HOUSE BILL NO. 803

- AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 41-119-1 THROUGH 41-119-19,
- 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ARE THE HEALTH INFORMATION
- 3 TECHNOLOGY ACT THAT ESTABLISHES THE MISSISSIPPI HEALTH INFORMATION
- 4 NETWORK (MS-HIN) AND PRESCRIBES ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO AMEND
- 5 SECTION 41-119-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF
- 6 THE REPEALER ON THE ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 41-119-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 reenacted as follows:
- 10 41-119-1. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as
- 11 the "Health Information Technology Act."
- 12 **SECTION 2.** Section 41-119-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 13 reenacted as follows:
- 14 41-119-3. The Mississippi Health Information Network is a
- 15 public-private partnership for the benefit of all of the citizens
- 16 of this state.
- SECTION 3. Section 41-119-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 18 reenacted as follows:
- 19 41-119-5. (1) The Mississippi Health Information Network is
- 20 established, and is referred to in this chapter as the "MS-HIN."

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- 22 (MS-HIN board) consisting of eleven (11) members. The membership
- 23 of the MS-HIN board shall reasonably reflect the public-private
- 24 and diverse nature of the MS-HIN.
- 25 (3) The membership of the MS-HIN board of directors shall
- 26 consist of the following:
- 27 (a) The Governor shall appoint one (1) member of the
- 28 MS-HIN board of directors, who shall be a representative of a
- 29 health insurance carrier in Mississippi with knowledge of
- 30 information technology, to serve an initial term of three (3)
- 31 years;
- 32 (b) The State Board of Health shall appoint one (1)
- 33 member of the MS-HIN board of directors, who shall be a
- 34 representative of a Mississippi hospital with knowledge of
- 35 information technology, to serve an initial term of three (3)
- 36 years;
- 37 (c) The Mississippi State Medical Association shall
- 38 appoint a member of the MS-HIN board of directors, who shall be a
- 39 licensed physician, to serve an initial term of three (3) years;
- 40 (d) The Primary Health Care Association shall appoint a
- 41 member of the MS-HIN board of directors to serve an initial term
- 42 of one (1) year;
- 43 (e) The Delta Health Alliance shall appoint a member of
- 44 the MS-HIN board of directors to serve an initial term of four (4)

- 48 of the MS-HIN board of directors to serve an initial term of one
- 49 (1) year;
- 50 (g) The State Board of Health shall appoint a member of
- 51 the MS-HIN board of directors who shall be an employee of the
- 52 State Department of Health to serve an initial term of one (1)
- 53 year;
- 54 (h) The Mississippi Board of Information Technology
- 55 Services shall appoint a member of the MS-HIN board of directors
- 56 to serve an initial term of two (2) years;
- 57 (i) The Mississippi Board of Mental Health shall
- 58 appoint a member of the MS-HIN board of directors who shall be an
- 59 employee of the Department of Mental Health to serve an initial
- 60 term of four (4) years;
- 61 (j) The University of Mississippi Medical Center shall
- 62 appoint a member of the MS-HIN board of directors to serve an
- 63 initial term of two (2) years; and
- 64 (k) The Division of Medicaid shall appoint a member of
- 65 the MS-HIN board of directors who shall be an employee of the
- 66 Division of Medicaid to serve an initial term of two (2) years.
- 67 Initial terms shall expire on June 30 of the appropriate
- 68 year, and subsequent appointments shall be made by the appointing
- 69 entity for terms of four (4) years. Members may be reappointed.

- 70 (4) No state officer or employee appointed to the MS-HIN
- 71 board or serving in any other capacity for the MS-HIN board will
- 72 be construed to have resigned from public office or employment by
- 73 reason of that appointment or service.
- 74 (5) The chairperson of the MS-HIN board shall be elected by
- 75 a majority of the members appointed to the MS-HIN board.
- 76 (6) The MS-HIN board is authorized to conduct its business
- 77 by a majority of a quorum. A quorum is six (6) members of the
- 78 MS-HIN board.
- 79 (7) The MS-HIN board may adopt bylaws for its operations,
- 80 including, but not limited to, the election of other officers, the
- 81 terms of officers, and the creation of standing and ad hoc
- 82 committees.
- 83 **SECTION 4.** Section 41-119-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 84 reenacted as follows:
- 85 41-119-7. (1) In furtherance of the purposes of this
- 86 chapter, the MS-HIN shall have the following duties:
- 87 (a) Initiate a statewide health information network to:
- 88 (i) Facilitate communication of patient clinical
- 89 and financial information;
- 90 (ii) Promote more efficient and effective
- 91 communication among multiple health care providers and payers,
- 92 including, but not limited to, hospitals, physicians, nonphysician
- 93 providers, third-party payers, self-insured employers, pharmacies,
- 94 laboratories and other health care entities;

96	redundancy in data capture and storage and reducing
97	administrative, billing and data collection costs;
98	(iv) Create the ability to monitor community
99	health status;
100	(v) Provide reliable information to health care
101	consumers and purchasers regarding the quality and
102	cost-effectiveness of health care, health plans and health care
103	providers; and
104	(vi) Promote the use of certified electronic
105	health records technology in a manner that improves quality,
106	safety, and efficiency of health care delivery, reduces health
107	care disparities, engages patients and families, improves health
108	care coordination, improves population and public health, and
109	ensures adequate privacy and security protections for personal
110	health information;
111	(b) Develop or design other initiatives in furtherance
112	of its purpose; and
113	(c) Perform any and all other activities in furtherance
114	of its purpose.
115	(2) The MS-HIN board is granted all incidental powers to
116	carry out its purposes and duties, including the following:

(iii) Create efficiencies by eliminating

To appoint an executive director, who will serve at

the will and pleasure of the MS-HIN board. The qualifications and

- 121 (b) To adopt, modify, repeal, promulgate, and enforce
- 122 rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of the MS-HIN;
- 123 (c) To establish a process for hearing and determining
- 124 case decisions to resolve disputes under this chapter or the rules
- 125 and regulations promulgated under this chapter among participants,
- 126 subscribers or the public;
- 127 (d) To enter into, and to authorize the executive
- 128 director to execute contracts or other agreements with any federal
- 129 or state agency, any public or private institution, or any
- 130 individual in carrying out the provisions of this chapter; and
- 131 (e) To discharge other duties, responsibilities, and
- 132 powers as are necessary to implement the provisions of this
- 133 chapter.
- 134 (3) The executive director shall have the following powers
- 135 and duties:
- 136 (a) To employ qualified professional personnel as
- 137 required for the operation of the MS-HIN and as authorized by the
- 138 MS-HIN board;

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- 139 (b) To administer the policies of the MS-HIN board; and
- 140 (c) To supervise and direct all administrative and
- 141 technical activities of the MS-HIN.
- 142 (4) The MS-HIN shall have the power and authority to accept
- 143 appropriations, grants and donations from public or private

entities and to charge reasonable fees for its services. The
revenue derived from grants, donations, fees and other sources of
income shall be deposited into a special fund that is created in
the State Treasury and earmarked for use by the MS-HIN in carrying
out its duties under this chapter.

SECTION 5. Section 41-119-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

41-119-9. (1) All members of the MS-HIN board shall not be subject to and are immune from claim, suit, liability, damages or any other recourse, civil or criminal, arising from any act or proceeding, decision or determination undertaken, performed or reached in good faith and without malice by any such member or members acting individually or jointly in carrying out the responsibilities, authority, duties, powers and privileges of the offices conferred by law upon them under this chapter, or any other state law, or duly adopted rules and regulations of the aforementioned committees, good faith being presumed until proven otherwise, with malice required to be shown by a complainant. All employees and staff of the MS-HIN, whether temporary or permanent, shall enjoy the same rights and privileges concerning immunity from suit otherwise enjoyed by state employees under the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 and Section 11-46-1 et seq.

(2) The MS-HIN is not a health care provider and is not subject to claims under Sections 11-1-58 through 11-1-62. No person who participates in or subscribes to the services or

information provided by the MS-HIN shall be liable in any action
for damages or costs of any nature, in law or equity, that result
solely from that person's use or failure to use MS-HIN information
or data that were imputed or retrieved in accordance with the
rules or regulations of the MS-HIN. In addition, no person will
be subject to antitrust or unfair competition liability based on
membership or participation in the MS-HIN, which provides an

essential governmental function for the public health and safety.

SECTION 6. Section 41-119-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

179 41-119-11. (1) All persons providing information and data 180 to the MS-HIN shall retain a property right in that information or 181 data, but grant to the other participants or subscribers a 182 nonexclusive license to retrieve and use that information or data 183 in accordance with the rules or regulations promulgated by the 184 MS-HIN board and in compliance with the provisions of the Health 185 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law 186 104-191.

- 187 (2) Patients desiring to obtain a copy of their personal
 188 medical record or information are to request the copy from the
 189 health care provider who is the primary source of the information,
 190 and the MS-HIN shall not be required to provide this information
 191 directly to the patient.
- 192 (3) All processes or software developed, designed or
 193 purchased by the MS-HIN shall remain its property subject to use

- by participants or subscribers in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the MS-HIN board.
- 196 **SECTION 7.** Section 41-119-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 197 reenacted as follows:
- 41-119-13. (1) The MS-HIN board shall by rule or regulation ensure that patient specific health information be disclosed only in accordance with the provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law 104-191, which governs the electronic transmission of that information.
- (2) Patient specific health information and data of the MS-HIN shall not be subject to the Federal Freedom of Information Act, Mississippi Open Records Act (Section 25-61-1 et seq.) nor to subpoena by any court. That information may only be disclosed by consent of the patient or in accordance with the MS-HIN board's rules, regulations or orders.
- other law, the data in the network shall be confidential and shall not be subject to discovery or introduction into evidence in any civil action. However, information and data otherwise discoverable or admissible from original sources are not to be construed as immune from discovery or use in any civil action merely because they were provided to the MS-HIN.
- 216 (4) Submission of information to and use of information by
 217 the State Department of Health shall be considered a permitted
 218 disclosure for uses and disclosures required by law and for public

219	health	activities	under	the	Health	Insurance	Portability	and
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- 220 Accountability Act and the privacy rules promulgated under that
- 221 act.
- 222 (5) Any violation of the rules or regulations regarding
- 223 access or misuse of the MS-HIN health information or data shall be
- 224 reported to the Office of the Attorney General, and shall be
- 225 subject to prosecution and penalties under state or federal law.
- 226 **SECTION 8.** Section 41-119-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 227 reenacted as follows:
- 228 41-119-15. For the purposes of this chapter, the following
- 229 terms shall be defined as provided in this section:
- 230 (a) "Electronic health records" or "EHR" means
- 231 electronically maintained clinical and demographic information,
- 232 used by a meaningful EHR user.
- 233 (b) "Health information technology" or "HIT" means the
- 234 equipment, software and networks to be used by a meaningful EHR
- 235 user.
- 236 (c) "Acquisition" of HIT systems or other computer or
- 237 telecommunications equipment or services means the purchase,
- 238 lease, rental or acquisition in any other manner of HIT systems or
- 239 any other computer or telecommunications equipment or services
- 240 used exclusively for HIT.
- 241 (d) "Meaningful EHR user" means an eligible
- 242 professional or eligible hospital that, during the specified
- 243 reporting period, demonstrates meaningful use of certified EHR

- 244 technology in a form and manner consistent with certain objectives
- 245 and measures presented in applicable federal regulations as
- 246 amended or adopted. These objectives and measures shall include
- 247 the use of certified EHR.
- 248 (e) "Entity" means and includes all the various state
- 249 agencies, officers, departments, boards, commissions, offices and
- 250 institutions of the state, but does not include any agency
- 251 financed entirely by federal funds.
- 252 **SECTION 9.** Section 41-119-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 253 reenacted as follows:
- 254 41-119-17. (1) Before the acquisition of any HIT system, an
- 255 entity shall provide MS-HIN, at a minimum, description, purpose
- 256 and intent of the proposed service or system, including a
- 257 description and specifications of the ability to connect to
- 258 MS-HIN.
- 259 (2) Where existing entities can be used to provide the
- 260 proposed HIT system, in whole or in part, the submission shall
- 261 include letters of commitment, memoranda of agreements, or other
- 262 supporting documentation.
- 263 (3) The MS-HIN shall review proposals for acquisition of HIT
- 264 systems for the purposes contained in Section 41-119-7, and

- 265 provide quidance to entities including collaborative opportunities
- 266 with MS-HIN members.
- 267 (4) Any acquisition of an HIT system that was approved by
- 268 the Mississippi Department of Technology Services before April 28,

269	2010,	is	exempt	from	the	requirements	of	Section	41-119-15	and
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- 270 this section.
- 271 **SECTION 10.** Section 41-119-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 272 reenacted as follows:
- 273 41-119-19. The Legislative Audit Committee (PEER) shall
- 274 develop and make a report to the Chairmen of the Senate and House
- 275 Public Health and Welfare/Medicaid Committees regarding the
- 276 following electronic health records (EHR) system items:
- 277 (a) Evaluate the Request for Proposals (RFP) for the
- 278 implementation and operations services for the Division of
- 279 Medicaid and the University Medical Center electronic health
- 280 records system and e-prescribing system for providers;
- 281 (b) Evaluate the proposed expenditures of the
- 282 Mississippi Division of Medicaid (DOM) and the University Medical
- 283 Center (UMC) regarding electronic health information;
- (c) Evaluate the use of American Recovery and
- 285 Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds for electronic health records system
- 286 implementation in the State of Mississippi; and
- 287 (d) Evaluate the progress in implementing the
- 288 electronic health records system in the State of Mississippi.
- The PEER Committee shall make its report on or before
- 290 December 1, 2014, including any recommendations for legislation.
- 291 **SECTION 11.** Section 41-119-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 292 amended as follows:

293	41-119-21.	Sections	41-119-1	through	41-119-21	shall	stand
294	repealed on July	1, * * *	2022.				

295 SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from
