HOUSE BILL NO. 90

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE TOLL-FREE TELEPHONE NUMBER OPERATED BY
THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF CHILD PROTECTION SERVICES FOR
RECEIVING REPORTS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT TO BE POSTED IN ALL
PUBLIC AND CHARTER SCHOOLS; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF
EDUCATION TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CONTENT,
SIZE AND LOCATION OF SUCH SIGNS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** (1) The school board of each school district and
- 9 the governing board of each charter school in the state shall post
- 10 in each school, in at least one (1) high traffic, clearly visible
- 11 public location that is readily accessible to students, a sign in
- 12 both English and Spanish which contains the toll-free telephone
- 13 number operated by the Mississippi Department of Child Protection
- 14 Services to receive reports of child abuse and neglect.
- 15 (2) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and
- 16 regulations relating to the content, size and location of the sign
- 17 required to be posted under subsection (1). At a minimum, the
- 18 rules and regulations must require each sign:

19 (a)	To	be	in	а	format	and	language	that	is	clear,

- 20 simple and understandable to students at the grade levels in the
- 21 school in which the sign is posted;
- 22 (b) To have the toll-free telephone number printed in
- 23 bold print;
- 24 (c) To include instructions to call 911 for
- 25 emergencies;
- 26 (d) To include the website address for the Mississippi
- 27 Department of Child Protection Services and directions on
- 28 accessing the website for the purpose of submitting a report of
- 29 child abuse or neglect or obtaining additional information on
- 30 reporting abuse, neglect and exploitation; and
- 31 (e) To be in large print on a poster that is no less
- 32 than eleven (11) by seventeen (17) inches in size, which poster
- 33 must be placed at eye level to students to facilitate easy
- 34 viewing.
- 35 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 36 and after July 1, 2019.
