SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2

1 A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMENDING THE LIFE AND 2 PUBLIC SERVICE OF FORMER STATE SENATOR AND STATE REPRESENTATIVE 3 DR. WILLIAM "BILL" CANON OF COLUMBUS, MISSISSIPPI, AND EXPRESSING 4 THE SYMPATHY OF THE SENATE.

5 WHEREAS, the Legislature and the State of Mississippi lost a 6 friend, colleague and enlightened lawmaker with the death of 7 former State Senator and State Representative Dr. William W. 8 (Bill) Canon of Columbus, Mississippi, on July 28, 2018. At the 9 time of Senator Canon's retirement in 2003 he was the "Dean of the 10 Senate"; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Canon was born on December 31, 1930, in Vaiden, 11 12 Mississippi, to the late Jesse Lee Canon and Marilla Vail Canon. His parents operated a farm, where he resided during his childhood 13 14 years. Dr. Canon was active in the Boy Scouts and in the 4-H Club. He was a National 4-H Club winner and an Eagle Scout. Dr. 15 Canon was President of the Vaiden Club and also served as 16 17 President of the Junior County Council. Dr. Canon graduated from Vaiden High School in 1948 and entered Mississippi State 18 19 University. He finished pre-veterinary work in 1950 and spent the 2 ~ OFFICIAL ~ N1/2 S. R. No. 181E/SS36/R22

20 next four years at Auburn University obtaining his Doctor of 21 Veterinary Medicine Degree in 1954. Dr. Canon interned at the 22 William Greene Animal Clinic in Nashville, Tennessee, and 23 practiced there for a year after graduating from Auburn. He moved 24 to Memphis, Tennessee, and worked with Belview Animal Clinic in 25 1956. In 1956, Dr. Canon entered the United States Department of Agriculture in the Poultry Inspection Division. He entered active 26 duty with the United States Air Force in 1957 and later entered 27 28 the Air Force Reserve serving as a Lieutenant Colonel, Staff 29 Officer and Liaison Officer to the Veterinary Department at 30 Mississippi State University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Canon married Maxine Godwin Buckingham in 1959 31 32 having met at Columbus Air Force Base and moved to Washington 33 State. He moved back to Columbus in 1960 with his wife and two 34 children, Margie Canon and Linda Margaret Buckingham Durand. In 35 June 1960, Dr. Canon became associated with the veterinary 36 practice of Dr. E.C. Bozeman in Columbus, Mississippi. Doctors S.E. Wilcox (Auburn 1972) and Cecil Boswell (Auburn 1976) were 37 38 later associates in the practice; and

39 WHEREAS, Dr. Canon had been active in the Mississippi 40 Veterinary Medical Association (MVMA) since his graduation from 41 Veterinary College. He served as President of MVMA from 42 1983-1984. In 1989, he received the Veterinarian of the Year 43 Award; and

Mississippi House of Representatives. In 1979, he was elected to
the Mississippi State Senate. Dr. Canon retired from the
Legislature in 2003; and

48 WHEREAS, Senator Canon was appointed to the Joint Legislative 49 Audit Committee (PEER Committee) in December 1990, served as 50 Chairman, Vice Chairman or Secretary of this legislative 51 investigative group for 10 of the 12 years he served, and was the 52 only legislator elected as Chairman of the PEER Committee four 53 times in the 30-year history of the committee. As Chairman, 54 Senator Canon guided the PEER Committee through deliberations on 55 wide-ranging subjects. Through it all, Senator Canon never missed 56 an opportunity to enliven the most serious debate with his 57 boundless wit and charm; and

58 WHEREAS, Senator Canon was former Chairman of the Senate 59 Public Utilities Committee, the Senate Highways and Transportation 60 Committee and the Senate County Affairs Committee; and in his many 61 years in the Senate, he served with distinction on practically 62 every Senate Committee, this committee experience representing 63 substantial legislative influence; and

64 WHEREAS, Senator Canon was particularly knowledgeable of 65 health licensure issues, utilizing his professional background, 66 and was responsible for handling numerous licensure bills in the 67 Senate Public Health Committee. He was a champion of open 68 government, consistently expressing the belief that fees on the

71 WHEREAS, Senator Canon was the backbone of church, civic and 72 economic development efforts across his district; was a Methodist, 73 Mason, Shriner, Odd Fellow and ATO; and was active in the American 74 Veterinary Medical Association, the Mississippi State University 75 Alumni Association, Kiwanis, the Columbus-Lowndes Chamber of 76 Commerce, and the Air Force Association; and

77 WHEREAS, Dr. Canon is survived by his daughters, Marjorie 78 "Margie" Canon of Columbus, Mississippi, and Linda Margaret Durand 79 of Greenwood, Mississippi; and grandchild, Robin Durand of New 80 Orleans, Louisiana; and

81 WHEREAS, Senator Canon served with distinction and the 82 members of the Legislature will miss his humor, experience, 83 constructive leadership and friendship, and we wish to express 84 sincere appreciation to Senator Canon's family for sharing him 85 with us:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby mourn the loss and commend the life and public service of former State Senator and State Representative Dr. William "Bill" Canon of Columbus, Mississippi, and express to his surviving family the sympathy of the Senate on his passing.
