by his wife, Myrtis Tolliver; two 36 children, Meagen Patrease Tolliver and Antonie Mitchel-Tolliver; 37 and three grandchildren: DeMarien Tolliver-Dixon, Malik 38 Tolliver-Dixon and Malin Tolliver-Dixon. He was preceded in death 39 by daughter, Tommie Carol Tolliver; and

40 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the memory of this 41 most public-spirited and talented citizen of Mississippi:
