HOUSE BILL NO. 16

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-1-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP A CURRICULUM AND A 3 COURSE OF STUDY TO PROMOTE HOME ECONOMICS OBJECTIVES; TO PRESCRIBE 4 THE MINIMUM COMPONENTS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE CURRICULUM; TO AMEND 5 SECTION 37-13-151, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE ALL LOCAL 6 SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE PROGRAMS OF EDUCATION IN HOME 7 ECONOMICS TO STUDENTS IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS LOCATED IN "D" AND "F" 8 RATED SCHOOL DISTRICTS BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2019; TO REMOVE THE 9 REQUIREMENT THAT SUCH PROGRAMS OF EDUCATION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION; TO REQUIRE THAT ALL 10 11 DISTRICT HOME ECONOMIC PROGRAMS BE ALIGNED WITH THE CURRICULUM AND 12 COURSE OF STUDY BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION; TO AMEND SECTION 13 37-13-153, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THAT STATE FUNDING FOR HOME ECONOMICS BE INCLUDED IN THE ADEQUATE EDUCATION PROGRAM 14 15 AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION APPROPRIATION BILLS FOR THE APPROPRIATE 16 FISCAL YEAR; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 37-13-155, MISSISSIPPI CODE 17 OF 1972, FOR PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENTS; TO AMEND SECTION 18 37-31-205, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 19

20BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:21SECTION 1. Section 37-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

22 amended as follows:

23 37-1-3. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules

24 and regulations and set standards and policies for the

25 organization, operation, management, planning, budgeting and

26 programs of the State Department of Education.

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27 (a) The board is directed to identify all functions of 28 the department that contribute to or comprise a part of the state system of educational accountability and to establish and maintain 29 30 within the department the necessary organizational structure, 31 policies and procedures for effectively coordinating such 32 functions. Such policies and procedures shall clearly fix and delineate responsibilities for various aspects of the system and 33 34 for overall coordination of the total system and its effective 35 management.

36 (b) The board shall establish and maintain a
37 system-wide plan of performance, policy and directions of public
38 education not otherwise provided for.

39 (c) The board shall effectively use the personnel and 40 resources of the department to enhance technical assistance to 41 school districts in instruction and management therein.

42 (d) The board shall establish and maintain a central43 budget policy.

44 (e) The board shall establish and maintain within the
45 State Department of Education a central management capacity under
46 the direction of the State Superintendent of Public Education.

(f) The board, with recommendations from the superintendent, shall design and maintain a five-year plan and program for educational improvement that shall set forth objectives for system performance and development and be the basis for budget requests and legislative initiatives.

52 (2)The State Board of Education shall adopt and (a) 53 maintain a curriculum and a course of study to be used in the public school districts that is designed to prepare the state's 54 55 children and youth to be productive, informed, creative citizens, 56 workers and leaders, and it shall regulate all matters arising in 57 the practical administration of the school system not otherwise 58 provided for.

59 Before the 1999-2000 school year, the State Board (b) 60 of Education shall develop personal living and finances objectives that focus on money management skills for individuals and families 61 62 for appropriate, existing courses at the secondary level. The objectives must require the teaching of those skills necessary to 63 64 handle personal business and finances and must include instruction 65 in the following:

66 (i) Opening a bank account and assessing the
67 quality of a bank's services;
68 (ii) Balancing a checkbook;

69 (iii) Managing debt, including retail and credit70 card debt;

71 Completing a loan application; (iv) 72 (V) The implications of an inheritance; 73 The basics of personal insurance policies; (vi) 74 Consumer rights and responsibilities; (vii) 75 (viii) Dealing with salesmen and merchants; 76 (ix) Computing state and federal income taxes;

| 82 | (c) Before the 2019-2020 school year, the State Board |
| 83 | of Education shall develop a curriculum and a course of study to |
| 84 | promote home economics objectives that focus on the knowledge, |
| 85 | understanding and skills necessary for living as an individual, as |
| 86 | a member of a household, personal life management and |
| 87 | postsecondary education advancement for existing courses in "D" |
| 88 | and "F" rated school districts. The objectives must require the |
| 89 | teaching of those skills essential to family and consumer science |
| 90 | and must include instruction in the following: |
| 91 | (i) Cooking, including food safety, preparation |
| 92 | and preservation and the nutritional benefits of a balanced meal; |
| 93 | (ii) Child development that provides instruction |
| 94 | as to how to correctly respond to children at each stage; |
| 95 | (iii) Education and community awareness; |
| 96 | (iv) Home management and design; |
| 97 | (v) Sewing and textiles; |
| 98 | (vi) Budgeting and economics; and |
| 99 | (vii) Health and hygiene. |
| 100 | (3) The State Board of Education shall have authority to |
| 101 | expend any available federal funds, or any other funds expressly |
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102 designated, to pay training, educational expenses, salary 103 incentives and salary supplements to licensed teachers employed in 104 local school districts or schools administered by the State Board 105 of Education. Such incentive payments shall not be considered 106 part of a school district's local supplement as defined in Section 107 37-151-5(o), nor shall the incentives be considered part of the 108 local supplement paid to an individual teacher for the purposes of 109 Section 37-19-7(1). MAEP funds or any other state funds shall not 110 be used to provide such incentives unless specifically authorized 111 by law.

112 (4) The State Board of Education shall through its actions113 seek to implement the policies set forth in Section 37-1-2.

SECTION 2. Section 37-13-151, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

37-13-151. Before *** * *** September 1, 2019, all local school 116 117 districts * * * shall provide programs of education in home 118 economics, * * * which include course work in responsible parenting and family living skills. These programs shall contain 119 120 instruction to prepare students to understand children's physical, 121 mental, emotional and social growth and development as well as to 122 assume responsibility for their care and guidance, with emphasis 123 on nutrition, emotional health and physical health. All such 124 programs shall be * * * aligned with the curriculum and course of 125 study for home economics developed by the State Board of Education * * *. 126

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SECTION 3. Section 37-13-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

129 37-13-153. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, and 130 each year thereafter, state funding for the home economics 131 programs required in Section 37-13-151 shall be * * * included in 132 the *** * *** adequate education program and vocational education appropriation bills for each fiscal year * * *. There shall be a 133 134 line item specifying the amount that is to be expended to employ 135 no less than one (1) instructor in each *** * *** school district in 136 the state. Any funds so appropriated by line item which are not 137 expended for this purpose in the vocational education appropriation may be expended for other related home economics 138 139 vocational purposes during the fiscal year for which those funds were appropriated. * * * 140

141 SECTION 4. Section 37-13-155, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 142 brought forward as follows:

143 37-13-155. Subject to the availability of funds appropriated 144 therefor, any school district or community/junior college district 145 may apply for funding through the Division of Vocational and 146 Technical Education of the State Department of Education to 147 acquire and operate a home economics training program to provide 148 instruction in quality child care and educational programs to the 149 local community.

150 **SECTION 5.** Section 37-31-205, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 151 amended as follows:

152 37-31-205. (1) The State Board of Education shall have the 153 authority to:

154 (a) Expend funds received either by appropriation or155 directly from federal or private sources;

(b) Channel funds to secondary schools, community and junior colleges and regional vocational-technical facilities according to priorities set by the board;

159 Allocate funds on an annual budgetary basis; (C) 160 Set standards for and approve all vocational and (d) 161 technical education programs in the public school system and 162 community and junior colleges or other agencies or institutions 163 which receive state funds and federal funds for such purposes, 164 including, but not limited to, the following vocational and 165 technical education programs: agriculture, trade and industry, * * * consumer * * * education, distributive education, 166 167 business and office, health, industrial arts, guidance services, 168 technical education, cooperative education, and all other specialized training not requiring a bachelor's degree, with the 169 170 exception of programs of nursing education regulated under the provisions of Section 37-129-1. The State Board of Education 171 172 shall authorize local school boards, within such school board's 173 discretion, to offer distributive education as a one-hour or two-hour block course. There shall be no reduction of payments 174 175 from state funding for distributive education due to the selection of either the one-hour or two-hour course offering; 176

177 (e) Set and publish licensure standards for vocational 178 and technical education personnel. The State Board of Education shall recognize a vocational and technical education teacher's 179 work when school is not in session which is in the teacher's 180 particular field of instruction as a means for the teacher to 181 182 fulfill the requirements for renewal of the teacher's license. 183 The board shall establish, by rules and regulations, the 184 documentation of such work which must be submitted to the board 185 and the number of actual working hours required to fulfill renewal requirements. If a vocational and technical education teacher who 186 187 does not have a bachelor's degree takes classes in fulfillment of 188 licensure renewal requirements, such classes must be in 189 furtherance of a bachelor's degree;

190 (f) Require data and information on program performance 191 from those programs receiving state funds;

(g) Expend funds to expand career information; (h) Supervise and maintain the Division of Vocational and Technical Education and to utilize, to the greatest extent possible, the division as the administrative unit of the board responsible for coordinating programs and services with local institutions;

(i) Utilize appropriate staff of the State Department
of Education to perform services for the vocational student
organizations, including, but not limited to, procurement,
accounting services, tax services and banking services. The

No. 16 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 19/HR12/R525 PAGE 8 (DJ\AM) department may also procure and pay for annual audits of the vocational student organizations using vocational funds or other available funds of the State Department of Education. It is the intent of this provision that any related costs be paid with vocational funds appropriated by the Legislature;

(j) Promulgate such rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter in accordance with Section 25-43-1 et seq.;

(k) Set standards and approve all vocational and technical education equipment and facilities purchased and/or leased with state and federal vocational funds;

(1) Encourage provisions for lifelong learning and
changing personal career preferences and advancement of vocational
and technical education students through articulated programs
between high schools and community and junior colleges;

(m) Encourage the establishment of new linkages with business and industry which will provide for a better understanding of essential labor market concepts;

(n) Periodically review the funding and reporting processes required of local school districts by the board or division with the aim of simplifying or eliminating inefficient practices and procedures;

(o) Assist in the development of high technology
 programs and resource centers to support current and projected
 industrial needs;

(p) Assist in the development of a technical assistance program for business and industry which will provide for industrial training and services, including the transfer of information relative to new applications and advancements in technology; and

(q) Enter into contracts and agreements with the Mississippi Community College Board for conditions under which vocational and technical education programs in community and junior colleges shall receive state and federal funds which flow through the State Board of Education for such purposes.

237 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that no vocational 238 and technical education course or program existing on June 30, 239 1982, shall be eliminated by the State Board of Education under 240 the authority vested in paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of this section prior to June 30, 1985. It is further the intent of the 241 242 Legislature that no vocational and technical education teacher or 243 other personnel employed on June 30, 1983, shall be discharged due 244 to licensure standards promulgated by the board under paragraph 245 (e) of subsection (1) of this section, if any such teacher or 246 personnel shall have complied with any newly published licensure 247 standards by June 30, 1985. Nothing contained in this section 248 shall be construed to abrogate or affect in any manner the 249 authority of local public school districts or community and junior 250 colleges to eliminate vocational and technical education courses

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251 or programs or to discharge any vocational and technical education 252 teacher or other personnel.

253 The State Board of Education and the Mississippi (3) 254 Community College Board may provide that every vocational and 255 technical education course or program in Mississippi may integrate 256 academic and vocational-technical education through coherent 257 sequences of courses, so that students in such programs achieve 258 both academic and occupational competencies. The boards may 259 expend federal funds available from the 1990 Perkins Act, or other 260 available federal funds, for the alignment of vocational-technical 261 programs with academic programs through the accreditation process 262 and the teacher licensure process.

263 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 264 and after July 1, 2019.

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
