SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 9

1 A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE PASSING OF MISSISSIPPI GULF COAST 2 CIVIC AND BUSINESS LEADER ANTHONY JOSEPH TOPAZI AND COMMENDING HIS 3 LIFE AND PUBLIC SERVICE. 4 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of former Mississippi Power Company President and Mississippi Gulf 5 Coast Civic Leader Anthony Topazi on July 6, 2018; and 6 WHEREAS, Anthony graduated from Auburn University with a 7 degree in Electrical Engineering. He began working for Alabama 8 9 Power Company in 1969 as a co-op student. This was the beginning of a successful 43 years with Southern Company. He served as 10 President of Mississippi Power Company from 2004-2010, where he 11 oversaw the repair of the extensive damage from Hurricane Katrina. 12 13 In 2010, he was promoted to C.O.O. of Southern Company until his 14 retirement in 2012; and WHEREAS, Anthony Topazi was widely lauded for helping to 15 16 restore power to South Mississippi residents in less than two weeks after Hurricane Katrina. "Every meeting, every tough 17

18 decision, every priority, Anthony was in the middle of it," said

John Hairston, President of Hancock Whitney Bank and the Chairman of the Gulf Coast Business Council, for which Topazi was founding Chairman. "He was an inspiration to work with in the years we served together, whether business or social. His energy was boundless"; and

24 WHEREAS, Anthony was tapped in 2004 to lead Mississippi Power 25 after working years at Alabama Power. He had experience 26 responding to disasters such as hurricanes, tornados and ice 27 storms, which proved invaluable when Hurricane Katrina hit on 28 August 29, 2005. Temporary headquarters were set up at 29 Mississippi Power's Service Center on 28th Street in Gulfport. 30 Topazi went on television to say power would be restored in two weeks to all customers. In the months after the storm, Topazi was 31 32 appointed Vice Chairman of the Governor's Commission on Recovery, 33 Rebuilding and Renewal to help lead the Coast back to economic 34 stability; and

35 WHEREAS, Topazi founded the Gulf Coast Business Council in the summer of 2006 to continue the long-term planning for 36 37 rebuilding the Gulf Coast communities, according to Brian 38 Sanderson, who served as the first full-time President of the 39 Council. "He inspired many people on the Gulf Coast to work 40 toward that vision, and what we have today is a direct result of that vision," Sanderson said. "He was able to capture the 41 42 attention of business and political leaders on the Gulf Coast and 43 in the state to get behind a unified effort for long-term

WHEREAS, Topazi left the area in 2010 for a job with the utility's parent company, Southern Company, in Birmingham, Alabama. Anthony Topazi left South Mississippi a different place than when he arrived. He raised millions after Hurricane Katrina, which helped build a new center that houses Gulf Coast nonprofit agencies that otherwise might not have survived the storm's devastation; and

54 WHEREAS, Anthony is survived by his wife of 45 years, Patsy; 55 two sons, Michael Topazi and Chris Topazi (Debbie); four 56 grandchildren: Evelyn, Anthony, Mary, and Thomas; his sister, 57 Joyce McBee (Tom); and brother, Gerald Topazi (Shelby); and

58 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the memory of this 59 most public-spirited citizen of Mississippi whose legacy is his 60 enormous civic energy:
