HOUSE BILL NO. 87

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY IN EDUCATION ACT; 2 TO REQUIRE EACH LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER IN THE STATE TO CREATE 3 AND MAINTAIN A SEARCHABLE EXPENDITURE AND REVENUE WEBSITE THAT 4 INCLUDES DETAILED DATA ON ALL MONIES RECEIVED AND EXPENDED IN THE 5 LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT; TO REQUIRE EACH LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER TO 6 MAINTAIN THE DATA IN AN EASILY ACCESSIBLE, SEARCHABLE AND DOWNLOADABLE FORMAT, AND TO POST COMPREHENSIVE FIGURES ON TOTAL 7 EXPENDITURES AND PER-PUPIL SPENDING; TO REQUIRE EACH LOCAL 8 9 EDUCATION PROVIDER TO SUBMIT THE SUMMARY DATA TO THE STATE TO BE 10 AGGREGATED AND MADE AVAILABLE ONLINE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 13 "Financial Transparency in Education Act." 14 **SECTION 2.** (1) The Legislature finds and declares that: 15 (a) Taxpayers should have easy access to the details of 16 public school district spending; 17 (b) Easier access to and storage of electronic data would increase transparency in public school financial matters; 18 19 and 20 (c) It is neither difficult nor prohibitively expensive 21 to make such data available to the public via the Internet.

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(2) Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature to direct
all local education providers to create and maintain a searchable
expenditure and revenue website database detailing financial
activities and education return on investment analysis.

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> As used in this act, the following words and 27 phrases have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the 28 context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Entity" means a corporation, association, union,
limited liability company, limited liability partnership, grantee,
contractor, local government, other legal entity, including a
nonprofit corporation, or an employee of the local education
provider. The term "entity" does not include an individual
recipient of public assistance.

35 (b) "Local education provider" means:

36 (i) A school district organized and existing37 pursuant to law;

38 (ii) A board of cooperative services or39 intermediate school district;

40 (iii) The Mississippi Charter School Authorizer41 Board; or

42 (iv) A public charter school authorized under43 Chapter 28, Title 37, Mississippi Code of 1972.

44 (c) "Public record" has the same meaning as set forth
45 in Section 25-61-3 of the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983.

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(d) "Education Return on Investment (eROI)" means the
correlation of intended use or purpose, expenditures or resource
allocations and student outcomes data at the district, school,
grade and classroom levels.

50 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) No later than July 1, 2020, each local 51 education provider shall develop, maintain and make publicly 52 available a single, searchable expenditure and revenue website 53 database that allows the public, at no cost, to review information 54 concerning monies received, whether by appropriation, grant, 55 devise or gift, distribution, donation or collection, and expended 56 by the local education provider.

(2) (a) For each fiscal year, using budgeted numbers no more than one (1) week following the adoption of the budget for the most recent fiscal year, and actual audited spending figures no more than one (1) week after official figures have been accepted, concerning all expenditures made by the local education provider, the website must include the following data:

(i) A comprehensive total for all monies expended
directly by the local education provider and any subsidiary under
its direction, as well as all expenditures made on behalf or for
the benefit of the local education provider or any subsidiary by
any governmental or nongovernmental entity;

68 (ii) A total for all monies expended on adult
69 education programs, not including expenses for GED or other
70 alternative high school equivalency diploma programs;

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71 (iii) A total for all monies expended on community 72 services, which are defined as expenditures used exclusively for 73 purposes other than K-12 education; 74 (iv) A total for all monies expended on preschool 75 and early childhood education services, defined as all services 76 provided to children younger than the compulsory school age for 77 enrollment in kindergarten; 78 (V) The name and principal location or address of 79 the entity receiving monies, except that information concerning a payment to an employee of the local education provider may 80 81 identify the individual employee by name and business address or 82 location only; 83 (vi) The amount of expended monies; 84 The funding source or sources of the (vii) 85 expended monies; 86 (viii) The date of the expenditure; 87 The name of the budget program, activity or (ix) category supporting the expenditure; 88 89 A description of the purpose for the (X) 90 expenditure; 91 (xi) The Education Return on Investment (eROI) for 92 internal use, program evaluation and continuous improvement 93 processes; 94 (xii) A unique identifier for each expenditure on adult education as described in subparagraph (ii) and community 95 ~ OFFICIAL ~

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96 services in subparagraph (iii) of this subsection, and for all 97 other expenditures to the extent possible; 98 Copies of all credit card statements, (xiii) 99 identified by the department responsible for each credit card; and 100 Both the budgeted and audited actual (xiv) 101 expenditure figures retained for each fiscal year in such a manner 102 that ensures that each set of figures can be identified as 103 budgeted or audited figures. 104 The expenditure data must be provided in an open (b) structured data format that: 105 106 (i) May be downloaded by the user; and 107 (ii) Allows the user to systematically sort, 108 search and access all data. 109 The website shall contain only information that is (C) a public record or that is not confidential or otherwise protected 110 111 from public disclosure pursuant to state or federal law. 112 The local education provider shall: (3) Update the financial data contained on the website 113 (a) 114 at least monthly; 115 Archive the financial data, which must remain (b) 116 accessible and searchable on the website; 117 Post total expenditures as defined in subsection (C) (2)(a)(i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) on the home page of the local 118 119 education provider's website no more than one (1) week after the official budget is adopted for the most recent fiscal year and no 120 H.  121 more than one (1) week after the final audited and actual 122 expenditure figures are produced. In the same section of the 123 website, the local education provider shall post both the 124 estimated and the audited actual average daily attendance figures 125 for Grades K-12 for the most recent fiscal year budget and for 126 pre-K, if applicable;

(d) Post the per-pupil spending figures using both the
budgeted and audited figures described in subsection (2) (a) (i),
(ii), (iii) and (iv), as derived from the following formula:
Total expenditures minus adult education expenditures minus
community services expenditures minus preschool services in those
districts providing such services divided by the districts K-12
average daily attendance;

(e) Design the website to be easily accessible from thehomepage of the local education provider's website; and

(f) Create and make accessible an automated Rich Site
Summary (RSS) feed, also referred to as Really Simple Syndication,
to which users of the website's database may subscribe for
notification of updates to the website's database.

140 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from 141 and after July 1, 2019.

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
